Hello,

I've written over the past month about Amendment 3 and the reasons why you should **vote NO on Amendment 3**. I have also written about all of the other positions and propositions and amendments, that we need to form our conscious' and weigh the many factors that are involved when we decide how we are going to vote. So instead of having a long discussion of different points and reasons to consider when deciding how you are going to vote, I will just suggest three things:



**Pray** – about how you should vote, and for our state and country as a result of the elections.

**Vote** – Vote No on Amendment 3, as it promotes and makes it easier for anyone trying to have an abortion, the direct and intentional killing of a child in the womb. Also, vote for all of the other positions, amendments and propositions on the ballot—we need to participate and care about our society and the world we live in.

**Talk and Listen** – to one another about why you are voting the way you are. Hopefully we will then vote with a more informed conscious and also help others to form theirs. We strive to help one another, to live together in society and to seek and grow in our understanding of the truth. That requires the willingness to share with one another what we believe and understand and why we are taking the actions we are, and also to listen to others not just out of respect and desire to have a chance to be more united, but also with a genuine belief and intent to learn from them.

This week you will have the opportunity to vote (if you haven't already), but we will also have opportunities to pray as individuals and together here at the parish regarding Amendment 3 and the entire election. Take the opportunity to help build our society.

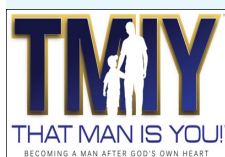

## CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (FORMERLY RCIA)

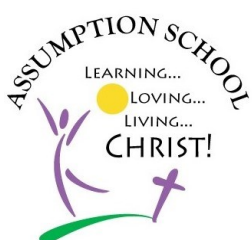
This weekend at the 8am Mass, we will celebrate God's action among us with a ritual called the **Combined Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens and Rite of Welcoming the Candidates for Full Communion**. God has called and now we have the privilege of introducing these people to the one we call Lord Jesus Christ and to you, the assembly. We share the good news, and uncover God's action in our lives. For some, this leads to a remarkable beginning, a new life. For others, this deepens the relationship they already have with Christ. It marks the first public declaration of God's call to follow Christ. It also marks those previously baptized first public declaration of their wish to live as Roman Catholic Christians.

Many things have already changed for these people. This Rite marks that change. We now know these men and women as belonging to God and to God's people gathered here in our parish. The unbaptized have a unique relationship, and a special name, Catechumens. They are entrusted to this faith community to nurture in this journey of faith. The already baptized in a different faith, are known to us as Candidates. All are signed with the sign of our faith, the sign of the cross. They commit now to begin to follow Christ deliberately as Roman Catholics do, and to learn what that means from us, through our prayer, our Scripture and Tradition, our works of charity and justice and our lives as holy/different people.

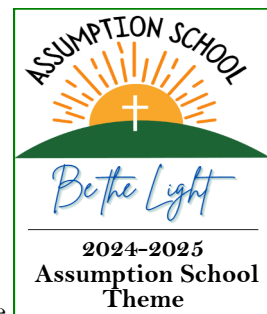

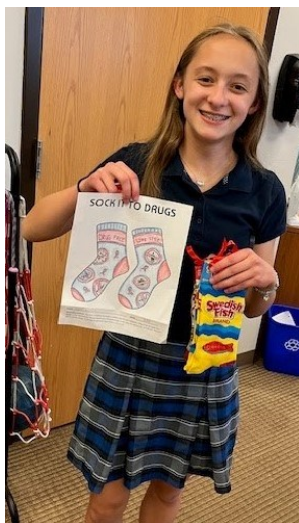
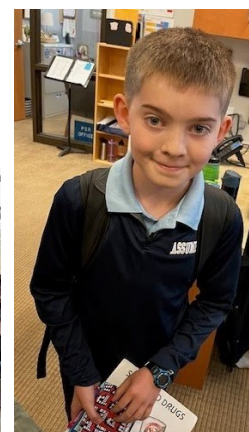
