




# Incarnate Word Academy Mission Model for the Month of April: Congratulations Grace Moeller!



### What is a Retrouvaille Program?

The word Retrouvaille (pronounced re-tro-vi with a long i) is a French word meaning rediscovery. The program offers tools needed to rediscover a loving marriage relationship. Thousands of couples headed for cold, unloving relationships or divorce have successfully overcome their marriage problems by attending the program.

## What the Program is not.

It is not a retreat, marriage counseling, or a sensitivity group. There are neither group dynamics nor group discussions on the weekend. It is not a time for hurting; it is a time for healing.

#### Who is it for?

It is for couples with marital problems including those who are considering marriage separation and those who are already separated or divorced that want marriage help. Some couples come to Retrouvaille during the initial signs of a marriage problem. Other couples are in a state of despair and hopelessness when they attend the program. These latter couples often consider the Retrouvaille program their final option.

## White House Retreat Center Gives Veterans Tools to Cope with Stress:

My, how the Veterans Spiritual Retreat has grown. After serving 24 veterans in its first year and doubling in size to 48 in 2017, the White House Jesuits Retreat hopes to have a full house of 88 for the retreat's third installment Friday, July 29, to Sunday, July I. According to White House director Bill Schmitt, about 45 veterans already have signed up. "Little by little, it's building," said Schmitt, a four-year Marine in the Vietnam War era, though he didn't see combat.

The veterans retreat "is very near and dear to my heart. It's a very worthy cause, and it gives our veterans, both men and women, an alternative to some of the destructive behaviors that sometimes we hear about". The retreat is open to all veterans regardless of religious background or conflict in which they served, including modern conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan.

The transition to civilian life from combat presents challenges, with post-traumatic stress disorder primary among them. Horrors seen and experienced often remain fresh memories, even years after service.

"That whole experience has changed anyone who was served," said Schmitt, who isn't surprised by the retreat's growth. "Not at all," he said. "I think there's a demand for this; I think there's a general demand throughout most of society today for spirituality. People turn to different ways to handle it, but we have the tried and true way, which is God and Christ."

The retreat equips veterans with faith-based tools to help them cope with life's stresses.

"God is a very powerful source of strength, especially to people who are recovering either from illness or other types of trauma in their lives," Schmitt said before the first year, adding that the retreat adds "a tool to the veteran's tool box to rely on God and prayer rather than some of the destructive ways to deal with those issues."

The retreat will be led for the third consecutive year by Jesuit Father James Conroy, a veteran of the Vietnam War, He'll be assisted by VA Chaplain Rev. Robert Collingwood and others, including former retreatants who now help lead fellow veterans in breakout sessions and discussions.

White House offers the retreat at nominal cost for veterans, just \$25 at registration. All meals and private lodging are included. Veterans come from throughout the Midwest, as well as a few from Florida and elsewhere as former retreatants tell friends and family in other parts of the country about the veterans retreat on the grounds overlooking the Mississippi. "We take very good care of them while they're down here," Schmitt said. BY: DAVE LUECKING daveluecking@archstl.org

## Assumption's OUTDOOR Classroom! STREAMing into God's Creation



Assumption Parish has been awarded a Grant from the Beyond Sunday Foundation to construct and implement an outdoor classroom. Imagine a space that all grade levels, preschool through eighth grade, can collaborate and learn not only the basic fundamentals of math, science, reading, and writing, but will have the opportunity to pray the rosary and increase their faith and relationship with Mary by adoring the grotto to Mary. Multiple classes will be able to utilize the STREAMing into God's Creation classroom while simultaneously exploring and caring for God's creation through the use of natural Missouri plants and a pollinator garden.

The goal of the classroom is to offer an additional learning environment to meet our students' needs, increase the school's marketability, and be the first CERTI-FIED outdoor classroom in

#### Fast Facts:

- Assumption's Outdoor Classroom will be the first of its kind and the ONLY certified elementary classroom in St. Charles
- It will be accessible from the school and via 3rd Street, and will be fenced off.
- Studies show children greatly benefit developmentally from being outdoors.
- Outdoor classrooms blur the boundaries between academic learning and creative play.
- There will be **EIGHT** areas for learning and interaction Music and Movement, Messy Play, Building, Climbing, Garden, Nature Art, Gathering, Open Area.
- Every subject (religion, math, science, reading and creative writing) will have curriculum for use outside.
- Every grade level will have access to the Outdoor Classroom.
- The entire school will be able to sit in the Amphitheater together.

The first steps for this project are in place, including the \$50,000 grant from the Archdiocese - courtesy of the passion and hard work of both Jennife Wyatt and Kelly Hewitt. We expect construction to begin in May or June with full implementation in August 2018.



## May 20, 2018 Pentecost Sunday (Mass during the Day)

ACTS 2: 1-11; PS 104: 1, 24, 29-31, 34; 1 COR 12: 3B-7, 12-13; JN 20: 19-23

Today is Pentecost Sunday, the 50th day after Easter (counting both Easter Sunday and today). Pentecost



Jesus calls His followers and literally all of us to be missionaries. The Latin root word for "missionary" is derived from the original Greek word apostolos, which meant "one sent forth." Obviously, we get the word "apostle" from that as well. It is further defined as one who attempts to persuade or convert. It involves the "apostle" or "disciple" working outside of the community.

When Jesus spoke these words, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." That includes each and every one of us. We, too, are sent. Many times we have reiterated that being sent means that we live out our Catholic faith in everything we do. That is the best way to evangelize, to let those around us know what it means to be a Christian and a follower of Christ and His disciple.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops made the following statement about what it means to evangelize: "Here, there are two elements of evangelization at work: 1. Witness, which is the simple living out of the faith; 2. Sharing, which is spreading the Good News of Jesus." Do we follow the admonitions given us by the Lord? Are we examples of what it means to be a Catholic and Christian? Do we truly share the Good News?


