Hello,

We made it through our first week of reopening for public Masses and all seemed to go well. I can say for me and my fellow priests that it was great having people



in the pews to be physically present and pray with us, and also that we apologize for any things we might have gotten mixed up. With things being different in wearing masks, what we touch, washing hands, we are having to retrain our minds for what is 'natural' to do so we don't have to concentrate on some of the externals as much and focus more on our prayer again.

Expecting things to always be the same isn't very realistic though. Even without the pandemic, things are constantly changing and different, that is a part of our lives. You might even say that Pentecost is particularly aimed at helping us with that, or more specifically the Holy Spirit is.

From that first day of Pentecost we hear the disciples speaking in tongues, to people of different nations. And as we see them go out to different people in different cultures, we hear their discussions in some of the New Testament letters about what practices in these different cultures we adapt to and which we can't. This is all new to them. In some ways it might be easier that they haven't established 'Christian' habits yet that they need to be concerned with which are important and which aren't, but they do have a few Jewish practices they need to think about.

Over the past few months, we have all been challenged in adapting to new regulations and practices, most we hope are temporary but others we realize may be good practices going forward for not spreading other viruses. But hopefully we didn't just learn good practices for viruses, but also about how much some things matter in relationships, with our work, and even with our faith. What were the things that were just easier before, but also what really matters. Maybe we have gained some good practices and insight also into relationships, our work, and the practice of our faith that will be good as we go forward.

Our habits and traditions can be good and helpful in all parts of our lives and can make different situations and change very difficult. Especially as we celebrate Pentecost, we need to be open to the Holy Spirit to help guide us through changes. To realize what is most important, and what new opportunities might be presenting themselves. While it was good to have people back at Mass last weekend, I was also glad to see everyone wasn't back. The dispensation from the obligation of Sunday Mass is still in effect because it isn't appropriate for everyone yet depending on their individual situation, and with our social distancing practices and limited capacity we couldn't have accommodated everyone yet. But know that while we still have physical challenges, the Holly Spirit is always right there for us.

THE MEANING OF PENTECOST

This is one of the most amazing stories in the world. There is none which should be more interesting to Christian people, for it is the story of the launch of the Christian Church. It is the story of how the Church which had been slowly shaping in the quietness and obscurity of that Upper Room became aware of life and power... and set out upon its mission.

So far, these men and women have been rather ordinary people, their love for Jesus Christ the one thing keeping them together. They were perplexed, terribly timid, and very aware of their weaknesses. Then, as they waited, all of a sudden as it seemed, something happened which changed their personalities. They became aware of a unity which broke down every other barrier. They found themselves in possession of faculties they had never dreamed could be theirs. They lost all fear of people and all thought of themselves. They were *fired with a message*, and a passion to tell people about it, to *spread the good news* of a love which had flooded their lives and carried them off their feet.

What did it mean to the apostles' to receive the Holy Spirit?

Holy Family...Pillar of Formation

It meant that God's power of immediate contact was in their lives. That was the great thing which the Spirit signified for them. They realized that God was in contact with them, was within their very souls. They did not need any kind of outside help. They could go out and face the world and be confident that God would back them up; that somehow His very Spirit was in living touch with theirs, that deep down in the place where the mind did its thinking, the heart its loving, and where courage and hope lies within.

They knew that somehow Jesus was there within them by His Spirit, active and loving and gracious, able to make new men and women of them, able to revive their courage and faith so that they could face anything. That was what the Spirit meant to them.

What a new power it would give us to realize this---that God is within. What a new vitality it would bring to our prayer to realize that He does not stand without us but already manifests Himself in our hearts... to the very urge that sends us to our knees.

What they found was that through Him they possessed a root of life, a spirit alive in their souls, growing up in them, shaping character from within and finding its outlet in a certain way of life and service and in all their attitudes to one another. They found that they could think with His mind and were not slavishly dependent upon His words. The life was in them as an original impulse, breaking out in them in a way of feeling and thinking and doing.

Jesus laid down no rules---He *communicates* a Spirit. And the measure in which we have that Spirit... is the measure of the freedom and reality of our own Christian lives. *Come Holy Spirit, COME!*

Pentecost Sunday May 31, 2020

ACTS 2:1-11; PS 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34; 1 COR 12:3B-7, 12 -13; JN 20:19-23

Throughout our readings today, we see the amazing truth that the Holy Spirit gives us gifts and guidance in a very personal way. We are meant to use these gifts to build up the Body of Christ in a way that is unique to each one of us.

Our first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, recalls the dramatic moment when the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the apostles. "Suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim."

Notice how personal and individual is this outpouring of the Spirit. This personalized way of *"gifting"* the apostles allowed them each to reach different people, sharing with them the *"mighty acts of God."* Embracing the stewardship way of life means that we allow the Holy Spirit to guide us in the best use of the unique gifts He has given to each of us, to accomplish the particular mission entrusted to us.

Jesus gives us this mission in our Gospel passage from John. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." But we must not let this responsibility overwhelm us. Jesus Himself, tells us so — "Peace be with you."

As this Easter season comes to a close, let us be at peace. And let us resolve to lean on the Holy Spirit more and more as our guide through the stewardship way of life.




