Hello,

You will notice in the pews this week some blue envelopes labeled "Flood Relief". They are for a special collection that the Archdiocese has asked all parishes to take up for those suffering from the recent flooding, funds will be distributed to those in need through Catholic Charities. The reason we are using the envelopes instead of physically passing our baskets again and taking a second collection is that I have experienced this method before as a means where you have the opportunity to give today, or if you desire to give and don't have the money with you today you can take it home and drop the envelope in the collection next week, or if you wanted to think about it (or chat with your spouse) you can do that also. This method hopefully informs you of the need and request, provides you the means to respond, and allows us to clearly follow the will of the donor. I am also hoping to fulfill these steps with our other collections at the parish, specifically the weekly collections.

Informing You of our Needs and Requests – Through your contributions, either with envelopes in our weekly collections at Mass or through on-line donations, you provide for the needs of the parish, the archdiocese, and various other charities. I plan to inform you of the financial status and needs of the parish through an annual report of our last year's finances, share our financial history and current budget, and have a discussion of our future concerns and plans. The archdiocese requests that we also support various other charities throughout the year. Separate envelopes in your packet is the way that we inform you of those special charities.

Providing the means to Respond – The primary ways in which people respond are through making donations with the envelopes they were mailed and through donations on-line.

Following the Will of the Donor – By the envelope that was used, or the charity identified on-line, the donations are separated to support the cause intended.

In our general collection I consider that you are supporting the parish and the many parts of it that are necessary to run our parish. This includes the expenses of personnel, facilities, utilities, supplies and other expenses. Those are things that are necessary to keep the parish running. Other things, like the school, are important parts of our parish that could not run without the parish support, but a parish can exist without them. We choose to have a school here and are glad to be able to substantially support it, but it is also primarily supported by tuition. Then there are organizations like the St. Vincent de Paul Society that is a means of supporting those in need and a manner in which many of our parishioners minister to others. It is financially separate from our parish and operates on private donations. The parish decides what is necessary and capable to be funded as a parish and what is not as integral to being a parish and can be funded independently.

Similarly the Archdiocese has determined what is critical to run the Archdiocese and to support parishes. There is an assessment that is paid on all contributions to parishes that goes to support the operations of the Archdiocese. Yet there are other organizations and functions that the Archdiocese supports such as the Annual Catholic Appeal. This is important to the Archdiocese and to support our mission but, not specifically required to run the Archdiocese. There are other programs that the Archdiocese considers good and important, but not in the same manner. They ask individuals to decide to what degree they are going to support these causes through second collections, or our additional envelopes.

The Archdiocese has already determined what they consider are essential and parishes will be assessed for, what they wish to support through our ACA, and what are other causes they wish to support through separate collections. By separate envelopes in our mailings and identifying the special collections for on-line givers I believe we are better able to inform you of the needs and requests, provide you the means to respond, and for us to clearly follow the will for your donations.

**July 21, 2019****Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

GN 18: 1-10A; PS15:2-5; COL 1:24-28; LK 10:38-42

In today's Gospel reading from St. Luke, we receive a reminder about the proper use of the gift of time, a fundamental aspect of a stewardship way of life. Our passage highlights one of the most famous dinner parties ever thrown, recalling the day that Martha and Mary hosted our Lord in their home. We are told that Martha, as a good steward, welcomes Christ in but

then becomes "*burdened with much serving*" while her sister and fellow hostess chooses to simply sit with Jesus, listening to Him speak.

Martha becomes indignant at Mary's behavior and complains to Jesus, "*Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me.*" But Jesus, in His infinite wisdom, refuses to get pulled in to this sisterly spat. Instead, He offers Martha a fresh way to look at the situation. "*Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing.*"

What is that one thing? It is to put Jesus first in our lives and above all other things; to "*sit at his feet*" and listen as Mary did, giving Him the first priority of our time no matter how busy we think we are. When we truly commit to putting Christ first in our daily lives through a regular time of prayer and frequent participation in the sacraments we will find that all our other concerns become less pressing, less overwhelming.

Why is this so? Because the time we invest in our relationship with God saturates all aspects of our lives with His grace. And because God cannot be outdone in generosity. He will abundantly reward any sacrifice we make in order to spend time with Him.

To the Faithful of the Archdiocese of St. Louis,

We must all be deeply saddened by the devastation our brothers and sisters living along flooded rivers in our community are realizing, now that the near all-time historic high waters are receding. After an initial assessment, several hundred households mostly in St. Charles and Lincoln Counties have been affected with major damage or a complete loss. I ask the Lord to carry those who are suffering and who have lost so much.

To help provide immediate and long-term aid to those impacted by this most recent natural disaster, I am asking our nearly 200 parishes in 11 counties to participate in a second collection at all Masses this weekend or the weekend after (July 13-14 or July 20-21). Funds raised will go directly to relief efforts provided by Catholic Charities of St. Louis and Sts. Joachim and Ann Care Service.
