#### Anointing of the Sick – Celebrated at All Masses February 10-11

Through the sacrament of **Anointing of the Sick**, Christ strengthens those who are afflicted by illness, whether in body, soul or spirit, providing them with the strongest means of support. Jesus showed great concern for the bodily and spiritual welfare of the sick and commanded his followers to do the same. God did not promise that we would be cured of our illnesses, but God always provides a healing and forgiveness of sins. The celebration of this sacrament also provides an opportunity for the deepening of faith in the community – through the faith witnessed and devotion of those being anointed.

Symbols of this sacrament include the laying on of hands and the anointing with oil to the forehead and palms of both hands. The laying on of hands symbolizes the Spirit of God being called down - the very presence of the Lord putting his hands on our head. The oil is a sign that God 'has put his seal upon us and given the Spirit in our hearts'. Through the anointing, we are strengthened for what lies ahead.



# Assumption Lenten Series: Bishop Robert Barron's Lenten Gospel Reflections





# David the King

David the King Lenten Series - Tuesdays during Lent, Beginning Tuesday, Feb. 20th at 7:30pm, Hall C Bishop Barron helps us to understand this pivotal figure in-light of the first king and the King of kings.

His kingship recalls that of Adam in the Garden of Eden, and yet it points toward the King par excellence, Jesus Christ. Adam was the first king and steward of the rightly ordered Garden of Eden. He was called to govern the garden according to God's mind and purpose, but by allowing negative influences to wreak havoc on Eden, he did not fulfill his kingly responsibility. Long after Adam, David emerged as the definitive king who would restore order in the Garden and bring the world under the lordship of God. But like Adam, David fell, and his reign ushered in a succession of compromised kings and rejected prophets. The New Testament, however, foretold a son of David who would realize the fullness of Israelite kingship...but whose actual reign defied expectation. King David causes us to look back toward Adam's kingship and forward toward Christ the King, seeing Christ as the fulfillment of the Davidic line and the realization of the Kingdom of God on earth. In David the King, Bishop Barron helps us to understand this pivotal figure in-light of the first king and the King of kings.

#### February 4, 2018 Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time

IB 7: 1-4, 6-7; PS 147: 1-6; 1 COR 9: 16-19, 22-23; MK 1: 29-

The fact that today's Gospel from Mark makes reference to Jesus curing Peter's mother-in-law would seem to point to the fact that Peter was married. However, the majority of scholars are of the opinion that the wife may have died before Peter was called by Jesus as an Apostle. In fact, there are many misconceptions about St. Peter. For one, although often portrayed as much older, he was probably younger than Jesus. In fact all 12 Apostles were most likely younger than Jesus.



Also, Peter is often presented in paintings and movies and books as being a very old man, but historians have also concluded that Peter was martyred in Rome when he was about 66 years old. He was never the old, old man in his 80's we see quite often.

All of that is secondary to a simple statement in today's Gospel about the mother-in-law. Specifically, St. Mark writes, "He (Jesus) approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them." St. Matthew reveals this same fact in his Gospel (Matthew 8:15), and he writes, "He (Jesus) touched her hand and the fever left her, and she got up and began to serve him."

The message for us is very basic. Peter's mother-in-law responded to Jesus the same way we should when Jesus blesses us. She responded to the Lord and immediately served Him out of gratitude. That should be our motivation, and action, as well.

#### Stewardship: Joy to the World!

Betty and Kevin a Saint Vincent DePaul neighbor in need, were checking their Christmas gifts they received from the Giving tree program at Assumption of BVM. The gift for their son did not look right; it was a pair of women's shoes. Betty called the Saint Vincent DePaul helpline to tell them that they had received one gift obviously meant for someone else. She was concerned that someone was not going to get shoes they needed for Christmas, rather than being concerned that her son hadn't received his gift.

When the SVdP caseworker team was looking at the information they had on record to get the family's address, they found out that the father took 17 different medications for chronic illness, many of them very expensive. This was part of the family's large financial burden. When the SVdP caseworker team delivered a gift card to them as a substitute for the women's shoes, they also took a SVdP prescription drug program form, which provides a list of free drugs that are available & gave it to them. Betty burst into tears when she found that no fewer than 12 Rxs taken by her husband Kevin, were on the form, with one of the drugs being too expensive for the family to pay for. Betty called the caseworkers her "Christmas angels" and the caseworkers felt they were led by the Holy Spirit to discover that the family had such a large need for prescriptions before driving to their home.

The shoes were delivered to the proper family and the SVdP team felt it was by far their most gratifying Christmas moment, impacting the people we helped at Christmas.

Let's all pray for the strength and courage to discover our charisms, use them in the way God intended and become the Joyful people God intended.
