Hello,

I started reading a book last week written by a man about when he was a young boy growing up in a small farming village in Malawi just a few years ago. The year he is supposed to be going onto middle school they are struck with a famine and not only can't they afford tuition to go to school, but also are not sure they will have any food to make it until they can harvest anything. It was a good opportunity to let some of the challenges I might face allow me to better understand the much greater challenges others face. The following letter from the Archbishop invites us to consider others we might be able to help.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Since 1956, the Archdiocese of St. Louis has sent over 45 archdiocesan priests to serve the people of Bolivia, one of the poorest countries in South America. This year, we offer praise and thanks to our Lord, as Fr. Patrick Hayden and Fr. James Michler continue to serve in the Latin America Apostolate, each with over 25 years of missionary service to the apostolate. Their perseverance and endurance, especially in the midst of the recent crisis in Bolivia, is an outstanding testimony to their faith and to the support and encouragement they receive through the faithful of our local archdiocese.

All of us are facing unprecedented challenges because of the pandemic. *Pope Francis reminds us*, "Like the disciples in the Gospel we were caught off guard by an unexpected, turbulent storm. We have realized that we are on the same boat, all of us fragile and disoriented, but at the same time important and needed, all of us called to row together, each of us in need of comforting the other. On this boat... are all of us. Just like those disciples, who spoke anxiously with one voice, saying 'We are perishing' (v. 38), so we too have realized that we cannot go on thinking of ourselves, but only together can we do this" (*Meditation in Saint Peter's Square, 27 March 2020*).

Right now, we have the opportunity to come together. We are the Body of Christ and are called to live this reality; comforting one another. One of the ways we can do this is through the support of our Latin America Apostolate. Our brothers and sisters in Bolivia are, too, suffering the effects of the pandemic. Without the prayers and sacrifices of the people of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, our Latin America Apostolate could not offer pastoral care, formation, catechesis, and social services to the parish community of Maria Reina. Ask God how He is calling you to participate in this mission financially. Please pray for our Latin America Apostolate, missionaries, and all involved with this ministry. The annual collection for our Latin America Apostolate will take place in all parishes during the weekend of August 1st & 2nd.

I am asking God's blessings on you and your families, and am grateful for your support of our Latin America Apostolate.





August 2, 2020 – Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

IS 55:1-3; PS 145:8-9, 15-18; ROM 8:35, 37-39; MT 14:13-21

Today's readings should inspire the Christian steward with deepened gratitude to our God, Who **loves us** with such fierce and tender **love**. We must make an intentional response every day to return **love for Love**.

In our Second Reading, from Romans, St. Paul reminds us that nothing and nobody can keep God from **loving us**. No anguish, distress, persecution, famine... and we might add pandemic, economic loss, relationship strife — nothing — can keep our God from His faithful **love** for us. God has got us in the palm of His hand.

And yet, this reassurance is only the beginning of God's gifts to us. Our Gospel passage from Matthew recounts the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish. This of course, is a foreshadowing of the miraculous gift the Eucharist, which feeds us not with bread but with the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus.

Let's look at the opening verses of this passage, for they reveal a little of the tender heart of Jesus for all of us. *"His heart was moved with pity for them, and he cured their sick."* What generous and **compassionate love** He shows.

But even that is not enough for our Lord. He remains with them, ministering to and teaching them well into the evening. The disciples suggest that Jesus should send them away so that they could buy some food. But Jesus will not hear of it. He insists that the disciples feed them right then and there. And then, He provides the miraculous abundance of food out of the few loaves and fishes the disciples could round up. God never ceases to show His amazing **love** for us.

What a privilege for those disciples to participate in Christ's miraculous plan for His people. This privilege is ours, too, as Christian stewards. Let us make a grateful response to such amazing love.

FORMS OF PRAYER

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING (CCC 2637-38)

Gratitude for all circumstances we have been given
The prayer of the Church that we celebrate in the Eucharist
Every event and need can become an offering of thanksgiving

In thanksgiving we offer our thanks to God, as our response to God for all He has given each of us

PRAYER OF PRAISE (CCC 2639-43)

This form recognizes that God is God, and acknowledges that God is who He is. We praise God because He is
Gives us a chance to share in the blessed happiness with all those who love God for who He is in faith before seeing Him in glory
Embraces all the other forms of prayer and leads our prayers to our source and goal: "the one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist"
First, we must praise and acknowledge there is one, true God, before we can ever speak to Him in prayer

LITURGICAL YEAR AND EXAMPLES OF PRAYER

Shaping our prayer around the various seasons of the liturgical prayer can create a more meaningful and deeper prayer life. We can use any prayers at any time during the year, but the following provides prayers to use during the various liturgical seasons that may prove to have a more meaningful impact.

Advent: Time for spiritual growth and reflection to prepare our hearts before the celebration of Christ's birth. Examples of prayer during this season

Advent reflection booklet to give us a daily reflection and scripture

Novena: devotional praying, consisting of private or public prayers repeated for nine successive days or weeks. Praymorenovenas.com or for a more immediate need: Flying-Novena-Mother-Teresa.

Ignatian Prayer: Imaginative, reflective, and personal prayer that includes a daily examen: IgnatianSpirituality.com.

Christmas: Time for rejoicing in the birth of Christ and the importance of the Incarnation in our salvation. Examples of prayer during this season
