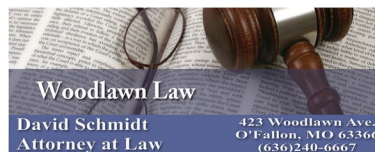

Hello,

This week I am providing a summary of our financial history over the last four years including our budgeted numbers for this current fiscal year (7/1/2023-6/30/2024). A caution to consider when reviewing the past few years as you will recognize the drastic affect COVID had on our finances. This included additional expenses for our school to effectively provide remote learning, extra cleaning concerns, and maintaining safe distancing. We also were provided with some government funding for these expenses including the PPF loan we received and had forgiven, along with EANS grants for certain educational expenses. I mention these to recognize large factors that affected recent years we cannot project into the future.



As seen in the table and chart, the biggest increase in expenses has been and will be due to personnel. Keeping up with inflation has been a considerable expense across the board. This year, the Archdiocese also decided that we needed to make a more significant increase in the salary of the teachers in our schools. I mentioned this last February to let you know about the uniform raise of \$5,000 that was being given to our teachers this year. They more than deserve this raise, but it does affect our finances. The school families have accepted a 10% increase in tuition to help pay for this, but significant funds for the school also come from parish support, so this also needs to increase this year.

Last year our parish offertory almost hit the \$2,000,000 budgeted amount, which was an increase of 5% from the previous year. Thank you for your generosity. This year our budget reflects a 4% increase, but as you can see from the table, this will result in a negative net income for the year and an even bigger deficit when our loan payments are added in.

We hope and are scheduled to pay off our loan in 2026 but to get there we will have to take some sacrifices. I hope that those can be sacrifices we choose to make to support the ministries in our parish and not have to sacrifice the ministries we are able to provide. We are trying to increase the number of students in our school, a critical way to keep tuition affordable and to require less support from the parish, but this takes time. Please see our annual report for more details about our parish finances, our sacraments, and our youth ministry here at Assumption, and feel welcome to ask any questions you may have.

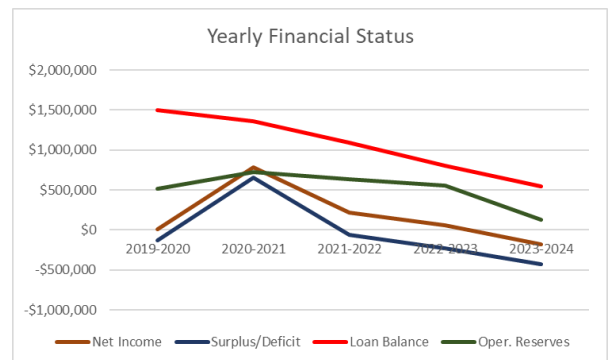
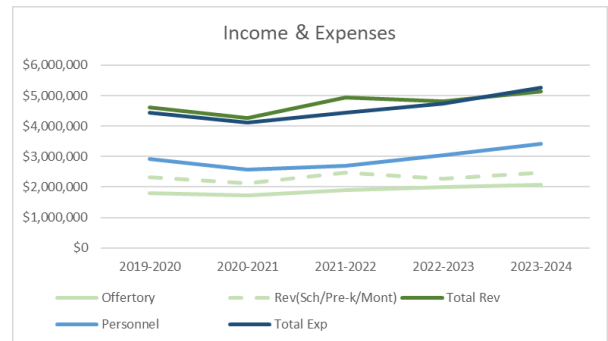

Take some time to tell your priests and deacons how much you appreciate them and thank them for answering God's to service in the Church. Most importantly, pray for them and their ministry.

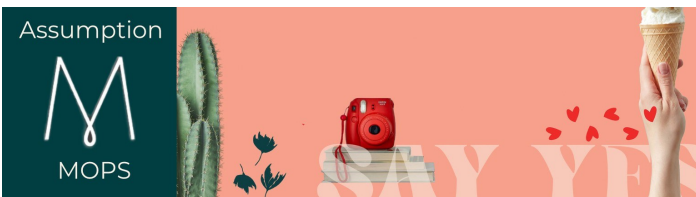
CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD PROGRAM

Sixth Grade Camp

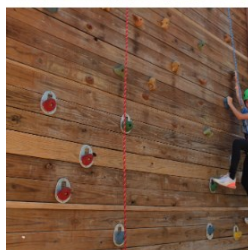

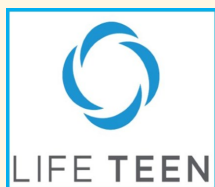

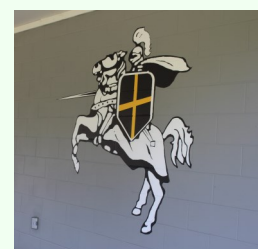

RCIA: THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple, and broke bread from house to house. They ate their food with joyful and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. Every day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved" (Acts 2:46-47).



Jesus declares: "I will build my church" (Mt 16:18), For over a month our Inquirers have been meeting with team members only. Last week our focus was on building a relationship with God and why do we need Jesus. This weekend, we added our sponsors. After introductions we discussed What is Church?
