Hello,

This Friday, May 1st, is the feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Honoring St. Joseph has existed throughout the history of the Church, with March 19th having over a 500-year history as a feast day for St. Joseph with it currently being identified as the Feast of St. Joseph, Spouse of Mary. May 1st we might think more about Mary and have a May Crowning celebration, which are not bad to do, but I thought I would give Joseph a little boost to get this feast day that has only existed since 1955 a little more attention. I don't think Mary will begrudge Joseph this attention.

May 1st was picked by Pope Pius XII for a special reason, in response to "May Day" celebrations for workers as a communist or socialist celebration. I remember growing up during the Cold War and the May Day Parade pictures from the Soviet Union with large military parades with soldiers, weapons, tanks, and missiles. Actually the origins of May Day really goes back to Chicago in 1886 and the fight for an eight hour work day, but the important point for us and what Pope Pius XII was trying to emphasize is what is the proper way to look at our work, and St. Joseph was a good way to do this.

Joseph is identified in the Gospels as a carpenter. This is an occupation where you are building things, from furniture to houses. It is very easy to see the value provided by this occupation that is useful to people in their daily lives. Most consider that this would have put his family in what today we would call a fairly common socio-economic bracket. Not the richest people, but usually able to get work and to provide for themselves and their family. That is another title that goes with Joseph and also with the title of "worker", "provider".

Work itself can be good if it is a participating with and caring for God's creation. But it is also a means of providing for oneself and one's family. Joseph, as the husband of Mary, adopted father of Jesus, protector of the Holy Family, would also provide for their well-being and the material goods they need to survive. This is a basic part of who we are as human beings, that we need food and shelter and clothing that are secured through work and trade. Recognizing Joseph in this light hopefully helps us see the appropriate way in which it is also a part of our lives. Work is not something that is to be considered beneath us, but rather a way in which we, like Joseph, are obedient to God. Accepting responsibilities that he entrusts to us, helping to participate in God's plan for all of us.

This year is a little different as we look at work. With many unemployed due to COVID-19 giving us a greater appreciation for the gift of being able to work. If our work schedule is disrupted, hopefully we might be taking the opportunity to see what other works we may do. I think many of us have the opportunity to appreciate workers in different professions and realize how much we rely upon them. As we celebrate the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker, let us be grateful for our opportunities to work as well as the work of others. Let us recognize the dignity of work in all of our lives through the reminder of St. Joseph.

At this time we do not know when we'll be able to initiate the elect, and we've missed celebrating several important rites with them in preparation for their baptism. How do we determine a schedule for celebrating initiation that is pastoral, complete, and rich in the baptismal rites while honoring the needs of the elect, the community, and the liturgical calendar? There are so many uncertainties these days but one thing for sure, God has this. Each week we video-conference with the elect, catechumens, candidates, sponsors, and catechists. Even if a participant lacks a computer with a camera, it is possible to participate via the camera on a cell phone or via call in so that there is audio if not video. One way or other we work at involving everyone. Last Sunday we invited everyone to watch the live stream Mass at 10:00am, and then join us afterwards to share where we are, how we are doing, and what is one thing that stands out to us during the pandemic. We will continue to video chat each week until such time we can all be together as one again in Church. Could we ask a favor? 

I am so proud of our faculty that have taken on such a huge challenge this year with teaching through e-learning, but just as proud of our parents (grandparents, and other family members) who took on the challenge of working with their children, while they, too, were working from home. Bravo, to all of you that helped! We are still planning on having First Communion, Graduation and Awards Ceremony, and Confirmation. The Archbishop is asking that all Confirmation be handled through each parish, with the Pastor standing in for a Bishop. Although, no definite dates are set, we would love to have graduation and Confirmation on Pentecost weekend; First Communion on Corpus Christi (June 14). Those feast days seem perfect for these important celebrations.


It goes without saying how sad it has been that our 8th graders, in particular, have not had a normal end of year. Other students as well! However, we are wanting to have some closure - as a school community - and are planning to have a special day for all involved. The actual date hasn't been set, due to the current state directives, but general planning is underway for what we will call a "FIELD DAY". Our planning for that day would include an All-School Student/Parent Mass - hoping to get the Music Ministry to play, then a school parade (with 8th graders in their decorated truck), then the "Field Day" activities/events for all students, then a PTO sponsored Bar-b-que for families on the field - picnic blankets, folding chairs, families bring your own drinks- with our music playing during lunch. Let's pray that we can do this before the end of June!

How do we continue learning through the summer, when our learning process was so different from March through May? Well, we are offering all families access to purchase Math Summer Solutions, which provide math practice opportunities. Many teachers will encourage summer reading through local libraries and upon return to school, will give certificates to students that read a certain number of books. We want all students to continue learning throughout the summer to benefit them.

Our plan is to begin our school year in August with great plans forward. We missed out on our Grandparent /Favorite Adult Day festivities, our original field day, field trips, and several other events that give our students a well-rounded education, so getting back to normal will be wonderful.

Third Sunday of Easter – April 26

ACTS 2:14, 22-33; PS 16:1-2, 5, 7-11; 1 PT 1:17-21; LK 24:13-35

Today’s readings focus on a theme of “sojourning.” As Christian stewards, we know our lives are a sojourn towards the ultimate destination of heaven.

Our Gospel passage today describes the sojourn of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. The two are dejected and despondent after Jesus’ death. They knew Jesus personally. They had heard the Gospel message directly from His lips. They heard the testimony of the women who discovered the empty tomb of our Lord and saw a vision of angels announcing He was alive. They had been informed by other disciples who went to the tomb that all was exactly as the women reported.


How much more obvious could the Good News be?

And yet, at times, the reaction of the two disciples describes our own stewardship journey, doesn’t it? We have the fullness of the Catholic faith, the power of the sacraments, the support of our parish family. Yet, we often lose our way. We fail to see all the gifts we have been given. We lack trust in the perfect goodness and almighty power of God.

But notice what happens to the two men when eyes are opened once again and they recognize Jesus in the Eucharist — the “*breaking of the bread.*” They are transformed! Their hearts are set on fire with love for the Lord and their faith. They recall that their hearts began “*burning within*” as the Lord was explaining the Scriptures to them. When we find we have lost our way, we can go to the same sources as the two disciples on the road to Emmaus — the Scriptures and the Eucharist.

In this Easter season, resolve to feast deeply on these two sources of grace. They are the fuel that will propel us on journey towards heaven.
