“?Que es amor?,”

Nineteen. Nineteen times the word “love” is proclaimed in our scriptures this Sunday. We are beloved and God is love. And yet God’s love eludes us. How can this be?

A social worker tells the story of her ministry with a homeless shelter where all the residents have been abused, many of them by the very people who were most responsible for confirming God’s unconditional love flowing into the hearts of all God’s children, through the hearts of the faithful. A six year old girl who should have known only love her whole life, yet had known nothing of love, approached and asked, in Spanish, “?Que es amor?,” “what is love?” Telling that child nineteen times that God is love would not make a difference. Only an act of love can bring the healing needed to be the answer. We recognize the tragedy of a child living without love; our hearts are so ready to love her, to find a way to bring healing and peace. And then, there is us. What have we known of love? Given the circumstances and the difficulties of the work of becoming human in this troubled world of ours, I suspect all of us could use another ounce of trust, another sign of hope, another glimpse of faith, another gift of unconditional love.

Maria Montessori understood that our lives are grounded in God, therefore grounded in love. The human person is created only for love, ready at all times to receive unconditional love. She said, “Is it not a characteristic of love, that sensibility that enables a child to see what others do not see? That collects details that others do not perceive, and appreciates special qualities, which are, as it were, hidden, and which only love can discover? It is because the child’s intelligence assimilates by loving, and not just indifferently, that he can see the invisible. This active, ardent, meticulous, constant absorption in love is characteristic of children.” Jesus has taught us we must be like little children if we are to inherit the kingdom of God. In the sacrament of Baptism we trust our new birth into Christ. Our whole life is a longing for what was clear in us from the beginning, we are God’s beloved.



Jesus invites us to trust God’s love, not just one of nineteen words in the scriptures; God’s love is poured out in Christ Jesus who suffered, died and was raised from the dead. We have the capacity to remember this first love. We can help each other reveal God’s love in the world. We can practice loving. Like Peter, we can open our hearts to people who are different from us. Like John, we can extend this love of God to one another. And we can respond to Jesus’ invitation to friendship. Each day, let us choose love. Together, in love, let us bring Christ to the world.




Assumption Fall Festival Team Needs YOU!!

Since Easter our neophytes have met several times with team members to share their experience of "new life" Neophyte : One who is initiated at the Easter Vigil. The term comes from the Greek word meaning new plant, as in a new sprout on a limb/branch. (The Evangelization Station RCIA Glossary of terms) At Sunday 8:00 Mass the neophytes gather with the faithful and take their rightful place in the Eucharistic assembly. The readings from the Lectionary which are proclaimed at these Masses are specially geared to reflecting on the relationship between the sacraments and the Christian life which the newly initiated have embraced

This is an important period of reflection by the newly initiated with their parish community. The formation and teaching continues during this time, in order to help them become incorporated into the full life of the Christian community. This period is called Mystagogy and concludes at Pentecost.

It is important to note that this stage may be the end or final stage of the RCIA process, but it is only the first stage of the rest of their lives as a fully active and participating member of the Catholic Church.

Mystagogy means getting into mystery. Who reads mysteries? What is the plot?

The task of this period is simply to help us cultivate what has already been planted. You can't do this by simply going out the doors on Holy Saturday night and go on your way. Conversion does not end with the initiation but keeps on going.

They, as well as our community, have been renewed in mind, tasted more deeply the sweetness of God's word, received the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, and grown to know the goodness of the Lord. Unfolding the meaning of these sacraments leads to a deeper understanding and reverence for the mystery of God in Christ, the mystery into which we all are baptized.

No matter how often or how deeply we explore the mystery its fullness is never exhausted. We continue to thank the Assumption parish community for your prayers and guidance during our process. You have truly walked with them on their journey to new life in Christ!

St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry needs You!



St. Therese of Lisieux was only a teenager when she entered the convent. Like many young people, she was unsure of her talents and how she should serve God and others. All around her were nuns who had special abilities or were strong leaders. She wondered what her special gift was.

In prayer, she came upon this passage from Paul's letter to the Corinthians: "Set your desires on the greater gifts. And I will now show you the way which surpasses all others ... If I have not love, then I am nothing." (1 Cor 12:31-13:3). She came to realize that love was her special calling.

In her autobiography, "The Story of a Soul," she writes:

"Then, nearly ecstatic with the supreme joy in my soul, I proclaimed: O Jesus, my love, at last I have found my calling: my calling is love. Certainly I have found my proper place in the Church, and you gave me that very place, my God. In the heart of the Church, my mother, I will be love ..."

Ma y 6, 2018 - Sixth Sunday of Easter

ACTS 10: 25-26, 34-35, 44-48; PS 98: 1-4; 1 JN 4: 7-10; JN 15: 9-17

The First Reading from Acts begins with Cornelius falling at Peter’s feet. Peter lifts him up and says, *“In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him.”*



Cornelius was likely the inspiration for that statement. St. Cornelius is a significant person in the Acts of the Apostles. A documented centurion in the *Cohors Italia*, he is considered by most Bible researchers as being one of the first Gentiles converted to Christianity.

The message, however, applies to all of us, as most of us are indeed Gentiles. It is made clear that Cornelius was a holy and generous man. However, he did not receive the Holy Spirit until he had heard the Gospel from Peter and responded to it. That is what each of us is called to do as well. If we allow the Lord to be an important part of our lives, God will do everything for those who are willing to receive Him.

This reading then reports, *“While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word.”* St. Peter is later criticized for entering the house of a Gentile, eating, and then baptizing Cornelius, but in Acts 11 Peter responds, *“If then God gave them the same gift he gave to us when we came to believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I to be able to hinder God?”* God is there for all of us, but we must receive Him and open our lives to Him. *Excerpts from: Catholic Diocese of Wichita*
