



Hello,

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday and begin Holy Week. A very different way to celebrate it then we are used to, celebrating the services without a congregation or only being



We have received particular instructions in some of the modifications we will need to make to celebrate these services without a congregation, adapting to our situation. I would recommend that maybe you consider this for your homes too. As decorations and celebrations in church are always more somber and simple during Lent that gives even greater emphasis on the joy and celebration come Easter, maybe there are ways to do this also in your homes during Holy Week.

Maybe for each of the Triduum celebrations you may have a different piece of art or decoration that can be placed where you watch the services to bring greater emphasis on the Last Supper, the Crucifixion, or the Resurrection from the tomb. Or possibly just in the manner of the clothes you wear. At home alone, or even just with family we might dress differently than we would if we were going to church. But hopefully the reason we dress differently for church isn't to impress others, but rather to give honor to God and an outward reminder to ourselves also of how special this celebration is. One of the changes we are doing this year due to the live-streaming and the inability to have people come to the service is that we will celebrate the Good Friday service at 3pm instead of at 7pm in the evening. 3pm is the preferred hour, as we know it is closer to the hour of Christ's death, but since in our current society many have to work and cannot make the service in the afternoon it has been commonly celebrated in the evening. This year we realize many more will not be at work than would usually be the case due to shutdowns, but also the recording of the service will be on-line for those who couldn't participate at 3pm to view when they can.

Our Lenten Season took an undeniably drastic turn this year, but let us always remember, especially when we are most in need, that God is there for us. May your Holy Week be the preparation you need at this time to know and be open to the special blessings God has for each of us. Peace,


From the Principal's Pen Some Creative Fun while Staying Home


