Hello,

I was trying to think about a topic for this week's bulletin, I realized that we have a wedding here this weekend, and then starting the end of September we have weddings every weekend for nine weeks in a row (two weddings on two of the weekends). In St. Louis, this is the time of year that weddings are most popular. I think the weather this last week is part of the reason why I have been reminded of many weddings at Assumption over the past years. Through the summer and into the fall you might have noticed the occasional 50th or even 60th anniversary celebrations. Each of them was very joyful. But it did not mean that everything had gone perfect over those years, or that they had not had numerous challenges and pains. But they were able to see what a blessing their marriage has been for them, to have a spouse that loves them, and one that they have been blessed to love.



When I talk to couples in marriage preparation at times I ask them to think about a couple they may know, who from their perspective, have been married forever and you really can't imagine them without the other. A couple that they would hope their marriage could be something like one day. And then realize that it wasn't always easy for that couple. They had challenges, pains, and sorrows, difficult decisions they had to make, some they did right, but others were mistakes. And realize they have gone through all we can think of and more to get to where they are today, in this relationship that they hope their marriage can be like.

This doesn't just happen, it isn't just luck, that they were so fortunate to find just the right person, or even just a blessing that God made it this way for them. Like all blessings in our life to really come to fruition, we need to cooperate with them. For marriages, this truly takes a commitment on both parties' parts. They have made a commitment on that day, but then they are also living out that commitment each of the days following.

Hopefully, thinking of some of those 'elder couples,' and the many years they have been together, and the place where they are now, we aren't just happy for them, but also hopeful for us. Whether it be in your marriages, our Church, or any part of our society, with love and faith and commitment we should always have hope.

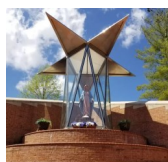

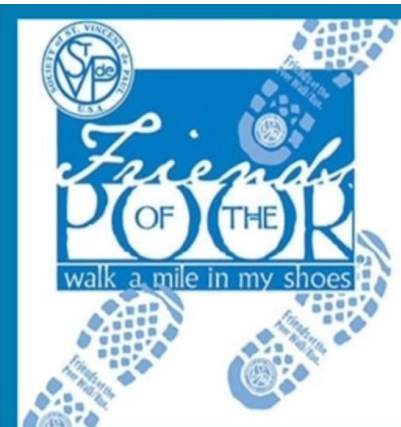

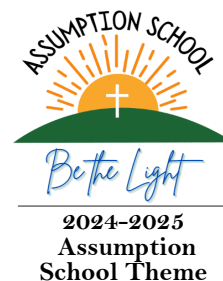
This year, our students are working hard to "Be the Light," as our yearly theme comes from the Gospel of Matthew: *"Let your light so shine before others, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."* (Matthew 5: 14-16)

At our very first prayer service of the year, Assumption students learned that Jesus spoke these words to His disciples, shortly after He delivered the Beatitudes during the Sermon on the Mount. We too are called to shine Christ's light in all that we say and do. Some ways we have been living our faith here at Assumption School include:

- Worshiping together at Mass
- Planning meaningful prayer services
- Attending Eucharistic Adoration
- Offering opportunities for prayer, such as the Rosary, Stations of the Cross, etc.
- Serving our greater Assumption community through acts of service
- Observing feast and holy days
- Learning the Catholic faith through our rigorous Religion curriculum

Additionally, we will keep an eye out for those students who are always shining the light of Christ in all that they do. We want to acknowledge these children for the good they are doing at Assumption School. Each quarter, children will be nominated by their teachers and recognized in the Hallway of Holiness, which is located in the main lobby of school. HELLO FROM ASSUMPTION YOUTH MINISTRY!

This weekend, we conclude our annual Big Board Calendar Fundraiser with our parish community. In choosing the dates that are most sacred to them, donating the corresponding amount and partnering with us, our parishioners make it possible for us to lead teens closer to Christ. Raised funds are primarily used to **keep retreat costs low** and make it possible for us to have a ministry-wide “no teen turned away” policy.

So far, we have raised nearly **\$20,000!** *Our Assumption Parish Community is so incredibly generous and we are beyond grateful for your partnering with us.* Here's just a glimpse of how our ministry continues to grow at a rapid pace:



Our LTLC Leadership Teen Program has exploded since its inception in 2021.

These upperclassmen commit to a year of directly serving the LT community: attending a weeklong intensive leadership retreat focusing on the Sacraments, investing in underclassmen, going deeper in prayer, monthly meetings of intentional fellowship and depth, one-on-one mentoring with youth ministry staff, giving testimonies and much more. These commitments are in addition to attending Life Teen regularly and attending all major retreats. By the numbers, here's how this part of our ministry has grown each year:

◆ 2021: 2 Teens ◆ 2022: 4 Teens ◆ 2023: 13 Teens ◆ 2024: 14 Teens

Investing in and forming the young Church requires intentional effort and resources. So far, our parish has committed to partnering with us for **129 days out of 365**. If able to extend that partnership to each day of the year, we would **raise \$67,000** – which would be a **GAME CHANGER** for the young Church at Assumption. We will continue the fundraiser until September 8. Thank you for walking along side us as we lead teens closer to Christ.
