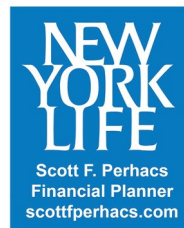

Hello,

As most of you know, the Catholic Church considers that a human life begins at conception. An abortion is considered to be the deliberate termination of a pregnancy by killing the unborn child. It is this understanding that requires us to consider any abortion to be the killing of an unborn child, and thus a grave sin that cannot be supported.



I think most people understand this is the teachings of the Catholic Church, and many also understand why, but they allow their concern for the mother who they see in front of them to blind them to the life of the child who would be killed by an abortion. This is one reason why sonograms can be so effective in letting a person see the living, growing, unborn child and to recognize the truth that an abortion would take this child's life.

In our upcoming election in Missouri, you will be asked to vote on Amendment 3 to the Missouri State Constitution, known as "The Right to Reproductive Freedom Initiative" that drastically would change our abortion laws, legalizing abortion throughout all stages of pregnancy. While anyone who believes life begins at conception and that abortion is the killing of an unborn child will definitely **vote NO** on this amendment, it is also important to recognize aspects of this amendment that might persuade others to **vote NO** if they recognize what the amendment would do.

Amendment 3 would eliminate any requirement for parental notification or consent if a minor was seeking an abortion. *Section 36, subsection 2. "The Government shall not deny or infringe upon a person's fundamental right to reproductive freedom... including but not limited to parental care, childbirth, postpartum care, birth control, abortion care, and respectful birthing conditions."*

Amendment 3 would put women at risk by superseding current Missouri laws that require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. *Section 36, subsection 3. "The right to reproductive freedom shall not be denied, interfered with, delayed or otherwise restricted unless the Government demonstrates that such action is justified by a compelling governmental interest achieved by the least restrictive means. Any denial, interference, delay or restriction of the right to reproductive freedom shall be presumed invalid."*

Amendment 3 would allow abortions at any time for any reason. *Section 36, subsection 4. "Notwithstanding subsection 3 of this Section, the general assembly may enact laws that regulate the provision of abortion after Fetal Viability provided that under no circumstances shall the Government deny, interfere with, delay or otherwise restrict an abortion that in the good faith of a treating health care professional is needed to protect the life or physical or mental health of the pregnant person."*

We need to care for the unborn children, and we need to care for the pregnant mothers too. In our area, Our Lady's Inn Maternity Homes is just one of many resources to help. WalkingwithMomsSTL.com has information about this and other services. If we wish for people to have freedom, we need to share with them the truth. Be willing to talk about the Amendment, be willing to listen to other's concerns, be willing to show your love.

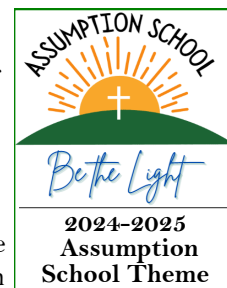
