
When the COVID-19 pandemic began in early 2020, various restrictions were put in place across the Archdiocese of St. Louis to help stop the spread of the virus. One of those restrictions was the stopping of the use of the common Communion chalice for the faithful. A few weeks ago Archbishop Rozanski announced that this restriction would be lifted be-



ginning on the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), Sunday June 19, allowing parishes to resume this practice at the discretion of the pastor. Due to the recent rise in number of COVID cases over the last month, I have decided that we will not be making the Eucharist available under both species to the congregation at this time. This will also allow us a period to consider if we should modify any of our previous practices in the distribution of the common Communion chalice. This will help assure the safeguarding of any health concerns people may have, but also to assure that this practice will increase our reverence of the Eucharist.

As many of us take vacations over the summer and also modify their normal Mass schedule for various reasons, it is also a time when it is more difficult to assure sufficient Eucharistic Ministers may be available for each Mass. Considering this, along with the fact that many of those ministers themselves might not feel comfortable receiving from the common Communion chalice yet, I am hoping that we will be able to reinstitute this practice at Assumption at the end of the summer.

While we are talking about the Eucharist I think it might be a good time to start looking at some of our Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Survey results. This was the survey the archdiocese invited us to take in March and 796 of our parishioners completed. One topic of questions was about our beliefs and a common question for Catholics is if they believe as the Church teaches that the Eucharist is the body and blood of Jesus Christ? As you can see the results below, 88% of our parishioners who responded do believe so, while the latest Pew research study on this topic in 2019 only identified 31% of Catholics believing this. Dealing with survey data and statistics can always be a challenge in how to interpret the data and what it really means. The Pew survey response rate went up to 63% for those who identified as regular Mass goers. It should also be realized that 88% of us who re-



sponded to the DMI attend Mass at least weekly.

As we begin to look at some of this data I think it can help us not only determine what needs to be how. If 89% believe Scripture

is the Word of God, and only 76% believe in the teaching authority of the Church, it might be more useful to quote the Bible than a pope or Church council. It's also useful to show how the Church teaching is based on Scripture. A few things to think about as we try to use these results to grow in our faith and as a parish.



June 23, 2022 – Solemnity of the Most Precious Body and Blood of Christ GN 14:18-20; PS 110:1-4;1 COR 11:23-26; LK 9:11B-17



Today, we observe the Solemnity of the of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This beautiful feast celebrates the gift of the Eucharist, which the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches is the

source and summit of our Christian faith. *"For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself"* (CCC 1324).

The very word, Eucharist, means "thanksgiving" or "gratitude," and so this feast is especially meaningful to all of us who are striving to live as grateful stewards of all God's blessings to us. Surely the Eucharist is the greatest of all blessings because it is not only from God, it is God — the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Today's second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians reminds us of the depths of love our Lord has shown us in the gift of the Eucharist, recalling Christ's words at the very first Eucharistic celebration. "*The Lord Jesus... took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you.*" In that moment, and at every celebration of the Mass thereafter, Jesus gives us His very Self in an act of complete humility and perfect love. How can we possibly show our gratitude for such a sublime gift?

We can — in our own imperfect way — follow our Lord's example by giving generously of ourselves to others. Our Gospel reading from Luke recounts the miraculous multiplication of the loaves and fishes, when Jesus took the small offering of the five loaves and two fish and produced enough to satisfy the whole crowd with twelve baskets full of leftovers. This event is widely understood as a foreshadowing of the miracle that takes place at every Mass as the words of consecration are spoken by the celebrant and God transforms bread and wine into the Precious Body and Blood of Jesus.

And in contemplating this stunning show of Jesus' power in feeding the crowd that evening, it is easy to overlook an important detail for us Christian stewards found in the brief statement our Lord makes just before performing the miracle. When the apostles suggest to Jesus that He should dismiss the hungry crowd so they could go and find some dinner, Jesus has another idea. *"Give them some food yourselves,"* He tells them. This is a seemingly impossible command. It would take work, effort, energy and resources the Apostles simply did not have. But Jesus is not asking the impossible. He is asking us to give Him what we do have for the sake of others — and let Him do the impossible with it.

This is the way we can at least attempt to thank Him for all His gifts and goodness to us. This is the essence of a stewardship way of life. When we gratefully offer back to our Lord the gifts He has given to us, He takes those same gifts and multiplies them beyond our wildest imaginings. And yet another miracle occurs — this sharing of ourselves and our gifts does not leave us with less, but with more — the satisfaction of living as Christ's own disciple and an instrument of His grace in the world. As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let us receive the gift of the Eucharist with the greatest possible reverence and love. And let's give ourselves generously to others in the week ahead to show our gratitude for this wondrous gift — the gift of God Himself.





MOScholars Offers New Assumption School Families Financial Assistance

If you think you can't afford a Catholic education at Assumption School, think again. Additional financial assistance is now available in Missouri, and new students are encouraged to apply!

Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish is excited to publicize that the Office of the Missouri State Treasurer has approved the Today and Tomorrow Educational Foundation (TTEF) as an Educational Assistance Organization (EAO) for the Missouri Empowerment Scholarship Accounts Program (MOScholars). The new MOScholars scholarships are for new students and can be used toward your Assumption School tuition.

Qualified students in elementary and secondary school who are new to Assumption must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Is a member of a household whose total annual income does not exceed an amount equal to 100% of the income standard used to qualify for free and reduced lunches (refer to guidelines below), and meets at least one of the following:
- Attended a public school as a full-time student for at least one semester during the previous twelve months or
- Is a child who is eligible to begin kindergarten or first grade.

History of Catechesis and RCIA

In the Gospel of Matthew we find the Great Commission. Christ sends forth of the Apostles as missionaries with the command: "Go therefore and

make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit" (Matt. 28:19; NASB) Beginning with Our Lord's earliest command that "all nations" be initiated into His Church and throughout the history of that Church that followed, it is natural that many coming to faith and entering the Church would be adults. The term "catechumen" is used today to mean exactly what it meant in biblical times when St. Paul writes to the Galatians regarding "the one who is taught the word (Greek: catechumens)" (Gal. 6:6; NASB). Church Fathers St. Justin Martyr (2nd century A.D), Tertullian (3rd century A.D.), St. Augustine (5th century A.D), and many others reference periods of instruction and preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, the Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation) during the period known as the "catechumenate."

So, as the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) tells us: "From the time of the apostles, becoming a Christian has been accomplished by a journey and initiation in several stages. This journey can be covered rapidly or slowly, but certain essential elements will always have to be present: proclamation of the Word, acceptance of the Gospel entailing conversion, profession of faith, Baptism itself, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and admission to Eucharistic com*munion*. "[1]

The catechumenate was especially important and prominent in the early Church since, first, as previously mentioned, many (perhaps most) entered the Church for the first time as adults; and second, the early Church experienced several periods of severe persecution and it was critical that those entering the Church be well instructed in the faith for which they risked their lives.

The CCC acknowledges that the catechumenate was reinvigorated and RCIA established much later when the second Vatican Council restored for the Latin Church "the catechumenate for adults, comprising several distinct steps." The rites for these stages are to be found in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)."[2]

This initiative of Vatican 2 has resulted in the RCIA programs, the pathways into the Church for adults seeking after Our Lord, which we have in our parishes today. The Mystical Humanity of Christ Publishing.
