## Hello,

Well it is the 4<sup>th</sup> of July weekend, and we know that is a federal holiday with many public celebrations (although a bit modified or limited this year). But did you know that it also is a part of our Church calendar in the United States? And no, not just as July 4<sup>th</sup>, but as Independence Day. There is even a Mass for Independence Day that can be used throughout the dioceses of the United States, it has special prayers written just to be used at the different parts of Mass on that day. I guess that can seem a bit strange if we are thinking that we need a rigid wall of separation between Church and State, but such a separation was never intended by either. Look at the First Amendment of the Bill of Rights;

### Amendment I

Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

It describes that the federal government would not establish a religion or prohibit the exercise of one's religion, not that they be separate and can never have any association with one another.

Sometimes life seems like it may be easier if we could just have a complete separation between the two, but we know that's not possible. Just the definition of such basic things like life, person, even religion itself affect the workings of our government, and are also topics that we know are affected by our faith and beliefs. Freedom isn't that easy, and we realize that each of us mess it up sometimes, all the way back to Adam and Eve. But it also gives us an opportunity, the opportunity to do good, to show our care and love for one another, to choose to follow and listen to God, to choose to unite together and to strive to build up His kingdom.

### *The opening prayer at Mass for Independence Day is:*

**Father of all nations and ages, we recall the day when our country claimed its place among the family of nations; for what has been achieved we give you thanks, for the work that still remains we ask your help, and as you have called us from many peoples to be one nation, grant that, under your providence, our country may share your blessings with all the people of the earth. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, you Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.**

Happy 4<sup>th</sup> of July. Our country isn't perfect, but it allows us opportunities to live out and share our faith that should truly be appreciated and celebrated. May we be grateful for the freedoms we have, and conscious of our opportunities to live out our faith in the ways we use them and protect those of others.



**July 5, 2020 – Fourteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time**

*ZEC 9:9-10; PS 145:1-2, 8-11, 13-14; ROM 8:9, 11-13; MT 11:25-30*

The theme of humility is central to our readings today. God Himself is a humble God, so if we wish to follow Him as Christian stewards, we too, must be humble. In fact, humility is key to the stewardship way of life, and to a peaceful and fulfilling life.

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, Jesus Himself speaks to the Father of the privileged role that humble souls play in God's plan of salvation. *"I give praise to you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to little ones."*

What does it mean to be a "little one"? It means that we acknowledge we don't have it all figured out, but that we are very much in need of a savior. It means we recognize that all we are and all we have been given is a gift from God. It means we embrace the stewardship way of life.

It is not easy, but deep peace and consolation come with this way of life. Jesus offers these warm and encouraging words to entice us to embrace it. *"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."*

Let us resolve to follow in the footsteps of our Savior, embracing the humble path of stewardship. It is the path that leads to peace here and now, and ultimately leads us to heaven.

## PREVENT AND PROTECT UPDATE:

To all those who work or volunteer here at Assumption Parish, involving our CHILDREN, the VULNERABLE or the ELDERLY, you must be registered into the new Prevent and Protect site in order to be in Compliance with the Archdiocese. This is **MANDATORY**. You can go to our website; [www.assumptionbvm.org](http://www.assumptionbvm.org), go to Quick Links, scroll down to the Safe Environment link, this link will take you to my link where you will find directions on how to register. If you have started this registration but have NOT received your **CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION**, that means you are not in Compliance with the Archdiocese, so please go back into your P/P account and double check your requirement checklist to see what needs to be completed and submitted.

**IF YOU HAVE NOT TAKEN A PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN WORKSHOP**, we are now offering ZOOM Sessions. After you have completed your registration into the P&P site, and have not already taken a PGC workshop, it will take you to the schedule, *there are no live sessions*...scroll down to Zoom Sessions where you can pick a session ~ click to register.

Then, 24 hours before the class the facilitator will send them an email with the passcode and id meeting info. The day of the session, log in with that code about 10 minutes before the session is to start. The facilitator will take attendance and then they will give them credit the next day.

**Parish Business Manager Wanted** – After the sudden death of our previous business manager, Jim Hager, we are now looking for someone to fill this full-time position. ## Corporate Grants and Matching Gifts

Many parishes and schools are aware that recently corporations (Boeing, Mastercard, Amazon, Pfizer, etc) are tightening the restrictions for corporate grants and matching gifts for religious organizations. Parishes are now receiving emails from corporations asking for an independent 501(c)3 for the school as they are no longer accepting our 501(c)3 because the EIN provided is for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and religious organizations are ineligible for the corporations' platforms.

Tom Buckley, Archdiocesan General Counsel, has responded to this situation as follows:

"Unfortunately, if this is their (the corporation's) position, it means you will be ineligible for future donations from them unless and until they change their mind. Our schools are not separately incorporated. They are parish run. But even if they were separately incorporated they would have to be set up under canon law as a religious non-profit, so that would not help us here either.

More and more publicly traded companies are adopting these policies.
