Please join us in Church 30 minutes before each weekend Mass for the Rosary (except 5:30 pm Mass on Sundays.)

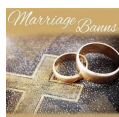

## CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (FORMERLY RCIA)

Topic for the day is **Salvation history**. The Bible's salvation history largely establishes the direction of its movement. To return for a moment to the simplest outline of salvation history, we begin with creation, with God as the Creator and all that he makes declared to be good; God created man to image God's rule over the earth, but man rebelled and fell under divine judgment.

God's choosing of those whom he would save is everywhere in Scripture described as an act of grace. It is a choice grounded solely in God himself without reference to anything in us. From eternity he set his love on us and determined to bring us to glory. (Ephesians 1:3-6)

Salvation History is **God's plan to save mankind from sin and lift the human family to the glory of Heaven**. This plan unfolds through Abraham, Moses and David, and comes to its fulfillment through Our Savior Jesus Christ. It then continues through the work of the Church until Christ comes again.

## PRINCIPAL'S PEN



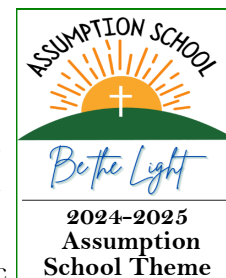
At Assumption we are committed to providing safe, meaningful, and educational trips that align with our curriculum and enhance the learning journey. Field trips offer our children a unique opportunity to expand their understanding beyond the classroom, providing hands-on experiences that enrich their academic growth and foster personal development.

Our Third Grade classes participated in a “Money Doesn’t Grow on Trees” field trip to the Magic House. Students engaged in hands-on activities where they earned paychecks, made consumer choices, used teamwork and learned how members of a community depend upon each other during this hands-on, financial literacy educational program. Following private exploration of the Children’s Village, students participated in a guided classroom-based program where they formed a “family” and worked together to make appropriate personal budget decisions about their wants and needs.

Through experiences like this, it is our goal to help students connect with their local environment, cultivating a sense of community and responsibility. We want students to learn not only about the world around them but also about their place in it, encouraging them to become thoughtful and informed citizens.

## AREA PARISHIONERS COME TOGETHER IN PRAYER TO DEFEAT AMENDMENT 3

Parishioners from seven parishes put their faith in action, Sunday, October 6, and prayed the rosary to end abortion. More than 110 parishioners from Assumption, ICD, St. Paul, St. Joseph, Immaculate Heart of Mary, St. Cletus and All Saints lined Main Street for two hours during the Fall Festival to pray that Amendment 3, on the November 5 ballot, does not pass, which would allow abortions in Missouri. Led by our Pro-Life Respect Life Apostolate Ministry, the group reminds us that prayer can change the world and help us secure Missouri's ban on abortion.
