Jesus is led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He has just been baptized by John in the River Jordan; he is announced by God as “my beloved son.” Before he can proclaim the Gospel he must journey forty days in the desert, devoting himself to fasting and prayer, and be tempted by the devil. If forty days of fasting and prayer were necessary for Jesus to enter fully into his mission, then perhaps we, too, can spend forty days in fasting and prayer.

The ashes we received on Ash Wednesday marked us for Christ. We announced to the world that we belong to Christ. We are given this holy season of Lent to connect more deeply in love with Jesus. We will walk with him, talk with him and serve with him. Each one of us can carve out more space for Jesus this Lent; and all of us together can open our hearts to God’s love.

As we grow in our love for Jesus, as we begin to enjoy our moments of quiet with him, no longer awkward, much more comfortable laughing and dancing with him; just then we will be tempted. This is to be expected. My ego has exerted much energy protecting my soul from harm, even to the point of protecting my soul from intimacy with the Lord. So now the devil will attempt to thwart us just when we are experiencing friendship with Jesus as natural to us. We are not as strong as Jesus to resist temptation, yet we have Jesus with us. Whenever we are tempted to abandon our morning prayer for ten more minutes of sleep, we can simply say, “not today, meet my friend, Jesus.” When we are tempted to play video games instead of homework, we can simply say, “Jesus, help me to remain faithful to my commitments.” At the end of the day when we examine our conscience we can be honest about all the blessings we have experienced and the blessings we have provided to folks in our community; and we can acknowledge some of the opportunities we missed along the way. We will make this Lenten Journey one day at a time, indeed one step at a time.

When these forty days are through we will be ready to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth, to follow Mary in her mission of bringing Christ to the world. God bless you.



Adult Formation




This Sunday we celebrate the Rite of Sending and the Rite of Election. The rite of sending is a parish celebration that sends Catechumens/Candidates to the rite of election which is celebrated at the cathedral. After the homily, a catechist will present the catechumens to the priest, who will call them forward with their godparents and will ask these three very important questions: **Have they taken their formation seriously? Have they given evidence of their conversion? Do the godparents judge them ready for the rite of election?**

The Rite of Election formally brings to an end the catechumenate period, the time that these individuals have spent exploring the church teachings and reflecting on the Word of God. The Rite of Election is the time when the Church invites or “elects” the catechumens and candidates to the Sacraments of Initiation.

Election refers to the idea of the chosen people. In Israel’s early history, God chose a people and established a covenant with them. Christians believe that God continues to choose people, now through the covenant of Baptism.

The RCIA tells us that the community *“should surround the elect with prayer, so that the entire Church will accompany and lead them to encounter Christ.”* These next few weeks of preparation will be intense as the Assumption Parish community gets ready to initiate our new members. Prayer cards for the elect are available in the back of church. There are two types of cards, one for Catechumens who are preparing for Baptism and Candidates who were baptized in other faiths and are preparing for full communion with the Church through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. Please remember to take one home and keep them in your prayers throughout the season of Lent. We ask each person, including children, to take a card. May you be blessed, as we enter into this holy season of Lent.



March 10, 2019 — First Sunday of Lent

Dt 26: 4-10; Ps 91: 1-2, 10-15; Rom 10: 8-13; Lk 4:1-13

Literally speaking, **“Deuteronomy,”** as in the Book of Deuteronomy, means **“Second Law.”** This Old Testament Book from which our First Reading is drawn actually consists of three sermons delivered to the Israelites by Moses. Interestingly, in German, this book is called just Mose, drawing the name from the opening line of the Book which states, quite simply, *“These are the words of Moses.”*

In today’s reading Moses speaks not just to the Israelites, but to us as well, as is always the case with Holy Scripture. Moses makes reference to giving of one’s first fruits. Specifically he says, *“Therefore, I have now brought you the first fruits of the products of the soil which you, O Lord, have given me, and having set them before the Lord, your God, you shall bow down in his presence.”*

Giving of first fruits is a way to acknowledge and honor God because it provides the Lord with His portion first, before any is used for one’s self. That, of course, is an important aspect of stewardship, as challenging as that may be. Moses points out that it is more than giving first fruits, however. He recognizes that all comes from God, and we are called to return this first portion in thanksgiving for God’s grace and love and blessings.

Moses would also remind us that giving must come from the heart, with a true attitude of gratitude. It is part of the way we worship the Lord by being stewards of His gifts.
