

Hello,

This week we celebrate the feast day of St. Jane Francis de Chantal (1572-1641), the foundress of the Congregation of the Visitation of the Virgin Mary, or the Visitation order. I have to admit that I probably didn't know who she was until I was in Annecy, France on a vacation, when we had to walk way around a church because it was the cloistered grounds where she founded the Visitation order and you couldn't go in most of it—so we had to walk all the way around. We could go into the chapel, and in the chapel they had her tomb.





Prior to her religious life, she had married Christophe de Rabutin, baron de Chantal, when she was 20 and would have six children. Her three eldest children all died within a year of their birth, but they then had three more who survived. Unfortunately, her husband would die in 1601. A few years later she would hear St. Francis de Sales preach and ask him to be her spiritual director. He stressed her duties as a daughter, mother, and member of society, and she would spend most of her time caring for her children, but also visiting the poor, sick and dying in the area. Eventually she would desire to enter a Carmelite order, but St. Francis convinced her to instead, found a new order for women who, because of illness or age or some other reason, were rejected from other orders that were enclosed. This order would be open to work in the community.

Unfortunately, everyone wasn't ready for that, and they did have a cloistered convent. Although, as the mother of the order, St. Jane would take a few months to get her son off to college when her father died, and would be spending much time traveling and founding other convents. By the time of her death in 1641, there would be 85 convents in her order, although she had not visited all of them.

I mentioned I had the connection with St. Jane Francis de Chantal by having visited her convent and grave in France, but I also later would live at one of only two parishes with her name in the United States. When I went to study canon law in Washington D.C., I lived at St. Jane Francis de Chantal parish in Bethesda Maryland. When I left there, after two years, the pastor even gave me a small copy of a statue they had commissioned of St. Jane Francis de Chantal, that I have in my bookcase. I also happened to first arrive at the parish on her current feast day, August 12, as parish staff were having a feast day lunch. Her feast day used to be celebrated on Dec. 12 (the anniversary of the day before her death), but the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe eventually bumped her from that date and she got moved to August. I guess if you are a saint, you are usually humble enough to accept those kinds of things.

This week we celebrate our parish feast day, the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. I don't' think we will be bumped from our date.



To be in compliance, you must be registered in the Prevent and Protect system where you will submit an updated background check and sign and submit all the Mandatory Reports and Code of Conduct sections. Attending a Protecting God's Children Workshop is also needed to complete Compliance. If you have already completed a workshop, this information will roll over into the Prevent and Protect system and you will not have to redo the workshop for your Compliance.



ST. MAXIMILIAN KOLBE: REFLECTION OF THE DEATH PENALTY

On August 14, the Church celebrates the feast of St. Maximilian Kolbe, who was a Franciscan priest living in Poland when the Nazis invaded. He was arrested in 1941 and sent to Auschwitz concentration camp, where he was beaten and humiliated. Father Kolbe, prisoner #16670, was able to hear Confessions and secretly celebrate Mass.

One day, when three prisoners escaped, the camp commandant, wishing to teach a lesson, chose 10 prisoners to be starved to death in an underground bunker. Fr Kolbe volunteered to take the place of Franciszek Gajowniczek, who was a husband and father. After two weeks, on August 14, finding Fr Kolbe was still alive, the guards injected carbolic acid into his veins to kill him. Franciszek was present in 1982 when Pope John Paul II canonized Maximilian Kolbe as a martyr.

In Missouri, we also kill by lethal injection. We are one of five states that have executed people in 2024. But sometimes we get it wrong. In the US, since 1973, 199 former death row inmates have been exonerated and released. Four of these were in Missouri. Marcellus Williams is scheduled to die on September 24 by lethal injection. There is credible DNA evidence of his innocence. We pray that this new evidence can be considered and Marcellus can be exonerated before the sentence is carried out.

It is important we know that the Church teaches, in the light of the Gospel, that "the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person", and as the Church works with determination for its abolition worldwide, <u>may we choose to live our faith and do the same</u>.
