

Hello,

Since I've gotten to the parish this past week I've been asking many people before I do something how they have done it here in the past. Normally I've been getting a very gracious response along the lines of "however you want to do it is fine." I did get one correction indirectly after I celebrated Mass here Tuesday morning. A few people told Deacon Richard that we forgot to start the *Memorare* prayer as we processed out. I got it right on Wednesday.

I am mentioning this example to let you know that you can tell me directly and you don't have to tell someone else when I do something that isn't the way you usually do it here. I would actually appreciate being told how things have been done in the past because I realize there is usually a history behind it. Some of the history is due to personal preferences, some practical reasons, some theological reasons, and other are local customs whose history may not even be known.

My first assignment as a priest was to St. Francis of Assisi parish where the Franciscan's had been at the parish for 75 years and were all leaving. Two new diocesan priests, the new pastor and myself, were showing up and we didn't know any of their local traditions. We quickly found out when we inadvertently changed or omitted some of them. But worse were the ones we only found out about later how we had inadvertently offended someone or how we were making something that was very easy into a very complicated project.

I'm fortunate to have Msgr. McCumber here for some of the priest practices, and the parish staff and volunteers for many other practices here, but would also appreciate all of your input. That way if I'm making a change I can know that I'm doing it and hopefully have a good reason. If that is the case it might even be a good learning moment for one of us at least. As I've learned from many parents, you don't want to use your "because I said so" options up on things that don't need them.

Fr. Patrick will also be learning all of the ways of Assumption parish as he starts forming some of his priestly habits. Now is a golden opportunity to let him know those things that are really important to you.

Thank you for the warm welcome I've received so far and let us keep each other in our prayers.

IS 66:10-14C; PS 66:1-7, 16, 20; GAL 6: 14-18; LK 10:1-12, 17-20

In today's Gospel passage from Luke, we find our Lord appointing disciples to go out and prepare others to receive His invitation into the Kingdom of God. Every verse has something to say about the way a Christian steward should approach others. Let's look at least one of the coaching tips Christ gives.


"The Lord appointed seventy-two others whom He sent out ahead of Him in pairs to every town and place He intended to visit." In His wisdom, Christ sent His disciples out not as individuals but in pairs, as teams. This approach to evangelization certainly provided practical advantages. The disciples could lean on each other for mutual support and encouragement, helping each other to stay on task and to put their heads together to pray and problem-solve. This teamwork approach is just as relevant to us modern-day Christian stewards. It takes courage and commitment to go out and invite others into the Christian life. We need to work together to do it well.

But there is also symbolic importance to working in teams. It points to the reality that when we invite others to embrace the Good News of the Gospel, we are not merely inviting them into a belief system, but into a relationship with Christ and through that relationship, into Christ's family our fellow Christian disciples near and far.

Our parish is our immediate spiritual family in this extended worldwide fold. We are not meant to live as isolated individuals within the parish any more than we are meant to live in isolation within our families. We are meant to be a community. That is why it is so important for us to foster a vibrant, supportive, welcoming parish life. This is why we emphasize hospitality as one of the pillars

of stewardship. It is not enough just to point others to Christ, we must invite them to join us in community with Him; we must offer a place and mission for them in the Church and within our parish family.


