June 9, 2019 — Pentecost Sunday/Readings during the Day

ACTS 1:1-11; PS 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34; 1 COR 12:3B-7, 12-13 or ROM 8:8-17; JN 20:19-23 or JN 14:15-16, 23B-26

Today we reach the finale of the Easter season with the celebration of the great Feast of Pentecost. Reflecting on today's readings inspires a sense of awe as we consider the mighty power of the Holy Spirit at work giving birth to and sustaining our Church. Just as awesome — the same Spirit is calling to us this day to take up our part in the Church's saving work.

In the first reading, from Acts, we see the creative genius of the Holy Spirit moving through the newly confirmed Apostles "who began to speak in different tongues as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim." The large crowd, gathered from all over the world were "amazed" and "astounded" that each one could understand the Apostles speaking in their own language.

Each one of us, young and old alike, is personally called today by the Holy Spirit into the same mission as that of the first

Apostles — to advance the Kingdom of God in our corner of the world. Just as He did on that Pentecost day, the Holy Spirit speaks to us in our "own language" to give us the Good News of the Gospel and urge us to share it. We can think of our own language as the particular gifts, talents and passions we possess. We experience the presence of the Holy Spirit through them and we are meant put them to the work in grateful service of the Kingdom of God.

When we consider the stewardship way of life we are called to live, we often focus on the challenges it poses. Surrendering ourselves to God is indeed a challenging way to live. But it leads to a life that is exciting, creative and deeply rewarding. 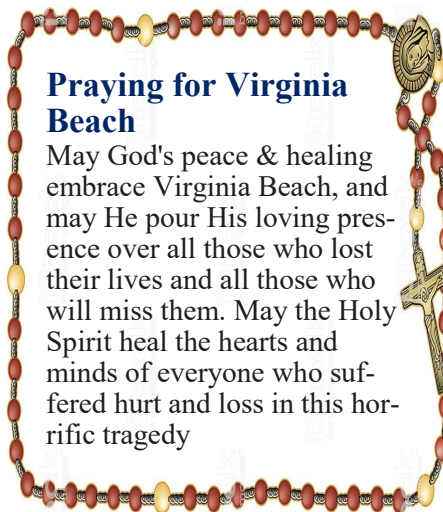

Acts 2:2-4 – “And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like fire, and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost.”

THE MEANING OF PENTECOST

This is one of the most amazing stories in the world. There is none which should be more interesting to Christian people, for it is the story of the launch of the Christian Church. It is the story of how the Church which had been slowly shaping in the quietness and obscurity of that Upper Room became aware of life and power... and set out upon its mission.

So far, these men and women have been rather ordinary people, their love for Jesus Christ the one thing keeping them together. They were perplexed, terribly timid, and very aware of their weaknesses. Then, as they waited, all of a sudden as it seemed, something happened which changed their personalities. They became aware of a unity which broke down every other barrier. They found themselves in possession of faculties they had never dreamed could be theirs. They lost all fear of people and all thought of themselves. They were **fired with a message**, and a passion to tell people about it, to **spread the good news** of a love which had flooded their lives and carried them off their feet.

What did it mean to the apostles' to receive the Holy Spirit?

It meant that God's power of immediate contact was in their lives. That was the great thing which the Spirit signified for them. They realized that God was in contact with them, was within their very souls. They did not need any kind of outside help. They could go out and face the world and be confident that God would back them up; that somehow His very Spirit was in living touch with theirs, that deep down in the place where the mind did its thinking, the heart its loving, and where courage and hope lies within.

They knew that somehow Jesus was there within them by His Spirit, active and loving and gracious, able to make new men and women of them, able to revive their courage and faith so that they could face anything. That was what the Spirit meant to them.

What a new power it would give us to realize this---that God is within. What a new vitality it would bring to our prayer to realize that He does not stand without us but already manifests Himself in our hearts... to the very urge that sends us to our knees.

What they found was that through Him they possessed a root of life, a spirit alive in their souls, growing up in them, shaping character from within and finding its outlet in a certain way of life and service and in all their attitudes to one another. They found that they could think with His mind and were not slavishly dependent upon His words. The life was in them as an original impulse, breaking out in them in a way of feeling and thinking and doing.

Jesus laid down no rules---He **communicates** a Spirit. And the measure in which we have that Spirit... is the measure of the freedom and reality of our own Christian lives. **Come Holy Spirit, COME!**

DID YOU KNOW? ... We now have an Assumption Chapel Endowment Fund!

Just like our houses, God's house also needs work to keep it maintained and looking nice. Here are a few things our beloved Chapel is in need of:

- carpet repairs
- walls patched and repainted from previous leaking
- new light fixtures will be needed soon

Please consider giving to this Fund to keep our historic landmark beautiful for generations to come!

Here are the details and how you can help:

An anonymous donor has created a new endowment fund with the Roman Catholic Foundation of Eastern Missouri to provide long-term support to our beloved Chapel:

Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Catholic Church (O'Fallon) Chapel Endowment Fund

Distributions from the fund may *only* be used for expenses related to the Chapel. *They are not for general parish use.* Chapel related expenses may include renovation and/or restoration, insurance, utility expenses, etc.

Our hope for the short term is to get the balance of the fund to at least \$25,000 before the end of 2020 to allow us to receive our first distribution in the summer of 2021. Although this seems to be a long time from now, the end of 2020 will be upon us more quickly than we expect! Our long-term hope is to grow the fund to completely cover all of the expenses of the Chapel through current and memorial gifts.
