

Hello,

This week we head back to school and also celebrate our parish feast day, the Feast of the Assumption. I remember both of these in a little different way from when I was growing up than I am sure most of the kids in our school do today. When I was younger we didn't start school quite yet,



(usually just before or after Labor Day) so my dad would always take vacation the third week of August, and we would rent a cabin on a lake in northern Wisconsin for a week. But it also always ended up that during that week was the Feast of the Assumption, and I remember that clearly because that meant that we not only had to drive into the local town on Sunday morning to go to Mass, but also on whichever of the weekdays Assumption fell on that year. (And you didn't have that Monday or Saturday exception back then, so it was every year.)

I have to admit that I don't remember if I had a positive or negative thought about going into town another day of that week to go to Mass, it was just something that we knew we would be doing. I know the holy days of obligation don't get as many people at Mass as we have each Sunday, and all of our parishioners aren't there every Sunday (if they were we would have the pleasant problem of trying to find seats for everyone). But we need to try and help and encourage one another to come to Mass on these days, for themselves, for their children, and for all of us.

The Church has defined that this is the primary way we need to "keep holy the Sabath". We honor God, we take rest from other activities, we commit this period to be open to listen to His Word and participate in the sacrament of the Eucharist, to receive his graces. By doing this weekly we keep the relationship with God strong in our lives and we also keep the relationship and community of our parish strong.

I realize that society made this easier when I was young since nothing else was open on Sunday. And I think this makes it even more important that we make it a regular part of our week. A habit that, like when I was on vacation as a child, we know is a part of our life. Hopefully we want this for ourselves, for our children, and for each other. As school starts and seasons change, hopefully we make this a priority in all of our lives.

#### Matthew 9:37-38

Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

When we think of evangelization, we may picture ourselves in foreign lands—such as a missionary trip in a foreign land. However, what the Church wants us to



understand is that evangelization means reaching out to those closest to us. Every minute of every day may bring an opportunity to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ. You have been chosen to deliver this message to the world, starting with those people whom God has put in your life: your family, spouse, children, grandchildren, friends and coworkers, those you encounter in business, school, life situations, etc. Everyone! Are you up to the challenge?

#### Saint Paul is clear what we are to do:

Romans 10:14-15,17 "But how can they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how can they believe in him of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone to preach? And how can people preach unless they are sent? As it is written, 'How beautiful are the feet of those who bring the good news!' Thus, faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ."
