Hello,

With people starting to talk about re-opening up businesses and other things, with restrictions of course, it can be easy to start just looking forward. But I just got a phone call that also thought we need to be telling people about some of the things we have been doing and still be aware of where we are at today.

The first thing is our primary means of communication right now is probably our e-mail blasts. This was in place from before I came here last summer but has been our main way of communicating with parishioners at this time. Since we cannot celebrate Mass together, we have been posting daily reflections that are sent out, usually related to the Mass of the day, and a few (mostly by Fr. Patrick) of video reflections. Then at least weekly we have been also sending out other information about what is going on in the parish, from the beginning of this period telling people about what we were doing as restrictions began, to hopefully being able to send out more positive notices in the future as we can start lifting some restrictions. If you haven't signed up yet you can sign up for these e-mails on our webpage where there is a button to click that says "Sign up for our e-mail blasts". Others can visit our website or Facebook page but the blasts are the easiest ways for us to get ahold of you as a group.

We realize that some people do not have e-mail or access to the internet and we have tried to get in contact with them by sorting through our parishioner lists by age and calling those over 70 years old.

As a parish we were fortunate that we already had been live-streaming our 10am Sunday Masses, which we have continued to do through this period. Our viewership has increased a little. Prior to the coronavirus concerns and restrictions, we had about 30-70 'loads' (clicked our portal to watch the service) per Sunday. Since we have not been able to have public Masses, we have had over 2000 'loads' each Sunday with around 1000 for each of the three Triduum services during Holy Week. And with this viewership, I have to believe that the slides we run before Mass have been another way that we have been able to inform parishioners.

Towards the end of Lent we also had available the Stations of the Cross to pray together on-line with as I walked around our chapel. This weekend, since our school and PSR are unable to celebrate the May Crowning of Mary, we are having a 'Drive thru Rosary' that will be set-up to pray as you drive through our parking lot or you can pray along with on-line with clergy, teachers, staff and children of the parish.

Our parish prayer teams have also set up a means by which, while they cannot pray with you in person, they will pray with you over the phone. A prayer team member will call you at the time you desire to pray with you.

If you can go to our website, we have set-up a 'Covid-19' button on our tool bar that will take you to numerous different services as described above and others. If you cannot, you can always call us at the parish (636) 240-3721 and let us know if you have other ideas of ways we can continue to serve God and one another as Assumption Parish.

RCIA

Last Sunday we watched our live stream Mass at 10:00 am followed with a Zoom meeting of our group and sponsors. Typical with our outline of meetings we pondered Sunday's Gospel by discussing these questions:

1. Cleopas and his friend (wife?) were unable to recognize Jesus when he joined them. Have you had any experiences that were recognized as blessings only later?
2. Cleopas and friend recognized Jesus when he blessed the bread, broke it and gave it to them. Will the Eucharist, Holy Communion, be a sign of Jesus' presence to you, too? Will you recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread?"
3. Afterwards Cleopas and friend realized that they had been somehow deeply affected by Jesus' speaking to them: "were not our hearts burning within us?" Looking back at the RCIA experience, what has influenced you most?
4. In many places in the Christian world, people go on Emmaus walks during which they meditate and discuss on how they could be encountering Jesus during this time. Has there been an experience during the Lent-Easter season, when you have met the Divine? Or have felt you have understood more about God? Will you urge Jesus to "stay with us? Will you be willing to recount for others your encounter with Jesus?"

Previously, one of our team members suggested to the group a free program on the Eucharist. It consists of six 30 minute sessions. It is available at stpaulcenter.com, The Quarantined Catholic Hub. It is called the Eucharist in Scriptures.

Fourth Sunday of Easter – May 3, 2020 ACTS 2:14A, 36-41; PS 23:1-3A, 3B4-6; 1 PT 2:20B-25; JN 10:1-10

Today's readings on this fourth Sunday of Easter offer us a glimpse into the heart of our loving Savior. He is the Good Shepherd and we can confidently place our trust in Him as we live the stewardship way of life.

This endearing image of Jesus as shepherd, and His personal love for each one of us, is described in our Gospel passage from John, through the words of Jesus Himself. Here we read Jesus' description of Himself as the "Good Shepherd." He says of Himself, *"The sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice."*

This aspect of our Lord's tender and personal love for each one of us is a compelling reason to embrace the stewardship way of life — in the offering of our time, talent and treasure to Him, we can express our gratitude to Him for the incomprehensible love He has for us.

Embracing this way of life certainly requires trust on our part. But Christ has proven Himself worthy of our trust. He "bore our sins in His body." He calls Himself our shepherd and He offers Himself as the guardian of our souls. He has withheld nothing of Himself and His goodness from us. He would never ask anything of us that would bring us harm. He tells us *"I came so that [you] might have life and have it more abundantly."*

This Easter season, let us resolve to entrust ourselves and our lives gratefully to Him.

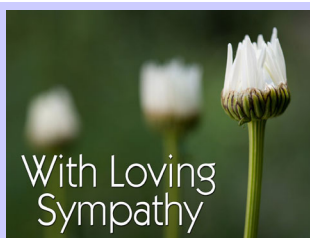

Our Saint Vincent DePaul Society is still out there serving our community! They are still visiting those in need, only practicing social distancing! They are making sure that those who are in need of food and supplies receive what they need. Speaking of the need – here is a list of items needed to fill the pantry. The donation cart is located in the Chapel vestibule. If you can bring supplies, the Chapel is still available 24/7 via the North side ramp entrance:

Applesauce, spaghetti and sauce, jelly, pancake mix and syrup, sloppy joe mix, canned fruits, shampoo & conditioner, deodorant, large tubes of toothpaste, razors, cleaning supplies, TP, Kleenex, dishwashing liquid, laundry detergent, gift certificates.

Outreach Phone Calls:

Several of our parishioners made over 300 phone calls to our older parishioners of our parish to make sure that they had what they needed – groceries, prescriptions, etc. Some of them took us up on the offer of shopping for them but the majority had family helping them or were fine on their own. Here were some comments that we received because of our outreach:

"Thank you for arranging Jason to grocery shop for me. He did an outstanding job and actually exceeded my expectations. I really appreciate the kindness shown to me during this hard time."

"Assumption parish will always have a special place in my heart because of the kindness of people like you. Thank you for calling and checking in on me and husband."

"A parishioner came to my house to help me with my computer so that I could get online, I'm not so good at these types of things. Now I can see our wonderful priests at Mass."

Bible Studies/CRHP Teams:

Many of you may be doing this yourself and that is wonderful!! We have one of our Men's Bible Study groups meeting on a weekly basis through "Zoom" 12 of them to be exact reflecting on the upcoming weekend's scriptures. Our CRHP teams are still in formation preparing themselves to give retreats this coming Fall for YOU!!

Parish families are gathering together by way of Zoom and praying the rosary together on a weekly basis for an end to this pandemic so that we can all be together again!

Prayer Team Ministry:

Our Prayer Team ministry has begun taking their prayer ministry to a whole new level as well!! They started taking prayers via email since we can't gather in church and prayer over you in person... they started an email so that you can email your prayer requests to them or that they can call you or video chat with you so that your prayers can get heard and prayed for!!

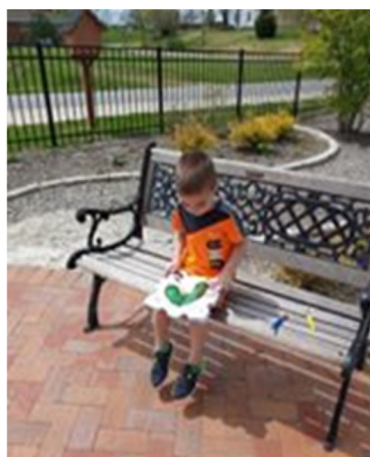
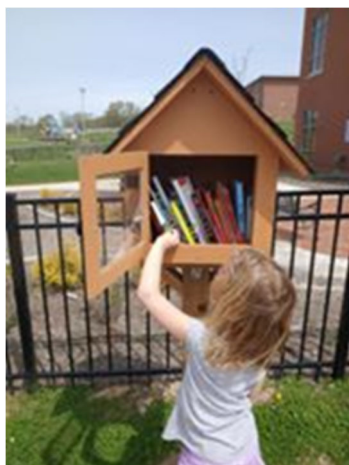


From the Principal's Pen
