

### Hello,

We have begun celebrating public Masses again and so far, it has been going well, people are respecting our guidelines and one another and the sanitizing after Masses is not as challenging as we had feared. We have also been able to pick up a few other ideas and re-



Monday morning we had about 25 people at the 6:30am Mass and 80 at the 8am Mass, with about 13 at the 6:30 on Tuesday and about 45 at the 8am. After that we had to get ready to celebrate a funeral for parishioner Martha Keeven, it was a great celebration of her life and with a large family, even with it being live-streamed, we had a good number at the service that gave us a little idea of what to expect this weekend.

Celebrating a funeral, and also this Monday being Memorial Day, hopefully reminds us of this great gift of life God has given us. We realize that these physical bodies are meant for finite lives and we need to live them, but also how much we need to respect and care for it. These are hopefully thoughts we are also putting into action as we make decisions about what we should or should not be doing while we consider the risks for ourselves and others related to COVID-19.

This afternoon I received a phone call stating that Fr. Gene Bendel had died. He had served as an associate pastor here at Assumption between the years of 1961-1967, and then he came back here again in 2001 and stayed through 2014. Then last summer he moved into the nursing home across the street. That is where I got to know him a little as he would con-celebrate Mass with us on Sundays when one of the priests from the parish would go over to the nursing home to celebrate their 11am Sunday Mass. When he first moved in, he would often proclaim the Gospel at the Mass from his wheelchair, and then at the offertory his chair would be moved next to the altar so he could participate in the Eucharistic prayer. After a few months he would no longer proclaim the Gospel but did still wear a priest's stole at Mass and concelebrate, moving to the altar for the Eucharistic prayer. The last couple of months we could still go over to celebrate Mass in the nursing home he had some weeks where he wasn't well enough to come to Mass with us but others where he was back doing well. Recently he caught the COVID-19 virus and died Monday due to complications associated with it.

I am sharing this little I knew of Fr. Gene with you for a few reasons. Hopefully many of you in the parish were able to have known him much better than I did and can share some of their memories with others of him. Also, because he demonstrated the value of the Eucharist to him in continuing to concelebrate the Mass even when he was having physical difficulties. But also, it reminds us that this virus is deadly and does take lives. Sometimes it takes the death of someone we know for that to be realized. Deciding if it is right for you to come to celebrate Mass with us at church I hope you do treasure the gift of the Eucharist and the Mass we can celebrate together, but also respect the gift of this physical life God has given us and take seriously the risks for yourself and others in deciding whether to come to Mass as well as other activities in your life.

Please keep Fr. Gene and each other in your prayers. Peace,

### **COMMUNION:**

Communion lines should be single file, and one way. Ushers will help to direct this. Each person is to stay 6 feet away from the person in front of them. There are tape markings in the aisles to indicate where to stand

Communicants are to receive the host in the hand only.

Face masks may only be removed for the moment of receiving Holy Communion.

### **CONFESSIONS:**

Reconciliation will resume Monday-Friday from 7:30am-7:55am & Saturday 4:00pm-4:45pm.

Sacrament of Penance should be celebrated using the screen (anonymously) Stand 6 feet apart from each other when in line for the confessional.

The Offertory collection at Holy Mass is our invitation to imitate Jesus; to give the gift of our whole self without expecting anything in return. Unfortunately, today, I suspect the collection is just seen as a financial transaction with God.

But God doesn't need our money; rather we have a need to give. Why? Because we were created in God's image and likeness. Just as some family members may look and sound alike or even have similar body gestures because of traits they inherited from their earthly parents, we too, have inherited the generosity trait from our Heavenly Father, the most generous giver of all.

When most people go to a family member or friend's house for a party or celebration, they typically bring a gift - a bottle of wine or some food to share. Maybe they order out for pizza and share in the cost. But it's not just the visible material things we bring, more importantly, it's the invisible things we bring to the party like love, friendship, joy, hospitality, gratitude, and generosity. It is the combination of visible and invisible gifts that makes the gathering a celebration.

Don't you think this is an interesting parallel to the Sunday celebration of Mass? Do you trust God will provide all that you need? If so, know that God may be using you as the answer to someone else's prayer. You may be the key to someone starting a loving relationship with Him through your generous sharing of your visible and invisible gifts.

Some of us have lost our jobs. Some of us are still fortunate to have a job. Whatever our circumstance, we are all being called in this present moment into a loving relationship with God and each other. God will use our current situation for good but we have to do our part and make room for the Holy Spirit to operate in our hearts.

The Sunday collection, the Offertory, is the gift of our whole self - the *visible* and the *invisible*. **STEWARDSHIP** THOUGHTS:


### Dear parishioners,
