Hello,

Next Monday, July 18th, we celebrate the feast day of St. Camillus de Lellis. I have to admit that I had never heard of St. Camillus until my parents moved into a retirement community named St. Camillus. (I'm not sure if it is appropriate to say that the order runs the facilities, but it has priests from the Camillian order on their board and who minister to the community with daily Mass in their chapel).

St. Camillus was born in 1550 in Italy. While his father had a distinguished military career in the service of Spain, Camillus joined the Venetian army at the age of 17 and would stay with them until he was 25. During this period, it is noted that he received some sort of wound or disease of his leg that would result in having this open wound for the rest of his life. It is also noted that he had a gambling addiction and would lose everything he owned.

He then found work as a laborer at a Capuchin friary in Manfredonia in 1575 where the ministry of the Capuchin friars would lead him to join their novitiate. He was unable to stay with them, though, due to the sore on his leg that was declared 'incurable'. He then would move to San Giacomo in Rome where he had previously been both a patient and servant. He arrived intending to devote himself to the care of the incurably sick, and it was noticed that along with his nursing care he was also a good administrator. This would lead to his eventually becoming the bursar of the hospital. With the support of a wealthy patron he would leave San Giacomo and set up another hospital in Rome with two other men where they hoped to be able to provide patients with spiritual and physical care. During this period Camillus would also study to be ordained a priest, which would occur in 1584.

In 1585 he would rent a house and write up a Rule under which he and others would live while also serving those who were suffering from the plague. As their community grew, they received provisional approval of their Rule in 1586 and would have formal approval of their Order by Pope Gregory XIV in 1591 and be known as the Ministers of the Sick (M.I.). They would wear a black habit with a red cross on it. In 1595 and 1601 some of the brothers would be the first recorded instance of a medical field unit as they went to nurse the wounded in Hungary and Croatia on the battlefield.

Camillus would die in 1614 and would be canonized in 1746. The order would continue to grow and today numbers 1,120 religious. I found most of this information in Butler's Lives of the Saints under July 14th, which was the day of his death, however his feast day has been moved to the 18th.

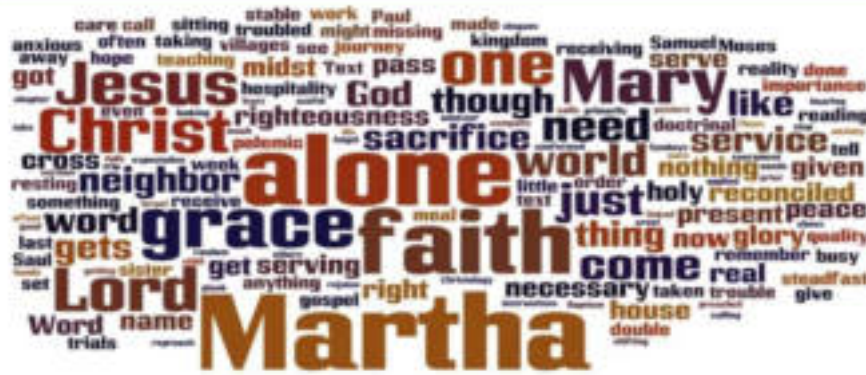

Jeremiah 29:10-13



GN 18: 1-10A; PS15:2-5; COL 1:24-28; LK 10:38-42

In our Second Reading, from St. Paul's letter to the Colossians, Paul actually uses the term "stewardship" to describe the particular mission that has been entrusted to Him by God. That is why, he explains, that all the sufferings he endures as part of his ministry are a joy for Him — because they come as a part of the privilege of serving the Lord. This is equally true for each one of us today. We are all called to be the Lord's faithful stewards, spreading the Good News of the Gospel in our particular sphere of influence. And while serving the Lord (through formal ministry or just in the daily duties of everyday life) involves some suffering, like Paul, we should count this as part of the privilege of being called His stewards.

Martha becomes indignant at Mary's behavior and complains to Jesus, *"Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me."* But Jesus, in His infinite wisdom, refuses to get pulled in to this sisterly spat. Instead, He offers Martha a fresh way to look at the situation. *"Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing."*

What is that one thing? It is to put Jesus first in our lives and above all other things; to “sit at his feet” and listen as Mary did, giving Him the first priority of our time no matter how busy we think we are.

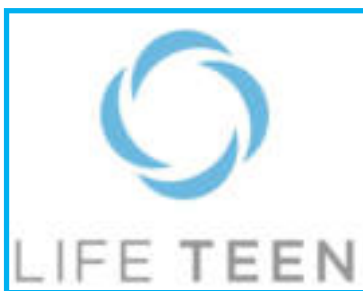

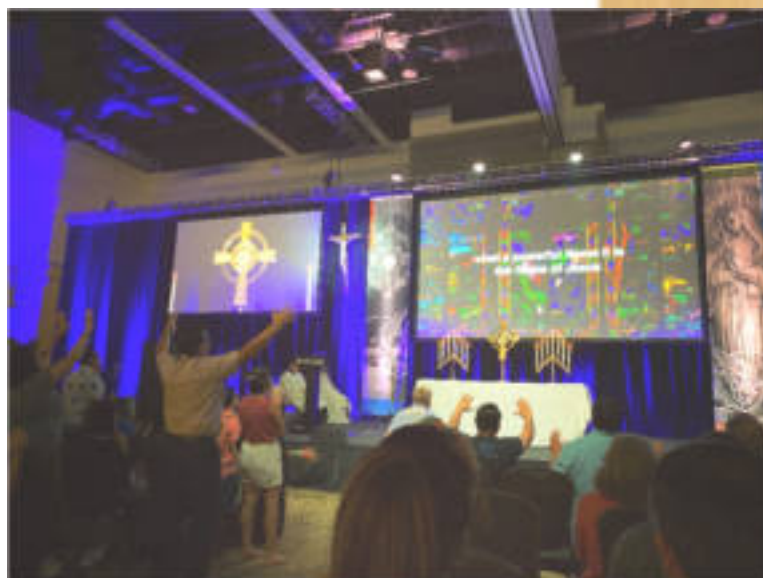

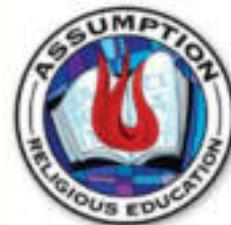
