Hello,

This week the archdiocese is publishing some of the diocese-wide results for the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Survey which was conducted in February (allthingsnew.archstl.org/Survey-Results). I had shared a little of the parish results last week and plan on doing more today and in the next month.

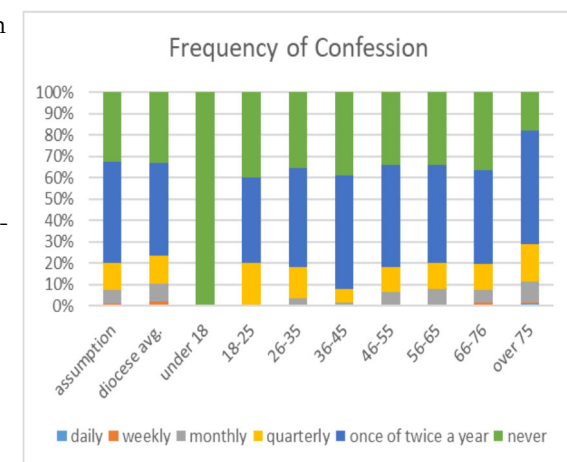
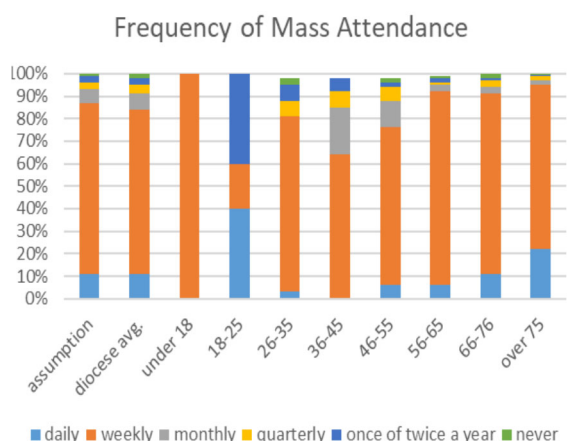
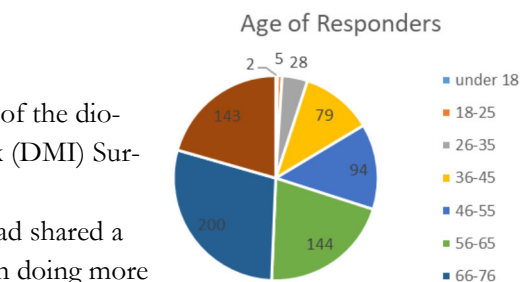
I thought I would start with who the parishioners are who filled out the survey in our parish, not their names but some of the characteristics. Out of 796 responses only two of them identified as being under 18, and 5 identified as being between the ages of 18-25. I mention that because I don't want to read too much into those responses by themselves as statistically those segments are too small to really draw conclusions. Also to note that in that response as in many others, some people chose not to reply, so whenever you look at numbers they may not all add up to 796.

Of those who responded you can see some attend Mass daily, while most of them do attend Mass weekly. I thought you might also be interested in seeing what frequency they participate in the sacrament of Confession. One caveat I want to mention here is to remember that this survey was conducted at the beginning of Lent, and it was still not unusual this Lent to have people who had not been to Confession since before COVID and 'Never' means they did not go to Confession in the last year.

A final piece of information this week is to see some of our aspirations and hopes for the future. So the question was: "All parishes have opportunities for growth. If you could only select 3 of the following things that the parish needs more of, which would they be."

- 72 More young people involved
- 58 More volunteers participating in ministries
- 25 More clarity on parish vision, direction and goals
- 24 More catechesis on Church teaching
- 19 More inclusive spirit and welcome
- 15 More money for parish needs
- 14 More lay involvement in decision making and leadership
- 13 More savvy communication strategies
- 12 More contemporary forms of worship
- 8 More transparency (e.g. finances and decisions)
- 6 More traditional forms of worship
- 2 More paid professional staff

This should give us some good information not only for our archdiocesan planning but also to consider with our parish planning.

Feast of Corpus Christi Celebrated with Assumption Parish Family

More than 100 Assumption parishioners participated in a moving, half-mile procession after noon Mass, Sunday, June 19, on the Feast of Corpus Christi, a celebration of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. The procession began at the church and then crossed Main Street before stopping for prayers at the Fatima and Lourdes shrines, located on the campus of the Sisters of the Most Precious Blood of O'Fallon.

After leaving the shrines, the procession made its way back across the street and into the Assumption Chapel (old church) where Father Nick Kastenholtz placed the Monstrance containing the Eucharist on the altar, where it was exposed for Adoration for a period of time. 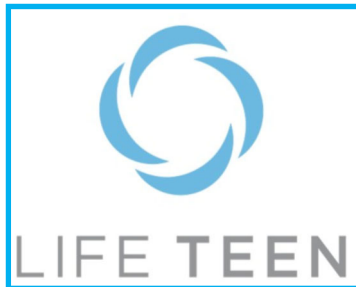

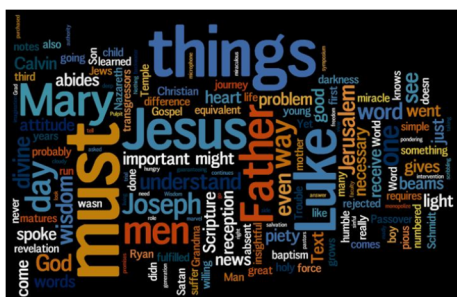

June 26, 2022 — Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 KGS 19:16B, 19-21; PS 16:1-2, 5, 7-11; GAL 5:1, 13-18; LK 9:51-62

Today's readings take us back to the basics, inviting us to reflect honestly on our deepest priorities in life.

In today's Gospel, from Luke, Christ refers to the struggle to put Him above all else as He encounters two "would be" disciples on His way to Jerusalem. **"Follow me,"** Jesus says to the first man. *"But he replied, 'Lord let me go first and bury my father.' The other said, 'I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home.'*" These two want to follow Christ but only on their own terms, only after taking care of some other, more pressing matters (at least in their own minds).

To this, Christ says thanks but no thanks! Following Him requires an unqualified **“yes”** not a *“yes but...”* We are called to put Christ and His kingdom ahead of our own plans if we truly wish to be his disciples and to find victory in the battle of selfishness.

Living stewardship as a way of life can go a long way in arming us for victory. Stewardship living provides us with a custom-made “training plan” — the commitment to a specific offering of our time, talent, and treasure to the Kingdom of God. It is a plan discerned through prayer and by looking at the realities of our unique circumstances, strengths, and limitations. The daily discipline of committing to the plan strengthens us and helps us gradually move away from the “yes, but” attitude and towards an unqualified “yes!” to Christ and His will.

Do not be afraid to give the best of yourself and your gifts to Christ. He deserves nothing less. And this way of life, while challenging, will be characterized by a joy and peace that only comes from living for Him.

During the next few weeks we would like to talk about the RCIA sponsor. This information comes from Team RCIA. *TeamRCIA.com* is a FREE online resource for Catholic parishes and dioceses that want to form Christians for life.

Five essential elements of an RCIA sponsor's job description

RCIA sponsors are supposed to be good examples. Please see... *RCIA 75.2*:

As they become familiar with the Christian way of life, and are helped by the example and support of sponsors, godparents, and the entire Christian community, the catechumens learn to turn more readily to God in prayer, to bear witness to the faith, in all things to keep their hopes set on Christ, to follow supernatural inspiration in their deeds, and to practice love of neighbor, even at the cost of self renunciation.

This is one of the few places in the RCIA that actually delineates the role of the sponsors and godparents outside of the actual rites. If you were going to use this brief paragraph as the foundation of a job description for sponsors, how would you flesh it out for them?

Pray: The first example the RCIA sponsors must give to the catechumens is how Christians pray. So perhaps your job description might include some of the following:

Worship: Sponsors are active participants in weekly Sunday Mass and the major worship events of the parish. They are responsible for the attendance of their catechumens at these events.

Daily prayer: Sponsors spend some significant, concentrated time in prayer every day (at least 15 minutes). Sponsors are responsible for teaching their catechumens how to pray daily.

Penitential prayer: Sponsors regularly examine their consciences and regularly practice the many forms of penance in Christian life (see Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1434-1439). RCIA sponsors are responsible for teaching their catechumens how to practice some of these forms.

Intercessory prayer: Sponsors regularly bring their needs before God (see Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2629-2636). RCIA sponsors are responsible for teaching their catechumens how to petition God for their needs.

Next week we will continue to look at more of a sponsor's job description.
