

Epiphany

The Beautiful Feast of the Epiphany is marked by the star, which leads the visitors from the east to the birthplace of Jesus in Bethlehem. We recognize God's love for all creation in this one poignant scene. The star, the wise men, Gentiles, the infant Jesus with His mother, Mary; every detail of the scene eloquently proclaims salvation from God revealed in the Word made flesh.

And then the warning comes; the wise men must not return to Herod. The brightness of God's Glory cannot be overcome by the darkness; yet the darkness is stubborn in its effort. This has always been true. In our first reading Isaiah is encouraging the Israelites who have just returned to Jerusalem after fifty years of exile. In our second reading Paul is teaching us that Jesus is savior of all the nations, this same Paul who spent more than ten years persecuting the very Christ he now proclaims. God's message of light and life and love has always been accompanied by a shadow of fear, by hints of despair and by our vulnerability to sin.

This Feast of the Epiphany is another invitation to community. The shepherds, the magi, all the angels who sing Glory to God in the Highest; none of them are alone. The whispers from the darkness are more easily dismissed when we are standing together in the light of day, when we are sharing our faith freely with one another and with the world. The voices of darkness, like Herod, are shrewd enough to catch our attention with flattering half truths; we need each other to help one another remain focused on the star and on the message of the angel. I know that without the loving honesty of my friends speaking to me from their hearts I would not be the person of faith I am today; my friends have saved me by reminding me who I really am and how I am truly called to live.

I have an idea for an Epiphany promise, hopefully more meaningful than a New Year's Resolution. Let us commit to praying every day. Let us commit to saying "I love you" to someone we love every day. And let us commit to sharing with someone we love one message from an Angel every day, one sign of God's love we have witnessed. So, before I complain about what may have gone wrong, I will share one piece of evidence of God's love...and maybe sharing the evidence of God's love will dismiss the complaint along with the darkness out of our lives. And let us commit to gathering as a faith community to celebrate the Eucharist every Sunday.

God's glory revealed on this Feast of the Epiphany is truly present in power and majesty whenever we gather as the Body of Christ. Let us then become the light which has come into the world.

Epiphany Home Blessing



One interesting custom for Epiphany is for families to ask God's blessing on our own homes. The ritual calls for parents to mark, with blessed chalk, the main entrance door with the initials of the Magi and a code of the current year. This year's mark will be:

20 + C + M + B + 19

The numbers stand for the year in which the blessing is inscribed (2019). The letters stand for the names traditionally given the Magi who found the Christ Child: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They are also an abbreviation for the Latin blessing: *Christus mansionem benedicat*, or "Christ bless this dwelling." Blessed chalk and holy water will be available after masses this weekend (January 5/6).

Gather your family at the main entrance to your home.

All make the sign of the cross.

Parent: **"Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace.
Blessed be God forever."**

Family: **"Blessed be God forever"**

Parent or reader: *(reading from Sacred Scripture)* **"And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage." Matt 2:10-11**

Parent imparts the blessing: **"Lord God of heaven and earth, You revealed Your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill them with the light of Christ, that their concern for others may reflect Your love. We ask this through Christ, our Lord."**

Family: **"Amen"**

Then the parent sprinkles holy water on those gathered and sprinkles it about the home.

January 6, 2019 — Epiphany of the Lord

IS 60: 1-6, PS 72:1-2,7-8, 10-13; EPH 3:2-3A, 5-6; MT 2:1-12

As we continue our celebration of the Christmas season, we observe today the great Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. The word **“epiphany”** means manifestation and throughout the Christmas readings we have seen that the newborn King is eager to reveal Himself to all those willing to accept His presence in their lives. From poor and humble shepherds to the international group of magi featured in today’s Gospel passage, Jesus makes it clear that He offers Himself as a gift to everyone.

We also see throughout the scriptures that God uses what is familiar to us to draw us to Himself. In the case of the magi – astrologers – He uses a star. Our Lord continues to speak to each one of us today. But we must be alert to **“hear”** and **“see”** Him in our daily lives.

How can we become better attuned to the ways God is speaking to us? We must strengthen our spiritual **“senses”** by spending time with the Lord in prayer every single day. In the same way that we set professional goals or exercise goals, we can set spiritual goals to ensure that we are taking the time to listen intentionally to God daily.

When we establish a regular, intentional time for prayer, we will find that the Lord continues to speak to us throughout the day. We will more easily recognize the **“stars”** He places before us to draw us into closer relationship with Him. We will begin to see that He is indeed present in our lives at every moment.


