

With the anniversary of the parish (152 years now), we had put together some sacramental histories over the life of the parish. I thought this year I would focus more on how things have changed over the last 20 years with even more detail over the last four (details that we have available and also times we more readily remember—I have included the data from 2005 in increments of five years to 2015, and then from 2019 individual years through 2023 to reveal the changes).



The first thing I was interested in was how many individuals and families we have in the parish (this is recorded as Catholics and households). As you can see, the number of households increased about 20% by 2015 and has been fairly constant since. The number of Catholics has gone up less than 10%, so we have less people per household. The number of

those contributors matters financially, but I believe it also tells us something about those active in the parish. As we can see it went up between 2005 and 2010 (right after the church was built), went back down a bit before COVID, and then dipped a little more

during COVID but appears to have gone back up to our Pre-COVID numbers.

The number of different sacraments also tells us a bit about the demographics and participation of our parishioners. The most obvious change has been the increase in funerals, which tells us we likely have more elderly in our parish then we used to. But even at our highest number of funerals it was less than 1% of our Catholics (so an average age lifespan of 100 years isn't bad). All of the 'younger' sacraments like Baptisms, First Communions, Confirmations and Weddings have obviously went down between 2005 and 2015, and a particular dip in baptisms and weddings can be seen from COVID.

So what does this tell us? I would say that we definitely do have an older community than we did 20 years ago, with slightly smaller households and probably less of the households are

active. COVID did have an effect on many aspects of the parish, but it appears that we are past that and need to take the opportunity now to evangelize and welcome the young and old to be involved in their faith at Assumption.

Assumption Middle School at O'Fallon 9/11 Ceremonies

Did you know that on September 11, 2005, the City of O'Fallon dedicated a memorial to America's First Responders: the police, firefighters and paramedics who are the first to respond to an emergency. The 17-foot monument was created from 22 tons of steel salvaged from the destruction of New York City's World Trade Center on September 11, 2001. A plaque memorializing the victims of the terrorist attacks on the nation honors the 346 firefighters and 37 police officers who perished as they attempted to rescue victims trapped in the World Trade Center's Twin Towers.





As in the past, our Middle School students, Faculty, and Administration were asked to participate in the ceremonies for 2023. Hayden Korte, Ivy Schenk, and Claudia Woodside handed out ceremonial programs to visitors. Deacon Richard Tadlock, from Assumption Parish, provided the Invocation. The Pledge of Allegiance was said by four Assumption students: Danica Willis, Sam Molitor, Timmy Johnson, and Rina Baker. The keynote speaker was O'Fallon Fire Chief Tom Vineyard with honored guests being O'Fallon Police Chief Frank Minnini, Chief Kelly Cope with St. Charles County Ambulance District, and the US Navy Chief Petty Officers Association. Students Daniel Duffy, Hayden Brock, Sam Illy, and Anthony Minnini handed red and white carnations to guests.

Included in the program was a rifle salute, playing of taps, singing of God Bless America by the Assumption Middle School students, laying of the wreath by honored guests, and benediction by O'Fallon Police Chaplain Randall Lee. Following benediction, all attendees were able to place their carnations near the wreath to remember all that have served and fallen. Lastly, the Honor Guard retreated. Following the ceremony, this year, all guests were given the opportunity to complete a one-mile walk in honor of those fallen heroes. All of our students and faculty joined in the support of all men and women who have and continue to devote their lives to our safety.



Assumption Regional Band Resumes for Grades 4-8



Having experienced a few years of COVID life, we are headed back to being normal again! Assumption is resuming participation in the Regional Band, directed by Luke Juergensmeyer, Director and St. Dominic Band instructor. Luke is actively seeking students, grades 4-8, from seven parishes, to form the Regional Band.

Students can be in either the Beginning Band or the Advanced Band, learning the flute, clarinet, alto saxophone, trumpet, trombone, percussion, snare drum, or bell kit. The Advanced Band members can

play the bassoon, baritone, or tuba. Practice is once a week at SDHS, with two performances a year, one at Christmas and one in spring. This experience could lead to being a member of the Mizzou Marching Band!

Ballet begins for Assumption Pre-K through First Graders

Dance classes for Preschoolers through First Graders is a perfect way to introduce them to the amazing art of dance, but also benefit their early development! Our Ballet classes, offered by Kathy Fowler of Dance Time, is a great way for little ones to move in a fun environment! A ballet class for three-six year old dancers can benefit their strength, flexibility, range of motion, coordination, and balance. Consistent dance classes for kids can help with proper alignment and posture which benefits life long health. Ballet classes challenge endurance and stamina. It also allows young dancers to make new friends! For preschool dance classes this means learning to face challenges like: keeping your hands to yourself, not cutting ahead in line, learning to speak to others nicely. These child friendships are important to the development of young children.



Dance class is a great place for young dancers to grow their personality! Dance can help children who have anxiety or fears of new people and places. Each week of dance class, tiny dancers gain confidence. It is a great introduction into the discipline and structure they will have in school and throughout their life. Ballet works your brain! Dance challenges young children's memory of choreography and dance terms. They learn patterning and how to connect physical and mental patterns. Being in dance class builds their focus, concentration, spatial awareness, and works gross and fine motor skills. Dance stretches children's imagination. In dance classes for kids, creative imagery is used to learn dance steps and movement.

We are proud to offer Ballet to our Pre-K through First Graders and thank Kathy Fowler with Dance Time for providing such a wonderful class.

RCIA: THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

As we prepare the assembly for this years ministry, one of the key elements are our sponsors.

Worship: Sponsors are active participants in weekly Sunday Mass and the major worship events of the parish. They are responsible for the attendance of their catechumens (non-baptized) and candidates (baptized already) at these events.

RCA

Daily prayer: Sponsors spend some significant, concentrated time in prayer every day (at least 15 minutes). Sponsors are responsible for teaching their catechumens how to pray daily.

Penitential prayer: Sponsors regularly examine their consciences and regularly practice the many forms of penance in Christian life (see *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1434–1439). RCIA sponsors are responsible for teaching their catechumens how to practice some of these forms.

Intercessory prayer: Sponsors regularly bring their needs before God (see *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2629–2636). RCIA sponsors are responsible for teaching their catechumens how to petition God for their needs.

The next example sponsors are to give is how to bear witness to the faith. And how do they do that? By praying in public or teach them a prayer, share a book, or movie, Be joyful. By remaining steadfastly joyful in all situations and sharing that joy with others, sponsors bear witness to that faith.

Last weekend, sponsors as well as team members were commissioned in their respective role for the 2023/2024 session.
