

“Do Whatever He tells You”

The beginning of Jesus’ signs at Cana in Galilee is a beautiful scene which reveals our intimacy with God, our devotion to Mary, Mary’s relationship to her son, the Son of God, and God’s great love for us poured out in Christ Jesus. We never learn the names of the bride and groom at the wedding reception. Instead, we meet Mary and Jesus, the Mother of the Church, the bride, and the Son of God, the groom. We are all gathered up into the mystery of the Sacrament of Marriage which is a sign of Christ’s love for us. The miracle of the changing of water into wine is a great sign; yet it is the encounter of Jesus with his Mother which points to the greater mystery.

This exchange between Mary and Jesus at the beginning of John’s Gospel is connected with their final exchange on Calvary, at the end of the Gospel. Mary approaches Jesus with her constant prayer for us, “They have no wine...”, they have no joy, they need your saving power right now. Jesus looks into her eyes and seemingly asks, “My hour has not yet come...” Both Jesus and Mary know by now that Jesus “Hour” is the hour of glory when God’s love will be revealed on the cross. Mary is commissioning Jesus for his true purpose; once he changes this water into wine, the journey to Calvary will begin. Mary is ready to let go of her son for us. Jesus is ready to offer his life for us. Once they exchange this knowing and this suffering, Mary turns to us and says, “Do Whatever he tells you.”

Then on Calvary, Jesus will look down from the cross and tell us, “Behold your Mother.” And he will say to his mother, “Behold your son...” We belong to Mary. She intercedes for us with her son. And Jesus has given his mother to us as our mother. At Cana Mary instructed us to do whatever he tells us; and from the cross Jesus tells us to behold our mother.

This is the Wedding Feast at Cana in Galilee, the second luminous mystery of the rosary. It is also the wedding feast of the lamb. God seeks us as groom seeks his bride. Just as Isaiah proclaimed, “as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you.” God really loves us that much; we are his delight, the very desire of God’s own heart. Let us follow Mary’s instruction, let us behold her as our mother and surrender ourselves to God’s loving embrace.

International Week of Prayer for Christian Unity January 18-25, 2019

“Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2019:
Justice, Only Justice, You Shall Pursue”

The theme of this year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is "Justice, Only Justice, You Shall Pursue." (*Deuteronomy 16:18-20*). According to **Graymoor Ecumenical & Interreligious Institute (GEII)**. . . , Christian communities "become newly aware of their unity as they join in a common concern and a common response to an unjust reality. At the same time, confronted by these injustices, we are obliged, as Christians, to examine the ways in which we are complicit. Only by heeding Jesus's prayer 'that they all may be one' can we witness to living unity in diversity. It is through our unity in Christ that we will be able to combat injustice and serve the needs of its victims." To purchase materials for your worship community for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, check out **GEII on the web**.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has a **history of over 100 years . . .**, in which Christians around the world have taken part in an octave of prayer for visible Christian unity. By annually observing the WPCU, Christians move toward the fulfillment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper "that they all may be one." (*cf. John 17:21*)

In preparation for the WPCU, ecumenical partners in a particular region were asked to prepare a basic text on a biblical theme. Then an international group organized through the World Council of Churches (WCC) and The Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity edited this **text**, which was jointly published by the **Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity**. . . and WCC, through their **Commission on Faith and Order**. . . . The WCC accompanied the entire production process of the text. The final material was sent to member churches and Roman Catholic dioceses, and they were invited to translate the text and contextualize it for their own use.





Martin Luther King Day – January 21, 2019



Martin Luther King Jr. was born in Atlanta, Georgia on January 15th, 1929. He was a pivotal advocate for African Americans during the Civil Rights Movement in the United States.


King experienced racism from an early age, and those events stayed with and eventually brought him to a life of activism. After graduating college with a doctorate degree in theology, King became a pastor in Alabama. He began a series of peaceful protests in the south that eventually changed many laws dealing with the equality of African Americans. King gave hundreds of moving speeches across the country, and in 1964 was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.

On April 4th, 1968, King was shot and killed while in Memphis, Tennessee. Although his life ended that day, the work that he had accomplished changed the nation. King is remembered not only for his commitment to the cause of equality for African Americans but also for his profound speeches that moved so many.

Some Martin Luther King’s Famous Quotes:

- “Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere.”
- “Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter.”
- “Free at last, Free at last, Thank God almighty we are free at last.”
- “The time is always right to do what is right.”
- “In the end, we will remember not the words of our enemies, but the silence of our friends.”
- “Life's most persistent and urgent question is, 'What are you doing for others?'”
- “The ultimate measure of a man is not where he stands in moments of comfort and convenience, but where he stands at times of challenge and controversy.”
- “We must learn to live together as brothers or perish together as fools.”
- “Faith is taking the first step even when you don't see the whole staircase.”
