## The Ascension

Jesus ascends; he is taken up into heaven. He is not taken away from us; he has promised to always be with us. Jesus' ascension into heaven brings heaven to earth. In the power of the Spirit dwelling within us, the very Spirit of God, we have access to eternal life now. Let us choose to live in this power of Christ in us. Let us follow Mary in her mission to bring Christ to the world.

I hope you enjoy this ancient homily; ancient and true.

#### From the treatise On the Trinity by Didymus of Alexandria

The Holy Spirit renews us in baptism through his godhead, which he shares with the Father and the Son. Finding us in a state of deformity, the Spirit restores our original beauty and fills us with his grace, leaving no room for anything unworthy of our love. The Spirit frees us from sin and death, and changes us from the earthly men we were, men of dust and ashes, into spiritual men, sharers in the divine glory, sons and heirs of God the Father who bear a likeness to the Son and are his co-heirs and brothers, destined to reign with him and to share his glory. In place of earth the Spirit reopens heaven to us and gladly admits us into paradise, giving us even now greater honour than the angels, and by the holy waters of baptism extinguishing the unquenchable fires of hell.

We men are conceived twice: to the human body we owe our first conception, to the divine Spirit, our second. John says: To all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God. These were born not by human generation, not by the desire of the flesh, not by the will of man, but of God. All who believed in Christ, he says, received power to become children of God, that is, of the Holy Spirit, and to gain kinship with God. To show that their parent was God the Holy Spirit, he adds these words of Christ: I give

you this solemn warning, that without being born of water and the Spirit, no one can enter the kingdom of God.

Visibly, through the ministry of priests, the font gives symbolic birth to our visible bodies. Invisibly, through the ministry of angels, the Spirit of God, whom even the mind's eye cannot see, baptizes into himself both our souls and bodies, giving them a new birth.

Speaking quite literally, and also in harmony with the words of water and the Spirit, John the Baptist says of Christ: He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. Since we are only vessels of clay, we must first be cleansed in water and then hardened by spiritual fire – for God is a consuming fire. We need the Holy Spirit to perfect and renew us, for spiritual fire can cleanse us, and spiritual water can recast us as in a furnace and make us into new men.



Next weekend we will send our new disciples out into the world with a special blessing at the 8:00 Mass.





#### THE MEANING OF PENTECOST

This is one of the most amazing stories in the world. There is none which should be more interesting to Christian people, for it is the story of the launch of the Christian Church. It is the story of how the Church which had been slowly shaping in the quietness and obscurity of that Upper Room became aware of life and power... and set out upon its mission.

So far, these men and women have been rather ordinary people, their love for Jesus Christ the one thing keeping them together. They were perplexed, terribly timid, and very aware of their weaknesses. Then, as they waited, all of a sudden as it seemed, something happened which changed their personalities. They became aware of a unity which broke down every other barrier. They found themselves in possession of faculties they had never dreamed could be theirs. They lost all fear of people and all thought of themselves. They were *fired with a message*, and a passion to tell people about it, to *spread the good news* of a love which had flooded their lives and carried them off their feet.

## What did it mean to the apostles' to receive the Holy Spirit?

It meant that God's power of immediate contact was in their lives. That was the great thing which the Spirit signified for them. They realized that God was in contact with them, was within their very souls. They did not need any kind of outside help. They could go out and face the world and be confident that God would back them up; that somehow His very Spirit was in living touch with theirs, that deep down in the place where the mind did its thinking, the heart its loving, and where courage and hope lies within.

They knew that somehow Jesus was there within them by His Spirit, active and loving and gracious, able to make new men and women of them, able to revive their courage and faith so that they could face anything. That was what the Spirit meant to them.

What a new power it would give us to realize this---that God is within. What a new vitality it would bring to our prayer to realize that He does not stand without us but already manifests Himself in our hearts... to the very urge that sends us to our knees.

What they found was that through Him they possessed a root of life, a spirit alive in their souls, growing up in them, shaping character from within and finding its outlet in a certain way of life and service and in all their attitudes to one another. They found that they could think with His mind and were not slavishly dependent upon His words. The life was in them as an original impulse, breaking out in them in a way of feeling and thinking and doing.

Jesus laid down no rules---He *communicates* a Spirit. And the measure in which we have that Spirit... is the measure of the freedom and reality of our own Christian lives. *Come Holy Spirit, COM* 

### Assumption's OUTDOOR Classroom! STREAMing into God's Creation

Assumption Parish has been awarded a Grant from the Beyond Sunday Foundation to construct and implement an outdoor classroom.



This isn't your everyday outdoor classroom! Pope Francis once said, "Education is not about knowing things or taking lessons, but about being able to use three lingos; those of the head, the heart, and the hands." Assumption Parish aims to provide outdoor experiences that encompass physical, intellectual, emotional, social, and spiritual development of all students from the Assumption day school and PSR program. Currently, we provide learning of the head through indoor classroom activities, and learning of the heart through masses and other religious events. We need to provide an outdoor classroom so that students may fully grasp Pope Francis' third lingo, learning of the hands. It is vital to construct the STREAMing into God's Creating outdoor classroom to meet the needs of the whole student intellectually, emotionally, socially, spiritually, and physically through enriching outdoor education. A certified outdoor classroom facilitates better social and physical development, improves fitness and wellbeing, supports creativity and imaginative play, reduces stress, and creates feelings of empathy for nature.

Imagine a space that all grade levels, preschool through eighth grade, can collaborate and learn not only the basic fundamentals of math, science, reading, and writing, but will have the opportunity to pray the rosary and increase their faith and relationship with Mary by adoring the grotto to Mary. Multiple classes will be able to utilize the STREAMing into God's Creation classroom while simultaneously exploring and caring for God's creation through the use of natural Missouri plants and a pollinator garden.

The goal of the classroom is to offer an additional learning environment to meet our students' needs, increase the school's marketability, and be the first CERTIFIED outdoor classroom in

St. Charles County. Being certified by *Nature Explore*, which is a collaborative program of Arbor Day Foundation and Dimensional Educational Research Foundation, would meet the three lingos of Pope Francis. In addition, it will increase interest in STREAM careers, increase student productivity, and scores on standardized tests.

#### Fast Facts:

- Assumption's Outdoor Classroom will be the first of its kind and the ONLY certified elementary classroom in St. Charles County.
- It will be accessible from the school and via 3rd Street, and will be fenced off.
- Studies show children greatly benefit developmentally from being outdoors.
- Outdoor classrooms blur the boundaries between academic learning and creative play.
- There will be **EIGHT** areas for learning and interaction Music and Movement, Messy Play, Building, Climbing, Garden, Nature Art, Gathering, Open Area.
- Every subject (religion, math, science, reading and creative writing) will have curriculum for use outside.
- Every grade level will have access to the Outdoor Classroom.
- The entire school will be able to sit in the Amphitheater together.

The first steps for this project are in place, including the \$50,000 grant from the Archdiocese - courtesy of the passion and hard work of both Jennife Wyatt and Kelly Hewitt. We expect construction to begin in May or June with full implementation in August 2018.



#### May 13, The Ascension of the Lord

ACTS 1: 1-11; PS 47: 2-3, 6-9; EPH 1: 17-23; MK 16: 15-20

We often cite Jesus' quote from today's Gospel of Mark: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature."



Often, we may like to spend time debating how to do that, but that does not lessen the fact that it is something we are supposed to do. We need to acknowledge that even the original Apostles and followers of Jesus did not do that immediately. We learn that they stayed in Jerusalem for some time, and it seemed to be only when the Church and its followers were persecuted that they began to reach out and truly share the "Good News."

Once Christians accepted that charge from the Lord, they did indeed take the Word of God to all corners of the earth. Look at the Church today. It is incredible how this Church has grown from one Man/God and a small group into what it is today. That does not, however, get us "off the hook."

As much as we may argue about how to carry out this command from Jesus, the fact remains that our very lives need to stand as a representation of what it means to be a Christian, what it means to "love one another," what it means to live and to work as a disciple of Christ.
