




THE ABUNDANCE OF GOD'S MERCY



With all our intellect and will, we may be tempted to ask, "Is this not the son of Mary?" We may imagine it is not necessary to give our lives to him, nor to follow his mother, Mary, the Mother of God. I have struggled much of my life with what it really means to say "yes," to echo Mary's "yes" to the call to bring Christ to the world. When I felt a strong call from God to be a priest in his Church, I thought that "yes" was my "yes" to God's call in my life. Not really. That first yes was a setting of my feet upon a path to holiness. **ONLY** by God's grace was my journey into priesthood and my first years of priestly ministry beneficial to God's people and his Church. It was not until many years later I realized my path to holiness still needed to be walked; my ego still needed to die; my will still needed to be surrendered; my heart still needed to open to God's Mercy poured out in Christ Jesus the Lord. Even now, I am just beginning to understand the abundance of God's merciful love. I continue to hold tight to my ways of knowing and my ways of doing, leaving an inch of room for God to work in my life. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, consistently encourages us and challenges us to trust God's Mercy which surrounds us, even drowns us, and opens us to true freedom which knows no bounds.

Imagine a life without shame, without regret, without resentment, without addiction, without fear, and without doubt...this is freedom. There will still be mistakes; there will still be guilt; and there will be absolute confidence in our salvation through the forgiveness of sins. How can we get to this freedom in Christ Jesus? We can love one another into freedom; we can pray one another into freedom; and we can participate in God's own life as we journey into freedom. The only way this can happen, the only way we can become the fire of the Holy Spirit, announcing God's Merciful Love to O'Fallon and to the ends of the earth (the margins of society), is for us to be broken and blessed in the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist. I plead with you to open your hearts to a deeper participation in the sacramental life of the Church. If you already attend Mass every Sunday, then choose one day a week to attend 6:30 or 8:00 Mass, praying for those who are not with us on Sunday. If you attend Mass three weeks/month, make it four; if twice/month, make it three; if once/month, make it two.

Beginning July 16, I will hear confessions in Chapel every day from 4:00-5:00 pm and from 9:00-10:00 pm. The code to enter is 3721. If for some reason I am not there when you visit, Jesus will definitely be there in the Blessed Sacrament on the Altar. Many times people say, "God's Mercy should not be held hostage by a priest and require an out loud confession;" true enough. God's Mercy cannot be prevented from flowing deeply into our hearts, minds and souls, unless we block it from within. My intuition is that more shame and guilt, which leads to the human art of rationalization, are what keep us away from celebrating God's Mercy in the Sacrament. Please accept my invitation to be set free through the forgiveness of sins. Then come to the table to receive God's sacrifice, the body and blood of Christ, in true freedom. Then go out to all the nations to announce good news. Then follow Mary in her mission to bring Christ to the world.





<u>July 8, 2018 — Fourteenth</u> Sunday in Ordinary Time

EZ 2: 2-5; PS 123: 1-4; 2 COR 12: 7-9; MK 6: 1-6

The First Reading from the prophet Ezekiel tells of how Ezekiel was

called by God. The Lord speaks to him and says, "Hard of face and obstinate of heart are they to whom I am sending you." God knew He was not giving Ezekiel an easy task, but that is part of what being called by the Lord sometimes involves.

Being called is something to which we often make reference, as each of us is called in Baptism. St. Paul once wrote that we are "called to belong to Jesus Christ." The United States Bishops issued a document a few years ago titled Disciples Called to Witness. That is what we are all to do as baptized Catholics.

In that treatise the Bishops say, "To create a culture of witness, we must live explicit lives of discipleship. Being a disciple is a challenge. Fortunately, one does not become a disciple of Christ on his or her own initiative. The work of the Holy Spirit within the Christian community forms the person as a disciple of Christ."

God does not forsake us when we are called, just as He did not abandon Ezekiel. He is with us through the Holy Spirit to strengthen us and assist us. We must allow the Lord to help us. At the same time, we must strive to be disciples of the Lord. We are called to spread the light of the Gospel in everything we do. ~ Excerpts from: Catholic Diocese of Wichita




Living a Stewardship Way of Life *all* year long – even during Summer vacation!


Jesus offers a guide to life that is "so simple, but very difficult," the Pope has said.

It's difficult because Christianity is "a hands-on religion; it isn't for thinking about, it's for putting into practice, to do it," he said in his homily, according to Vatican Radio. The Pope focused on the reflection on the Gospel reading from St. Matthew in which Jesus teaches the beatitudes, which begin, "Blessed are the poor in spirit."

The beatitudes are the "program" and "the identity card" for every Christian, outlining a step-by-step guide to being "a good Christian," he said.

Jesus' teaching goes "very much against the tide" of a worldly culture, he said, in which monetary wealth, superficial joy and personal satisfaction are the measures of happiness and success.

But "blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven," he said, and "blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted"
