



Hello,

This weekend at the Cathedral Basilica of Saint Louis at 10 am, the "Red Mass" (for those who work in the legal community throughout our archdiocese) will be celebrated. It is celebrated annually at the beginning of October because this is when the judicial term begins. Next Sunday, October 13, also at the Cathedral Basilica of Saint Louis at 10 am, the "White Mass" (for those who work in the healthcare professions) will be celebrated. This is held annually around October 18, St. Luke's feast day who is the patron saint of physicians and surgeons.



I mention this for two reasons. The first is to let people know about them so they can partake in the celebration if they desire. The second, and more important reason for me to talk about them, is the fact that this is a clear demonstration that as Catholics we believe that our faith is an integral part of all of our life, including our work.

This doesn't mean that all Catholics in the legal profession or all Catholics in healthcare professions, or all Catholics in any profession are going to agree on everything. Look at saints Peter and Paul and we realize being faithful doesn't mean we are always going to agree. But it does mean that we allow our faith, our values, and our church teachings, to help inform and guide us in making our decisions, in finding value in our work, in recognizing that whatever our profession is should be a recognition of the gifts God has given us and a means by which we support ourselves and also serve one another. And while we may not all agree, having these celebrations for specific professions, we can also talk with others in our same field and of the same faith to consider what are some of the questions and concerns unique or frequent in your profession.

My first year in the seminary, when I was taking all philosophy courses at St. Louis University, one of the electives I took was a business ethics course. Some of the assignments in the course were of real—world situations and we had to critique the actions that had been taken. One of the cases was of an engineer who had falsified some brake test data for a fighter aircraft. Having worked as an engineer in that field, I was more familiar with what had been done than anyone else in the class, and the professor said I was also more critical of the engineer's actions than anyone he had seen before, bringing up concerns that he had never considered. We each face different decisions depending on our professions and we are specifically educated and prepared to address them, we need to also specifically educate and prepare ourselves in our faith and morals for those specific decisions.

Whatever our profession, hopefully we recognize the special gifts and responsibilities that come along with it and consider how our faith is to be a part of it.

- ♦ October 20: World Mission Sunday: This is a worldwide collection to support the evangelization efforts of the Church, including catechetical programs, seminaries, the work of religious communities, communication, transportation, the building of chapels, churches, orphanages, and schools, etc.
- Debt Reduction: Donations to this collection will pay down the balance of Assumption's loan from the Archdiocese, which we borrowed in 2013 to fund the expansion of the school building.
- ◆ St. Vincent de Paul: Your contribution provides direct help to the poor in our local community. Since 1845, Vincentians have met face-to-face with individuals and families in poverty to provide support and help them through the most desperate times. Through your generosity, you help people struggling to survive, providing: clothing, shelter, food, medicine and more.
