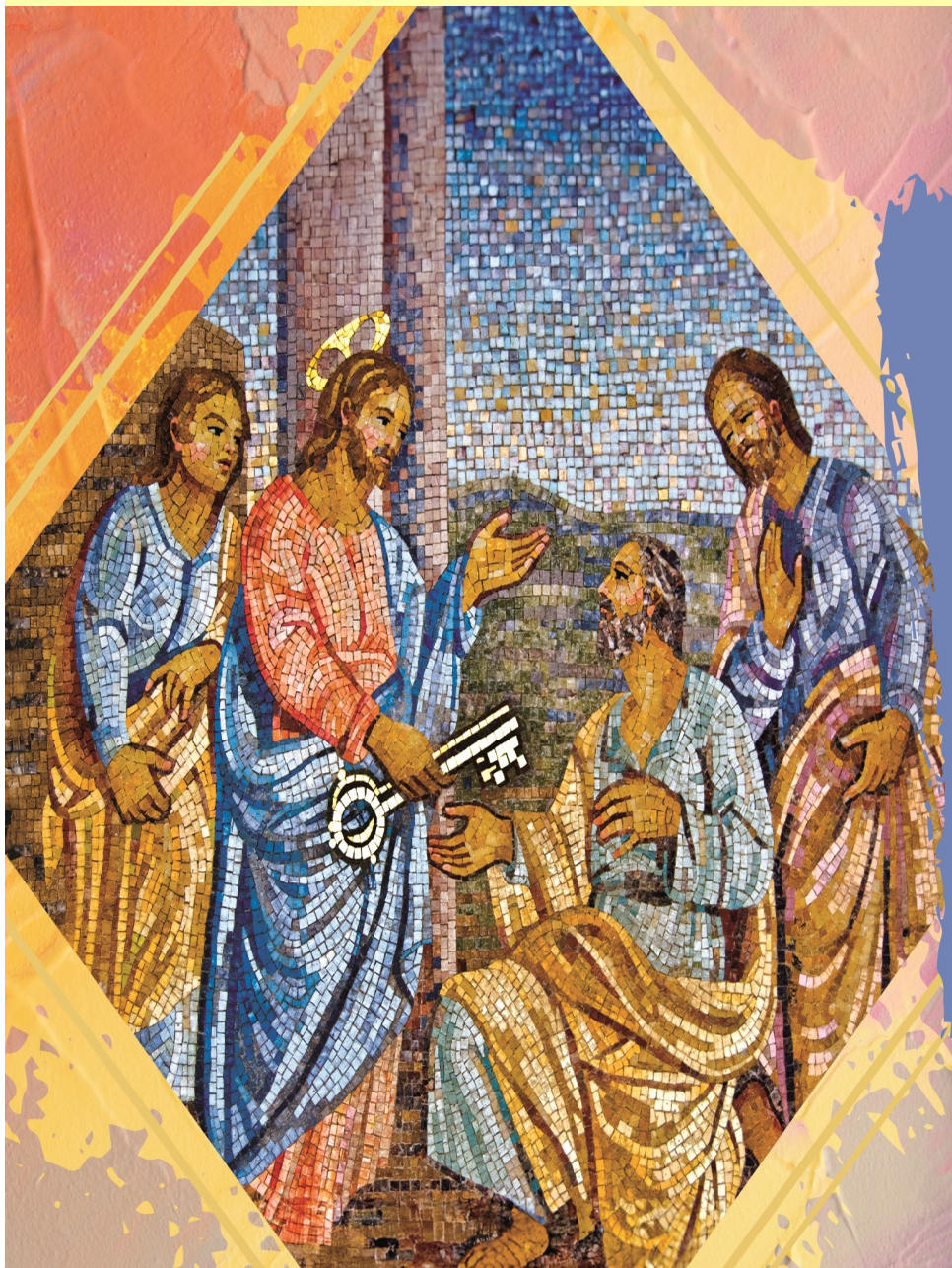

Hello,

Today, August 25, is the feast of St. Louis, king of France, our archdiocesan feast day. I was thinking about writing things about St. Louis IX himself, the only king of France to be canonized a saint, but the more I thought about it, the more I realized I didn't have enough space to say all I would want to and wasn't up to the job of summarizing it. But I can do some information about St. Louis the city (260th anniversary this year) and our archdiocese.



Not growing up in this area, I can tell you a few things that non-St. Louisans know or think about when they hear St. Louis. The first thing for me was the Arch. One of the most impressive monuments in the country that also signifies the gateway to the West. The Mississippi River, although numerous cities share this feature, St. Louis happens to be towards the center and so it kind of places the city in the very center of the country in people's minds if not exactly geographically. The Cardinals, of course, as well as Anheuser Busch. The Dred Scott Case, we learn that in grade school throughout the country and it places St. Louis on the North/South line for people thinking back to the Civil War. Aviation, which is what brought me to town. When I moved here both McDonnell Douglas and General Dynamics were headquartered here. And also Catholic, being named after a saint doesn't hurt but I expected and found it was a very Catholic city when I moved here, although in a lot of ways I hadn't known.

I hadn't heard it referred to as the Rome of the West before moving here. I didn't know about the incredible cathedral. I know driving on Hwy 55 south from downtown reminded me of driving into the south side of Milwaukee, you just saw all of these different church steeples all over the place. St. Rose Philippine Duchesne and Pierre De Smet are two great historical Catholic St. Louisans who remind me of the frontier aspect of St. Louis opening onto to the West. You might say they stand like Lewis and Clark in my mind for the faith.

I think that is really obvious when we look at the history of the diocese of St. Louis. Erected in 1826 (so not quite 200 years old yet), it used to stretch all the way to the Pacific Ocean and the Dioceses of Walla Walla and Vancouver Island would even be carved out of us. I remember first learning that the boundaries of St. Ferdinand Parish up in Florissant used to stretch to the Rocky Mountains—I was impressed. And, of course, with Florissant and De Smet the long Jesuit history here in St. Louis, and St. Louis University are a clear sign of the Catholicism here. Whenever I am back in Milwaukee and people know I am a priest now in St. Louis their first assumption is that I'm a Jesuit, (I quickly correct them). Catholic schools is another great part of the history of St. Louis. From the universities to the grade schools, with the obvious high schools in between. And the schools also remind us of the many different religious orders that have founded them and run them through the years.

But looking back at our history isn't just to look back, but hopefully also to look forward. Hopefully St. Louis will still be known for many things; baseball, aviation, beer, and also Catholicism. The history of the future is made by us today, what kind of a Catholic presence are we leaving for the future to remember and grow from?

All those who work, volunteer or coach, in any way, with our children, the vulnerable or elderly at Assumption Parish must be in Compliance with the Archdiocese in order to participate in your ministry work. This is **MANDATORY!**

To be in compliance, you must be registered in the Prevent and Protect system where you will submit an updated background check and sign and submit all the Mandatory Reports and Code of Conduct sections. Attending a Protecting God's Children Workshop is also needed to complete Compliance. If you have already completed a workshop, this information will roll over into the Prevent and Protect system and you will not have to redo the workshop for your Compliance.

Click on the link to begin the process. Instructions are also available on how to register into the Prevent and Protect system.
