

Hello,

Today is the 50th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision by which the Supreme Court allowed broad legal rights to women to have abortions in the United States. Last summer this decision was overturned, leaving state laws to set the primary legal restrictions on abortions. This has resulted in some states, like Missouri, where abortions are illegal for almost all situations. In other states there are almost no legal restrictions against having an abortion. This is still a legal concern that needs our attention to protect the rights of innocent lives, but it is even more obvious that we can't just look towards laws, but need to touch people's minds and hearts about abortion.

One of the challenges for people choosing to have an abortion is that it can be obvious the many impacts having a child will have on their lives. For some, it is not just their lives that they are thinking of, but other family members that may depend upon them, and even considering the future of their unborn child in some ways. Another challenge that they must realize is the fact that this child already is a human life. If they were holding that child in their arms and caring for them the way they would in the months after their birth, the thought of taking that child's life is obviously not a choice to be weighed. Until that child is born, it may be harder to realize the reality of the child's life versus the challenges that may come, but that doesn't change the fact that this is a living child.

It has become even easier to ignore that fact that an abortion is the ending of a human life by the fact that many, if not most, abortions are no longer described as surgical procedures. What is described as a medication abortion, or taking a pill to induce an abortion early in a pregnancy, can make it even more difficult to realize that this child that you have not seen is being killed. Pro-Life clinics often have ultrasound machines to help a mother recognize their child by seeing them in their womb. This isn't a trick, but a truth, to help a mother realize that they are already caring for their child, and recognize the real life and death repercussions of their actions.

No longer having the national legal decision to have a public demonstration to protest can make it harder to clearly see, rally behind, and quantify a goal, but it is still there. We believe that life starts at the moment of conception and so must be recognized and especially protected in this most vulnerable state. As the laws change as well as medical procedures, it doesn't excuse us from protecting these children, but it may change the ways we need to try. Remembering and praying for the millions who have lost their lives to abortion, may we continue to keep the incredible gift of life clear in our minds, and help one another to recognize the response that the life of an innocent child demands from us.

Stewardship Through Estate Planning

As the New Year begins, consider one of the greatest acts of stewardship an individual can make by establishing an estate plan. Everyone should have an estate plan comprising either a will or a trust. A will is a legal document that allows you to control how your assets are distributed after your lifetime. Without a will, the probate court will decide who acquires your assets upon your death. Typically, the court will divide your assets between your surviving spouse and children, or your blood relatives. The court will not provide for any charitable intentions you may have.

A trust allows you to control how your assets are distributed both dur-

ing and after your lifetime. Establishing a trust requires that you transfer ownership or title of your assets to the name of your trust. Since the trust owns the assets, there is nothing for the courts to control when you die. This is beneficial since, unlike a will, you avoid all the costs, delays and publicity of the probate process. However, depending on its complexity, a trust can be more expensive to create than a will.

Most importantly, an estate plan allows you to determine how and to whom the gifts God has bestowed on you will be distributed when you can no longer serve as your own steward.
