Hello,

At the end of the year we start to see lists of the "best" or "most of" for the year. After looking at a few of these and the most searched people or things on Google, I thought I would see if a list of what people searched for about religion. There wasn't a specific list for this so far for 2023, but I did find a few recurring articles from past years that had similar rankings for 2020 and 2022, so I will refer to 2022's. The Article was '100 Top



Religious Theological Internet Searches 2022' on Oct 25, 2022 by Kevin Bart under the title of Pursuing Intimacy with God. (100 Top Religious Theological Internet Searches 2020 - Pursuing Intimacy With God)

The top 10 searches were:

- 1. What is love? (love) 7,480,000
- 2. Who is Jesus? (jesus) 2,740,000
- 3. What is the Big Bang? (big bang) 2,740,000
- 4. What is the church? (church) 2,240,000
- 5. What is the Salvation Army? (salvation army) 1,830,000
- 6. What is money? (money) 1,830,000
- 7. What is sin? (sinned/sin) 1,500,000
- 8. Who is God? (god) 1,500,000
- 9. What are the seven deadly sins (seven deadly sins)? 1,220,000
- 10. What is Psalm 91? (psalm 91) 1,220,000

I thought it was interesting that some of these searches were even considered under this topic, such as the number one search, 'What is love?' I think it is good that they consider 'love' to be a religious—theological topic, but I don't know if the people typing the search would have always intended it that way, similarly with 'the Big Bang' and 'money.'

One of the reasons I think it is good to know what or how people are searching is to be able to help them find answers. **All Things New** wasn't just to rearrange parishes in the archdiocese over the last few years, but hopefully to see how we can better evangelize others and evangelize ourselves. I was surprised to see that 'sin' was so high on the list, it made me think about whether they were questioning if there even is such a thing as sin, or if they wanted to know examples of things considered sinful (searching for the seven deadly sins would definitely be more of the second of those.) #15 on the list was 'What is hell?', and #18 was 'What is prayer?' A little more direct was #14, 'What is the Catholic Church?'

Some of these searches sound so basic you wonder where you might begin. And I think it is good to wonder about this so we will be prepared for the question when it might come up. Also, reflecting on some of these questions might help each of us ourselves to consider what questions we have, and are we seeking the answers or not?

Our parish subscribes to a website that can help with some of this called 'Formed.org.' They have a series of videos on it entitled 'the Search' which I will be promoting over the next few weeks and hopefully watching with you over the following several weeks. I hope we can all grow in our faith and be open to share it with others in the coming year.




