Hello,

School is already starting again. Even if we aren't in school ourselves, we recognize this time of year, grade school and high school kids being dropped off and picked up at certain times, or driving to school themselves. College kids heading back to school after their summers and going to Target or Walmart to get things for their dorms or apartments. I realize some people didn't, but I always enjoyed the new school year. Summer activities had lost their novelty and getting back to school would be a change. Old things that would start up again and the old friends you would see, but also the new experiences you would have, the new things you would learn, the new people you would meet.

I think those new parts were especially important when going off to college because up until then there were always other people who knew you, or knew your family, or at least your neighborhood and you were already identified as far as who you are and what people expected of you. Going off to college was with all new people, no one knew me or my family or really anything about me – what would they think about me? And what are the things about me that would give them that impression? You wouldn't be judged by your parents, or what someone knew about a sibling, but on yourself. While you would always be part of your family and your parents are always there you have a degree of independence that you've never had before and along with it the opportunity and the responsibility to decide what you are going to do and who you are going to be.

Spring is the season for new life but reflecting back on beginning college I think the new school year always reminds me of the opportunity to consider how I'm going to direct that life and what type of a life I intend to have. Even if the people around you know who you have been, is there a change I might make or should do now to become more like that person I think I want to be if I am not them yet? No matter where we are in our lives, I think it isn't a bad idea to consider this every now and then. And not just taking a class because we always wanted to know a second language or about painting, but how I always thought it would be good to be more active as a volunteer, helping kids to read, or visiting the homebound (whether they are people we know or just those who could use a friend), or maybe singing in our church choir.

One thing you might consider is growing in your faith as we help others at various ages grow in theirs: helping 3-6 year-olds with Children's Liturgy of the Word during Mass, possibly a teacher or a substitute for our PSR program, being a core team member for our middle school Edge program or high school Life Teen, or a sponsor or team member for our RCIA/OCIA, all of which are starting up now. All of these are means to help others grow in their faith, but also opportunities to grow in your own faith, both in knowledge and action.

As we begin a new school year, even if we are not in school ourselves, it is a good time to consider how can I grow this year? Who is that person I want to be, or am meant to be? Whoever that is, what is a means I can start working on becoming that person? It likely involves some work, and possibly some risk, but hopefully also some excitement in recognizing, developing, and putting to use some of the gifts and freedom God has given me that really let me be me.

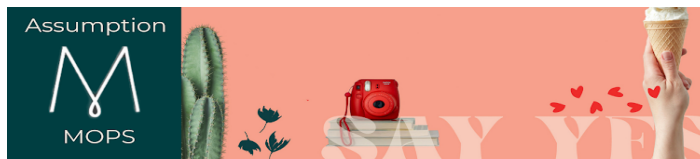

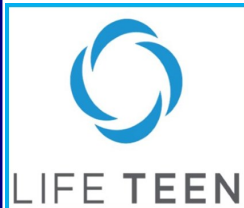
