The new commandment

A new commandment I give you, that you love one another. This commandment that he is giving them is a new one, the Lord Jesus tells his disciples. Yet was it not contained in the Old Law, where it is written: You shall love your neighbor as yourself? Why does the Lord call it new when it is clearly so old? Or is the commandment new because it divests us of our former selves and clothes us with the new man? Love does indeed renew the man who hears, or rather obeys its command; but only that love which Jesus distinguished from a natural love by the qualification: As I have loved you.

This is the kind of love that renews us. When we love as he loved us we become new men, heirs of the new covenant and singers of the new song. My brothers, this was the love that even in bygone days renewed the holy men, the patriarchs and prophets of old. In later times it renewed the blessed apostles, and now it is the turn of the Gentiles. From the entire human race throughout the world this love gathers together into one body a new people, to be the bride of God's only Son. She is the bride of whom it is asked in the Song of Songs: Who is this who comes clothed in white? White indeed are her garments, for she has been made new; and the source of her renewal is none other than this new commandment.

And so all her members make each other's welfare their common care. When one member suffers, all the members suffer with him, and if one member is glorified all the rest rejoice. They hear and obey the Lord's words: A new commandment I give you, that you love one another; not as men love one another for their own selfish ends, nor merely on account of their common humanity, but because they are all gods and sons of the Most High. They love one another as God loves them so that they may be brothers of his only Son. He will lead them to the goal that alone will satisfy them, where all their desires will be fulfilled. For when God is all in all, there will be nothing left to desire.

This love is the gift of the Lord who said: As I have loved you, you also must love one another. His object in loving us, then, was to enable us to love each other. By loving us himself, our mighty head has linked us all together as members of his own body, bound to one another by the tender bond of love.

Pentecost is going to be epic this year!

"Lord, teach us how to pray...so Jesus told them, 'pray in this way: **Our** Father, who art in heaven..." (Luke 11:1-2)



Have you noticed that Jesus invites us to pray collectively, as a united community of believers to our Father? In the Gospels He calls us to intercede, go before the Father, and keep asking. We already know that prayer changes us and spending time with each other also changes us so it makes sense that, in recent years, many parishes have created a platform for neighborhoods to come together and pray. They call this gathering Block Rosaries. Imagine if today we all gathered with our neighbors and prayed the rosary together; lifting up prayers for the world! In order for us to pray together, though, we need your help!

Prior to Pentecost, a Block rosary captain—which is a friendly neighbor of yours—is going to invite families to gather together to pray the rosary as a neighborhood community once a week. *(The rosary will be led by the Block Captain or someone s/he encourages.)* It would be epic to have as many neighborhoods as possible praying the rosary together on Pentecost Sunday and beyond!

I hope you are willing to place on your schedule: pray the rosary. By doing so, you will give something in addition to prayer; you will give time and space for relationships—one with each other as well as one with our amazing God. Be sure to check out the map of our parish boundaries that is in the narthex. You can locate not only your own home but notice all those red dots around you—those are parishioners as well. It's exciting to see so many neighbors who have the opportunity to pray together!

May 26, 2019 -Sixth Sunday of Easter ACTS 15:1-2, 22-29; PS 67: 2-3, 5, 6, 8; REV 21:10-14, 22-23; JN 14:23-29

The concept of hospitality is fundamental to a stewardship way of life. When we envision hospitality, we naturally think of offering a sincere and warm welcome — to those new to our parish, for instance. We picture inviting them in and making them feel at home and at ease in our presence, communicating to them that they are highly valued.

Today's Gospel reading from John invites us to think of hospitality in a slightly different way. In it, we hear Jesus speaking this to his disciples: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him."

Jesus is asking that we permit the Blessed Trinity to come and dwell within us. This is a stunning request. It tells us that our first and most privileged form of hospitality should be directed towards God Himself.

How does one show hospitality to God? How do we make God "at home and at ease" within us? How can we communicate to God that He is "highly valued" by us? Jesus tells us how: we are to keep His word, to follow His teachings. In order to keep His word, we must know His word. This takes discipline and effort on our part. We must make study of Scripture and Church teaching a priority in our daily lives.

If we want our parish to be a place of genuine Christian hospitality, we must be sure that our own hearts are hospitable dwelling places for the Blessed Trinity. Then, our smiles and words, our greetings and ministries, will radiate with the warmth of God's love. And, our parish family will become at least a little bit like Heaven on earth. This is the simplicity and glory of a stewardship way of life.

WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU

Join with fellow young adults and members of the parish leadership team to discuss the needs and desires of the young adults in our community.

How will you continue your spiritual journey through participation in the sacraments, study of scripture and prayer, and service in the Christian community? How are you called to be a witness to your Easter faith in the resurrection of Christ?

These are a few of the questions discussed in our sessions since Easter.

At the Sunday Masses of the Easter season the entire Christian community should be encouraged to welcome the neophytes into the community, helping them to feel more at home in the community of

the baptized. The neophytes should also be encouraged to discern the ways in which God is calling them to witness to their Easter faith and serve in various ministries of the Church. The Emmaus account (Luke 24: 13-35) reflects the abiding presence of the risen Lord with the disciples and with every community of believers.

In the Easter season the neophytes reflect on the meaning of the rites, the signs and symbols of the Easter Vigil as the visible means through which they were initiated into a new life of grace and into the Christian community of believers. The sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist, give us a real share in the risen life of Jesus, in his victory over sin and death. By his death Christ liberates us from sin; by his Resurrection he opens for us the way to new life with God. (CCC 651-655)

Saint Paul reminds us that just 'as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life'. (Romans 6:4) During the Easter season, the newly baptized reflect on what it means to 'walk in the newness of life' in the Risen Lord.

'The neophytes are, as the term mystagogy suggests, introduced into a fuller and more effective understanding of mysteries through the Gospel message they have learned and above all through their experience of the sacraments they have received...they have been renewed in mind, tasted more deeply the sweetness of God's word, received the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, and grown to know the goodness of the Lord. Out of this experience, which belongs to Christians and increases as it is lived, they derive a new perception of the faith, of the Church and of the world.' (RCIA no. 245)
