Hello,

In the Christmas season that we are celebrating there are quite a few great feast days. This last Tuesday we celebrated the feast of the Holy Name of Jesus. One of the ways this was promoted and spread was by using the inscription IHS to stand for Jesus. Looking up some things about this, I found out that what was most prominent in my mind for what IHS stood for was actually wrong, at least in a way. I knew somewhere in there that it was letters denoting Jesus's name, specifically the first three letters in the Greek name for Jesus, IH Σ OY Σ , *iota-eta-sigma*, or IH Σ . More dominant in my mind was the connection to "Jesus, Savior of men", or "Jesus Hominum Salvator" in Latin. Reading a variety of sources on this, one source (Wikipedia - although they actually give some respectable references for this entry) refers to this interpretation as a backronym, that people worked backwards to explain what it meant, and didn't exactly get it right.

In this case that can be kind of interesting since IHS may have originally been simply an abbreviation for the name Jesus. However, if the actual context in which it was written and the person who wrote it considered that they were expressing "Jesus, Savior of men", then the second interpretation is actually correct, even if it was founded on a mistake. If we start using the second interpretation on something where it wasn't meant that way, we may be adding things that were not intended. Since we normally use this symbol (IHS) by itself, that isn't a great concern. It is reminding us of Jesus, or of Jesus, Savior of men, both are good things but is still a distinction to be aware of.

A similar difference can be considered for how we read Scripture at times. We might be struck by certain words or phrases in a passage. They might even lead us to an epiphany of sorts (the feast we celebrate today), but we need to be careful how we put that understanding in the rest of the passage, or chapter, or book. If it wasn't meant that way, we might get a wrong interpretation of the greater passage, forcing our will and desires on the reading instead of being open to God's message to us. For example, the IHS being read as "Jesus, Savior of men" is fine by itself, but if that is imposed in a passage where it is meant to simply say "Jesus", we might be emphasizing the divinity of Christ at a place where it is meant to show his humanity. Since I'm not usually reading Scripture in the original Hebrew or Greek, this is always something to be aware of as we are struck by small passages, to recognize how they fit in the entirety of Scripture.

While we still have one more day of the Christmas season (we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord tomorrow and then ordinary time begins on Tuesday – a weird schedule this year) in the Church, I realize that most of our lives have gone back to our regular daily schedules. Like the words and smaller passages in Scripture that might have inspired us for the moment, hopefully we realize they were also not meant to stand by themselves, but are meant to be a part of all of our lives. The real celebration of Christmas does not mean that we only remember Christ on that day, or week, but it only truly makes sense if Christ is to be a part of every one of our days.

Happy New Year. This weekend we return from Christmas break and through the readings on this Epiphany Sunday we ponder where our star leads us.

In celebrating the Epiphany of the Lord, we celebrate the revelation that Jesus was born as the Son of God. Today's gospel illustrates this revelation through the story of the three wise men who traveled to visit Jesus following his birth.

They embarked on a journey of faith, following the star of Bethlehem until they reached the manger where Jesus laid. They brought gifts that symbolized their revelation of his divinity: gold, which associated Jesus as a king; Frankincense, which was often used in worship, and symbolized the holiness of Jesus; and myrrh, a perfume used for embalming, which symbolized that Christ would one day die for our sins.

We are reminded of how our group also follows a star, a star of new beginnings and where will their light shine?

As we start a new calendar year, it's a time of rejuvenation for many of us. A chance for a new beginning. A chance to discover new things and make our own revelations. As the wise men in today's gospel did, you too can continue to follow your faith throughout this year. The wise men had a revelation that the Son of God was coming, and they were not afraid to follow their hearts. Do not be afraid to follow your heart when you hear God's call.

Fr. Nick gave a talk on Holy Orders. Several team members talked about the Sacrament of Marriage and shared stories of how God is the center of their marriage.

We at Assumption are blessed to have two beautiful houses of worship! Our Modern and Spacious Church and our Historic Chapel.

Just like our own houses, God's houses require constant attention so they are comfortable, functional and look nice. We can do some of this work in-house, but the larger projects require outside contractors, especially for air conditioning, roofing, tuck-pointing, and electrical work.

Our chapel was constructed over 90 years ago. It is a sacred place, the site of numerous weddings, baptisms, funerals and other blessed events that integrate the history of our parish. Unfortunately, the chapel has maintenance challenges that are typical for a structure built in the 1930's.

If you would like to provide financial support to keep our chapel in good condition, here are two options for you to consider:

- 1. You can write a check directly to Assumption Church and include a note that it should be used for the upkeep of the chapel. As a restricted gift, the Parish Office can spend the money at any time, as long as it is used for the upkeep of the chapel.
- 2. You can make a contribution to the chapel's endowment fund at the Roman Catholic Foundation of Eastern Missouri (RCF). An endowment fund is similar to a permanent savings account. The principal stays in the account forever, but the income in the account can be used for the chapel. Contributions to the endowment do not go through the Assumption Parish Office, and the checks should not be made payable to Assumption. Instead, please contact Michael Weisbrod, RCF Senior Gift Planning Officer, at 314.918.2893 or *michael.weisbrod@rcfstl.org*. He will provide instructions for you.



Option 1 helps us address the immediate needs of the chapel, including utilities, maintenance and repairs.

Option 2 helps build up a source of investment income that can pay for the upkeep of the chapel in future years.

Whatever option you decide, we welcome and appreciate your support of God's historic house.

After the January 8th Epiphany 10am Mass, we invite all children to greet the "Wise Men" in the Narthex after Mass and receive a gift of a chocolate, a blessed Holy Family medal, and a holy card. We will have blessed chalk at each exit for you to take home for this blessing.

Epiphany Home Blessing

One interesting custom for Epiphany is for families to ask God's blessing on our own homes. The ritual calls for parents to mark, with blessed chalk, the main entrance door with the initials of the Magi and a code of the current year. This year's mark will be:

$$20 + C + M + B + 23$$

The numbers stand for the year in which the blessing is inscribed (2023). The letters stand for the names traditionally given the Magi who found the Christ Child: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They are also an abbreviation for the Latin blessing: Christus mansionem benedicat, or "Christ bless this dwelling."

Blessed chalk will be available after Masses the weekend of January 7/8. Gather your family at the main entrance to your home.

All make the sign of the cross.

Parent: "Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace.

Blessed be God forever."

Family: "Blessed be God forever"

Parent or reader: (reading from Sacred Scripture) "And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage." Matt 2:10-11

Parent imparts the blessing: "Lord God of heaven and earth, You revealed Your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill them with the light of Christ, that their concern for others may reflect Your love. We ask this though Christ, our Lord."

Family: "Amen"

Then the parent sprinkles holy water on those gathered and sprinkles it about the home.
