Hello,

This coming week we celebrate the feast of St. Paul Miki and Companions, who were martyred for their faith in Nagasaki Japan in 1597. Paul was a Jesuit who was martyred with other Jesuits, Franciscans, and laymen by some who attempted to erase Christianity from Japan. When missionaries returned to Japan in the 1860's they would find thousands of Christians who had continued the faith despite this persecution. A few year ago, in 2016, a movie was released called "Silence". It is based on a historical fiction novel set in the 1630's when two Portuguese Jesuit's are trying to find their mentor who is still in Japan and is rumored to have denied his faith to avoid torture. Like most films, especially major Hollywood productions, we might disagree with some aspects of how people would or did act, but this movie does provide many serious challenges people have faced that can give an even greater appreciation of the life of some real martyrs.

As this might show you, I do like movies. Since the weather isn't exactly conducive to many outdoor activities at this time of year I thought I might mention a few others that I've enjoyed over the years that can also make us reflect on our faith.

"The Mission", another film about Jesuit missionaries, but this time in South America. This film was released in 1986 and set in the 1750's. It portrays some of the challenges facing missionaries in the New World. The challenges are not only due to difficulties in presenting the faith to indigenous cultures, but also recognizes many conflicts that the Europeans are bringing with them and imposing on the natives. The main character is loosely based on a real person, St. Roque Gonzalez de Santa Cruz, but again is best considered historical fiction. Not only a thought provoking movie but also award winning for the spectacular scenery and settings.

"Romero", the film about Archbishop (now saint) Oscar Romero in El Salvador in the late 1970's to his death in 1980 starring Raul Julia. A true story that shows again how different people reacted in extreme situations and how their faith and morals conflicted and battle with their fears in their decisions on what they will do. An opportunity for any of us to think about how we would act.

"The Way", a film about a man (played by Martin Sheen) whose son (played by Emilio Estevez) has just died in an accident when starting to walk "The Way of St. James" from France into Spain. The man decides to take up the journey himself and eventually appreciates the journey for more than just getting to the end of it. Actually not a bad reflection as we are soon to embark on our Lenten journey.

I'll end this selection with a more critically acclaimed movie from years ago, "Chariots of Fire". Sport movies are usually pretty good at showing determination and sacrifice for a goal. This one demonstrates the various motivations of numerous people, class struggles, religious integrity, social pressures, and also a very entertaining and well made movie. (I would hope that I am not the only one who can still immediately remember the theme music.)

Another good thing about movies is that I think it can give us an opportunity not only to reflect ourselves, but hopefully to also discuss these thoughts, these feelings, and these beliefs with one another.
