Hello,

A week ago, at the Saturday evening Mass, I read the wrong Gospel reading. Actually I read the Gospel for the following week that I had marked the book for earlier. From the start I thought it was the wrong reading, but they both were talking about sowing seed in the field, which was part of what I would refer to in my homily, and so I convinced myself during the first paragraph that I was just a little confused and since it was a longer Gospel passage I must have just been a little forgetful about how it started. But then as I went on I knew it was the wrong passage. As soon as I finished the Gospel I asked if the Gospel projected on the wall (a practice we have done since removing the missalettes out of the pews) were different than what I read, and I could see a lot of heads nodding yes. So I apologized for my mistake right away.

As I've gotten older I think that is one the traits that I have developed, or maybe a sign of maturity, that I know would have had a very hard time doing when I was younger – admitting mistakes. I know I made mistakes throughout all of my life, hard to believe I know, but looking back I think I've learned that the mistake itself usually wasn't the worst part, but trying to cover it up and not admitting to it was what usually led to problems.

I can remember a few times when I was in my late teens and early 20's even when I was arguing with someone, realized I was wrong, but considered I could still win the argument, so I continued. My parents, siblings, and some friends could probably have told you about a few also. While I might have been improving my debate skills, I really needed to work on my humility and pride.

I'm using this example because I think I am not the only one who has gone through some of these experiences, and I probably need to remind myself when I do get it right. Being able to admit our mistakes isn't just important in our lives only in 'maturing' but also in becoming better Christians. We are not perfect, if we are trying to do things, especially trying to do meaningful things that are a challenge, we will make mistakes. But Jesus wants us to try, to grow, to take some risks and accept responsibilities we have been given. Hopefully we are not always making mistakes, or else maybe we are taking risks we shouldn't be, but the occasional failure is not the worst thing that can happen. It can be an opportunity to be humble, to realize we need others help, to realize we are not God, and that we need and depend upon God.

When we make an honest mistake, it usually does not involve sin. When we persist in hiding and not admitting that mistake is when it usually will lead us to sin. Consider how much we know Jesus wants us to face up to our sins, to admit them, seek forgiveness from others and from God, and to be open to his blessings in our lives. If we know we wish to have our sins forgiven, maybe it wouldn't be a bad thing to be humble enough to admit our mistakes in the first place and maybe even avoiding some of those sins before we do them.

I believe this was actually the first time I've read the wrong Gospel at Mass, but given enough time I will probably do it again. If I don't realize it right away I will ask you now to let me know of my mistake in this and other areas, because worse than a mistake would be to let it become a sin.



BLESSING & ADORATION (CCC 2626-28)

- Expresses the basic movement of Christian prayer
- It is an encounter between God & man
- In blessing, God’s gift and man’s acceptance of this gift are united in dialogue to one another
- Prayer of blessing is man’s response to God’s gifts
- God gives us the grace of the Holy Spirit to continue to bless us
- Adoration is the first attitude of man acknowledging he is a creature standing before his Creator
- Our way to show homage to our Creator and King in respectful silence

PRAYER OF PETITION OR SUPPLICATION (CCC 2629-33)

- Form of prayer many of us are most familiar and comfortable with
- By prayer of petition we express awareness of our relationship with God
- We are sinners and prayer of petition is already a turning back to Him and away from sin
- Asking God to hear and answer our prayer
- Begin by asking forgiveness
- Petition is centered on a desire and search for the Kingdom to come
- We understand that every need can become the object of petition when we share in God’s saving love

PRAYER OF INTERCESSION (CCC 2634-36)

- “Leads us to pray as Jesus did”—we learn to pray as Christ did; praying for those most in need
- Christ interceded with the Father for all men, especially for sinners, we too can intercede for others to draw them closer to Christ
- Asking for the needs of others, even those who may have done us harm

KINGDOM OF HEAVEN

July 26, 2020 – Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 KGS 3:5, 7-12; PS 119:57, 72, 76-77, 127-130; ROM 8:28-30; MT 13:44-52 OR 13:44-46

The *stewardship way of life* could be described as a daily pursuit of the kingdom of heaven. In our Gospel passage from Matthew today, Jesus employs three parables to describe this kingdom.

In the first of today's parables, our Lord reminds us that living for Him and for His kingdom will be costly. But the deep joy that comes in following Him makes the "price" entailed worth it. Jesus says, "The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field which a person finds and hides again, and out of joy goes and sells all that he has and buys that field." Next, He says the kingdom of heaven is "like a merchant searching for fine pearls. When he finds a pearl of great price, he goes and sells all he has and buys it."

In each of these stories, the kingdom of heaven is somewhat "hidden." We must intentionally search for it amidst the noise of the world that bombards us. Yet, our Lord reminds us that His Kingdom is meant for everyone and He wants us to find it! He says, "It is like a net thrown into the sea which collects fish of every kind."

But Jesus concludes His teaching with a rather ominous image, reminding us that every "fish" will also be judged as good or bad. "The angels will go out and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw them into the fiery furnace." This is a description that is difficult to forget. Clearly Jesus wants to get our attention.

Let us pray for the wisdom to recognize the kingdom of heaven in our midst and intensify our efforts to pursue it starting right now. There is no time to lose, and we will obtain the immeasurable joy that only comes when *we live as disciples of Jesus*.
