Hello,

Over the past week, we have been celebrating the angels. On September 29, we had the feast of the archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, and then on October 2, we celebrated the feast of guardian angels. **The word angel means a ‘messenger of God,’** but what we also realize is that they are in the presence of God, beholding His face in heaven.



Thinking about angels, it struck me that this is a good reminder and model to keep in mind when we are thinking about evangelizing. Not the deepest revelation, but it doesn't hurt that the roots of our words should be helping us understand what they mean. So, as we evangelize, we are also to be messengers of God, bringing Christ and His Gospel to others. The other thing to keep in mind, that isn't in the definition of the word, is that we need to do this like the angels—always staying in and bringing God's presence.

Of course, unlike angels, we have physical bodies that make some of this bilocation kind of thing harder. I consider that a reality but not an excuse. We know God is present to us in many ways, and we always need to be conscious of that as we bring Him to others. Also, we need to take the time to be present with God in the most direct and physical ways he offers—in the sacraments, Scripture, and quiet prayer. If we don't spend the time to do this, we probably won't have the desire to evangelize, and might end up just bringing ourselves and our message, and not God and His message, to those we are trying to evangelize.






NWEA Testing Results - September

Assumption uses Growth Assessment testing to measure academic growth and achievement for each student over the course of the year in math, reading, and language usage. It provides teachers with accurate information and evidence to help inform instructional strategies for all students in the class.

On September 22, our faculty was trained in analyzing testing data of students. All students have strengths and areas of need. By identifying students with the same areas of need, the teacher is able to group the students and address those areas, or meet individually to assess a skill.

Over the year, our students will be tested three times. As the data of achievement and growth accumulates over time, the information will be distributed to parents.


Bar Graph of ALL STUDENTS Grades K-8: Math



Takeaways:

- ◆ The Math bar graph information shows **all students K-8**.
- ◆ The **GREEN oval** in front of the bar graph shows that Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (ABVM) students (our school) score in the 68th percentile, which means our students/school scores above 67 out of 100 students/schools in the nation (those Catholic and Public schools that take this test).
- ◆ The **YELLOW** section of the bar graph shows the **AVERAGE** range of scores on the math test (41st–60th percentile). This means that 24 percent of our students score in the average range of math.
- ◆ When looking at the **GREEN** and **BLUE** together, 62 percent of our students score in those bands. This is amazing because they represent the **HIGH-AVERAGE** to **HIGH** range in math. The breakdown is 33 percent in the high-average math range, and 28 percent in the high math range.
- ◆ The second lowest range, **ORANGE**, has 12 percent of our students
- ◆ The lowest range score, **RED**, has 3 percent of our students.


Grades K-8: Reading



Takeaways:

- ◆ The Reading bar graph information shows all students K-8.
- ◆ The **YELLOW** oval in front of the bar graph shows that our students score in the 59th percentile. This means our students/school scores above 58 out of 100 students/schools in the nation (those Catholic and Public schools that take this test).
- ◆ The **YELLOW** section of the bar graph shows the AVERAGE range of scores in the Reading test (41st–60th percentile). This means 27 percent of our students score in the AVERAGE range in Reading.
- ◆ When looking at the **GREEN** and **BLUE** together, 48 percent of our students score in those bands, which is very good because they represent the HIGH-AVERAGE to HIGH Range in Reading. The breakdown is 29 percent in the high-average Reading range, and 29 percent in the High Reading range.
- ◆ The second lowest range, **ORANGE**, has 19 percent of our students
- ◆ The lowest range score, **RED**, has 6 percent of our students.

Grades K-8: Language Usage



Takeaways

- ◆ The Language Usage is given to **only grades 2 -8**.
- ◆ The **GREEN** oval in front of the bar graph shows that our students scored in the 63rd percentile. This means our students/school scores above 62 out of 100 students/schools in the nation (those Catholic and Public schools that take this test).
- ◆ The **YELLOW** section of the bar graph shows the AVERAGE range of scores in the Language Usage test (41st–60th percentile). This means 27 percent of our students score in the average range in Language Usage.
- ◆ When looking at the **GREEN** and **BLUE** together, 54 percent of our students score in those bands, which is excellent, because they represent the HIGH-AVERAGE to HIGH Range in Language Usage. The breakdown is 32 percent in the high-average in the Language Usage range, and 22 percent in the high Language Usage range.
- ◆ The second lowest range, **ORANGE**, has 13 percent of our students
- ◆ The lowest range score, **RED**, has 6 percent of our students.

Our goal over the year is to move students currently in the **Red** band to the **Orange**; students currently in the **Orange** band to the **Yellow** band, etc. As we do so, our results of testing in January will show the academic growth of students between the first test and the second. Likewise, we test in April, which will show growth over the entire year.

Assumption is in a solid position, and with a goal of improvement through data-driven instruction, we should see the rewards through our testing results.
