

The Church Needs Your Faith

When I encountered the scriptures this week, I was convicted. I am haunted by Jesus' litany of images, all leading up to the indictment: "you hypocrite!" I believe Jesus is challenging each one of us to live in the light, to become aware of how frequently we visit our woundedness when we think we see it so plainly in others; it is much easier to point our finger at another in frustration than to be honest about the pain I caused within myself and others by my own soul sickness. I could not shake this sadness; so I am going to share it with you, hoping you will bring the medicine which is needed for healing.

By the grace of Holy Orders, the Church announces the Pope, our Holy Father, Francis, as the Vicar of Christ on earth. The Holy Father appoints Bishops in every corner of the world to be extensions of his ministry, as Good Shepherds leading all God's children to Christ. The Bishops, in every corner of the world, then ordain priests to be extensions of the Bishops themselves among all the faithful. The priest is asked to represent Christ in the Assembly; the Sacrament of Holy Orders actually reveals an ontological change in the man being ordained. And so, the Church is richly blessed by this mystery of the Vicar of Christ connected intimately with all the clergy throughout the world, a true brotherhood which runs more deeply within us than any other bond in the world. It is a shared priesthood in Jesus Christ. It is heartening to see how this beautiful Sacrament of Holy Orders can truly bring life and joy to the Church, except when it doesn't.

The abuse of children by clergy through the centuries, and especially in the last sixty years, is evidence of a deeper illness which must be healed in our Church. This week I am struggling to see (can I even see it all?) my brothers in any other way than this: we, the Clergy, are the blind leading the blind and I believe we have fallen into a pit. The fruit born of the brotherhood of priests is not all good these days. The plank in our collective eye is so large we are scrambling to remove splinters wherever we can find them in anyone else's eye. We are lost and we need your help. The branch which is the Catholic Clergy has deep roots; I will continue to pray to God we are able to be healed, that we are not rotten to the core. We definitely need to be pruned and we cannot prune ourselves. We need to allow the Holy Spirit to provide us with the ability to see. To see you, God's people, pulling the plank out of our eyes and lifting us out of the pit. It is through your guidance we will remember who we are and our calling to be good shepherds. People inside and outside of the Church, clergy and lay, have already picked up axes and begun swinging wildly. That is not helpful. Meanwhile, the very barren branches of the tree of an all male clergy are trying to prune the tree; it is like a well-intentioned surgeon trying to perform surgery on himself.

The Church needs your faith now more than perhaps ever before. The Gospel of Jesus Christ is true. Jesus is risen as He said. The Eucharist is true food unto eternal life. Each one of you, in virtue of your baptism, is capable of bringing the healing power of Christ to the world. Please pray for Pope Francis. Pray that the wisdom and love of the lay faithful will be given a real opportunity to work in these difficult times. The deep root of faithfulness that is grounded in Peter's confession of faith can yet be a tremendous healing in the life of the church, indeed a wellspring of Sacramental Life. Yet there is another root which has accompanied us through the centuries, a root so entangled in sin that it cannot be easily removed. Your hearts carry the medicine for healing; your hands can wield the sword of God's Word and set us free. Together, then; truly together then, we can continue this great commission to make disciples of all the nations.

Please pray also for me, for Msgr. McCumber and for Fr. Nord, that we persevere in this priestly ministry which is ours in Christ. Mary is the first Disciple; she is the first Apostle; she is our Mother; she will lead you in this great work. For my part I will seek ways to yield to your love, to your wisdom and to your faith in Jesus Christ. It is the fire of your love which will become the light of the world. It has always been so. God bless you.

March 3, 2019 — Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

SIR 27: 4-7; PS 92: 2-3, 13-16; 1 COR 15: 54-58; LK 6: 39-45

Today's readings exhort us Christian disciples to form ourselves — mind and heart — in imitation of Christ so we can better reflect His goodness in our daily lives.

The first reading from Sirach offers timeless counsel: "*the fruit of a tree shows the care it has had: so too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind. Praise no one before he speaks.*" Jesus uses the very same analogy in today's Gospel reading from Luke: "*A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit.*"

Everything we have is a gift from God to be used for His honor and glory. This includes the gift of speech and, even more broadly, all forms of modern-day communication — email, text, Twitter, Facebook and the rest. What comes forth from our mouths, or keyboard, or phone, is a reflection of what is in our minds and hearts. Our ability to communicate with each other is itself a gift which we must steward well.

In the same Gospel passage, Jesus reminds us, "*No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher.*" The more time we spend with Jesus, our teacher, through regular prayer and a strong sacramental life, the more we will become like Him. Then all that we do and say (and tweet and post) will bring others closer to Him. This is the life's work of the Christian steward. It is privileged work indeed.





Special Prayer Intentions

Would you like prayers for a special intention throughout the Women's up-coming "Christ Renews His Parish" retreat next weekend – March 9/10? Please find in the back of the church boxes marked "Prayer Intentions" for you to make your intention...and please know that your intention will be earnestly prayed for throughout the Women's retreat weekend. If you would like your intention to remain anonymous please simply don't use any names.



This weekend the RCIA team met with each individual to explore the direction in which their faith journey is leading them. God is definitely in charge of these individuals. We have witnessed their conversion and pray that you, too, will continue praying for us. Starting with Ash Wednesday we begin our Lenten journey and The Purification and Enlightenment period.

Those not baptized will now be called The Elect. In the coming weeks we will spend more time on spiritual reflection. This is a time that we invite the whole community to walk our journey with us. We will focus on those things that we need to "fix" in our life. This is a time of spiritual renewal, conversion and inner reflections. During this period the Catechumens (The Elect) and Candidates undertake a number of Rites, including the Rite of Sending/Election, Scrutiny's and Presentations.

They look to the Church to help them deepen their commitments and purify their hearts. Next weekend we will distribute prayer cards at all masses. Each man, woman and child are invited to take a card and journey with them through your prayers to the Easter Vigil. As a family, have your children draw pictures for them. We need these returned by April 7th. There will be a box in the Narthex marked RCIA Prayer Cards.

Next weekend we celebrate the Rite of Sending at all masses. So what does this mean? "Before the Rite of Election is celebrated, the catechumens are expected to have undergone a conversion of mind and action and to have developed a sufficient acquaintance with Christian teaching as well as a spirit of faith and charity" [RCIA 120].

The Rite of Election formally concludes this part of their journey and begins a new period. In the afternoon, these men, women and sponsors celebrate the Rite of Election at the Cathedral with the Bishop. God is choosing those, who are able, to be disciples of Jesus. Those chosen are expected to be initiated into a life in Christ, The godparents present their testimony to the Bishop that these men and women are ready to continue their journey to receive sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Their names are presented and accepted by the bishop.

We also have witnessed these men and women each Sunday and we also support their readiness to enter into a more spiritual journey to the Easter Vigil.

Please continue to pray for our men and women and our community!
