Hello,

I will be back from vacation by the time this hits the bulletin, but I am writing it before I leave. While this year I am just going up to Milwaukee and then elsewhere in Wisconsin, where I have been many times before, last year I took a trip to Norway, where in addition to other things we can see on our vacations are different churches.





In many European countries

that were Catholic, but then a national religion formed after the Protestant Reformation, the history of the cathedrals can tell you a bit about the history of the church. In Trondheim is the largest cathedral in Norway, Nidaros Cathedral. The cathedral is located over the tomb of Olav the Holy, the Viking king who Christianized Norway. Like most cathedrals, it took a while to build, beginning in 1070 and was

completed around 1300. But after several fires and other aging through the years major reconstruction was begun in 1868 and some work continues today. This

cathedral would have been a Catholic church for centuries, but is currently the Cathedral of the Church of Norway.

In Tromso they have a few cathedrals. The Cathedral of Our Lady is the Catholic cathedral and is the northernmost Catholic cathedral in the world. It seats about 150 people and was started in 1861, the same year they started building the Lutheran Cathedral of the Church of Norway in Tromso a few blocks away.



Peace. Fr. Nick Stave churches are probably what we more distinctly consider with a church in the land



of the Vikings. Not quite as grand as the Nidaros Cathderal, but the Stave church I visited in Borgund was built in 1180. It doesn't seat quite as many either, but I'm sure the upkeep was a little cheaper through the years. They built a new church next door that has been used since 1868. Like the Nidaros Cathedral, it is described as originally a Catholic Church but it's current denomination is the Church of Norway and they describe the 'Churchmanship' as Evangelical Lutheran.

A NOTE FROM THE BUSINESS MANAGER (cont'd from July 21)

As our church building nears its 20th anniversary next February, I want to continue to share some observations on how well it is holding up. In many respects, this building has aged well, but a few more areas need some attention.

Sound system: Many parishioners have commented that they cannot understand what the priest or the lector is saying in church. The loudness is adequate, but the words are hard to understand. We have consulted with audio experts, and they identified two main factors that contribute to the lack of clarity.

The first is the location of our main speaker cluster at the top of the ceiling over the center aisle. Those speakers serve everyone seated under the vaulted ceiling, but they are 40-50 feet away from the people. The larger the distance, the greater risk of distortion of the sound.

The second factor is the abundance of hard surfaces in the center of the church, such as the tile floors, wooden pews, stained glass windows, and the glass wall of the narthex. The sound from the center speaker cluster bounces from one hard surface to another, creating echoes that distort the sound.

In addition, some of our microphones were picking up background noise, especially the microphone at the altar. We replaced three of these microphones in April. Fr. Nick and I believe that the new microphones have made a significant improvement, but we still receive complaints about distortions of the sound. Until we find a better solution, please sit in a pew where the ceiling is low and flat. The speakers in those areas are much closer to you, and the distortion is minimal. Another option is to use one of our portable hearing devices. You can ask an usher to assist you with those when you arrive.

Sidewalks: Several of our concrete sidewalks have suffered chips, cracks and spalling, mostly because of the heavy salt used for melting ice and snow over the past 19 years. Our focus is on repairing the trip hazards to keep you safe.
