Blessed Mother Mary

Mary is the mother of God and our mother. We who are members of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish have a special connection with Mary. We know that our ancestors, who built this parish, literally carrying the stones from miles around, have left us a legacy of devotion to Mary. This is a beautiful gift, to be cherished and to be shared with the world. While we follow centuries of tradition and stand solidly on Church teaching, from the earliest councils until the Dogma of the Assumption in 1950, we ought never take Mary for granted.

We can see in the Gospels a growing understanding of Mary's role in our salvation. She says, "yes" in response to the Annunciation of Gabriel; she offers her beautiful Magnificat to Elizabeth and to us; she wraps our savior in swaddling clothes in a manger; she travels with Joseph to Egypt to keep her son safe; she invites her son to save us at the Wedding Feast of Cana; she accepts us as her sons and daughters while standing at the foot of the cross; she stands with the apostles as they witness the Ascension of Christ and at Pentecost when the Holy Spirit descends upon the Church. Mary is present everywhere in the Gospels, full of grace and ready to bring Christ to the world.

Yet many have struggled to accept her. Just as "(Jesus) was in the world, and the world came to be through him, but the world did not know him (Jn 1:10)," so the world has struggled to proclaim Mary as Theotokos, the one who gives birth to God. During the Council of Ephesus in 431 our early teachers of the faith struggled with declaring the truth of Mary as Mother of God. I am glad they did; the struggle itself reveals the importance of this truth. It is not a matter of us exalting Mary with a profoundly beautiful title; God has already exalted her. It is more a matter of humbly exalting all of humanity as children of God. Our hesitance to proclaim Mary as Mother of God and our Mother is grounded in that still small voice in the depths of our soul which still cries, "God cannot really love you that much." But God does love you more than any human heart can ask for or imagine; God loves you enough to send his only Son into the world, born of the Virgin Mary, to bring salvation to you and the whole world; God loves you enough to give you Mary as your mother. Let us be humble enough to let God exalt us as children of God. Let us join Mary in her "yes" to God's love. Let our "amen" to God's love be our commitment to love one another as God has loved us.

Prayer

Pentecost is going to be epic this year!

“Lord, teach us how to pray...so Jesus told them, ‘pray in this way: **Our Father, who art in heaven...**”
(Luke 11:1-2)

Have you noticed that Jesus invites us to pray collectively, as a united community of believers to our Father? In the Gospels He calls us to intercede, go before the Father, and keep asking. We already know that prayer changes us and spending time with each other also changes us so it makes sense that, in recent years, many parishes have created a platform for neighborhoods to come together and pray. They call this gathering Block Rosaries. Imagine if today we all gathered with our neighbors and prayed the rosary together; lifting up prayers for the world! In order for us to pray together, though, we need your help!

Prior to Pentecost, a Block rosary captain—which is a friendly neighbor of yours—is going to invite families to gather together to pray the rosary as a neighborhood community once a week. *(The rosary will be led by the Block Captain or someone s/he encourages.)* It would be epic to have as many neighborhoods as possible praying the rosary together on Pentecost Sunday and beyond!

I hope you are willing to place on your schedule: pray the rosary. By doing so, you will give something in addition to prayer; you will give time and space for relationships—one with each other as well as one with our amazing God. Be sure to check out the map of our parish boundaries that is in the narthex. You can locate not only your own home but notice all those red dots around you—those are parishioners as well. It’s exciting to see so many neighbors who have the opportunity to pray together!




The **Annual Catholic Appeal** brings a special opportunity to follow Jesus' commandment, to show Him and the world that you are His disciple.

The Ascension of our Lord

According to the Acts of the Apostles, Jesus appeared to his disciples during the forty days after Easter: On the fortieth day, "he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight" (Acts 1:9). The story of Jesus' Ascension serves as a bridge between the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, which were both written by the same author.

At certain churches and in other times, the Ascension Thursday liturgy includes a procession outside of the church to a nearby hill to remind everyone that Jesus was lifted up to the sky. Also, later, the Easter candle was extinguished on Ascension Thursday to mark the end of the Easter season and the beginning of the nine-day wait until Pentecost.

Thursday, May 29th marks the day the Church remembers Jesus' Ascension, though June 2, the coming Sunday liturgy, we will also recall the event. Christians live in Jesus' promise that he will come again like a "thief in the night" when we least expect it. Ascension Thursday is also a preview of our own destiny in which we will someday be taken up to heaven to meet God face to face.



May 19, 2019 ~ Fifth Sunday of Easter

ACTS 13:14, 43-52; PS 100: 1-3,5; REV 7:9, 14B-17; JN 10:27-30

Today's readings on this fifth Sunday of Easter contain inspiring but challenging messages for us as Christian stewards.

The Gospel from John includes this well-known verse: *"My children... I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another."*

What a succinct description of a stewardship way of life. It sounds so simple. But simple does not necessarily mean easy.

How exactly is Jesus Calling us to love? As He Himself loved. Jesus loved (and loves) by serving us and by making a sacrifice of His very life for us. That is a tall order.

Living a life of service and self-sacrifice is not easy because it requires us to continuously fight against our selfish inclinations. But the more we empty ourselves of *"self"* by serving others, the more room we make in our hearts for God pour His grace into us.

As we face the hardships that come with living as Christian stewards, we can continue to rejoice in the wonder of the Resurrection this Easter season, finding great joy in following in our Lord's own footsteps and in loving as He loves.
