Hello,

This Tuesday is the feast of St. Gregory the Great (540-604). I always remember this saint, and say, 'the great' part, because that was the name of my grade school and the parish I attended growing up. We probably mostly think of St. Gregory when we think of the Gregorian chant and church music, which is true, but I get the feeling this was more of his hobby during his down time, or maybe things he had mostly worked on prior to becoming pope. It became popular and more widespread when he became pope.



I say this because he was the first monk pope, and having preferred just living in solitude in his monastery (I think most of us can relate to this at least sometimes), he probably had a little more free time then. That doesn't mean he didn't have a bit of a history though before becoming pope. He was from a wealthy family and his father was a Roman senator. He was well educated and was administrator of the city of Rome before his father would die and he gave away all of his inheritance and would enter a monastery to become a monk in 574. He would serve as an emissary of the pope on numerous occasions for the protection of Rome and have dealings with the Eastern Church (we were still united then, but that doesn't mean there weren't differences).

When he was consecrated as pope in 590, he had a few things going on in Rome to keep him busy—the plague, a famine, and they were being threatened by invasion. He managed to deal with all of that and is also known for sending missionaries to the Anglo–Saxons and forming a strong relationship with the English. He is remembered for his work with the liturgy, musically and otherwise, but also for his teaching. His writings are respected for teaching the Catholic faith to people in terms and words that could be easily understood.

I still remember at St. Gregory the Great parish growing up as having their parish picnic on the first weekend after Labor Day. I don't know if it was because of the feast day or not, but it still helps me to remember his feast day now.

to be interactive and hands—on, giving students the opportunity to explore topics in a way that suits their individual learning styles and needs. Whether it's a math game, a reading corner, or a science experiment station, students rotate through these centers, building knowledge and skills in a dynamic and engaging way. The following goals and objectives are what we hope to accomplish by integrating Center—based learning into our school:

1. Enhanced Student Engagement:

Goal: Increase student engagement by providing hands—on and interactive activities. **Objective:** Create centers that cater to different learning styles and interests.

2. Differentiated Instruction:

Goal: Address the diverse learning needs of students by offering varied tasks.

Objective: Design activities at each center that can be adjusted for different skill levels.

3. Independent Learning:

Goal: Foster student independence and responsibility.

Objective: Encourage students to manage their time and tasks at each center effectively.

4. Collaboration and Social Skills:

Goal: Develop students' teamwork and communication skills.

Objective: Include group activities in some centers that require cooperative learning.

5. Critical Thinking and Problem Solving:

Goal: Promote higher-order thinking skills.

Objective: Design activities that challenge students to analyze, evaluate, and create.

6. Assessment and Feedback:

Goal: Use centers as a means of ongoing assessment.

Objective: Observe and document student progress during center activities to provide timely feedback.

7. Classroom Management:

Goal: Maintain a well-organized and productive classroom environment.

Objective: Establish clear routines and expectations for center activities.

8. Integration of Technology:

Goal: Incorporate technology into learning centers to enhance learning.

Objective: Use digital tools and resources to create interactive and engaging centers.

9. Cross-Curricular Connections:

Goal: Create interdisciplinary learning experiences.

Objective: Design centers that integrate concepts from multiple subjects.

10. Reflective Practice:

Goal: Continuously improve the effectiveness of center–based learning.

Objective: Regularly reflect on and adjust the design and implementation of centers based on student feedback and outcomes.

HELLO FROM ASSUMPTION YOUTH MINISTRY!

This weekend, we continue our annual Big Board Calendar Fundraiser with our parish community. In choosing the dates that are most sacred to them, donating the corresponding amount

and partnering with us, our parishioners make it possible for us to lead teens closer to Christ. Raised funds are primarily used to keep retreat costs low and make it possible for us to have a ministry-wide "no teen turned away" policy.

So far, we have raised nearly \$20,000! Our Assumption Parish Community is so incredibly generous and we are beyond grateful for your partnering with us. Here's just a glimpse of how our

> ministry continues to grow at a rapid pace:





Our LTLC Leadership Teen Program has exploded since its **inception in 2021**. These upperclassmen commit to a year of directly serving the LT community: attending a week-long intensive leadership retreat focusing on the Sacraments, investing in underclassmen, going deeper in prayer, monthly meetings of intentional fellowship and depth, one-on-one mentoring with youth ministry staff, giving testimonies and much more. These commitments are in addition to attending Life Teen regularly and attending all major retreats: Fall Retreat, Luke 18, and a summer retreat, such as Steubenville or Covecrest. By the numbers, here's how this part of our ministry has grown each year:

♦ 2021: 2 Teens ♦ 2023: 13 Teens ♦ 2022: 4 Teens

♦ 2024: 14 Teens

Investing in and forming the young Church requires intentional effort and resources. So far, our parish has committed to partnering with us for 129 days out of 365. If able to extend that partnership to each day of the year, we would raise \$67,000 - which would be a GAME CHANGER for the young Church at Assumption. We will continue the

fundraiser until September 8. Thank you for walking along side us as we lead teens closer to Christ.
