Survey says... As we begin our new school year we also have the results of the Archdiocesan School Survey. Over 18,000 completed it to help us as we plan for the future of our Archdiocese with All Things New. The School Survey has helped identify strengths and opportunities for our schools noted by different groups that will help us to plan for the future. It has also identified the level of commitment we might expect from different people as changes occur. All of this needs to be considered in making the best plans and transitions for the future.

One area of the survey asked about the likely response of different groups of people if there was change. Recognizing that All Things New may result in there being fewer Catholic parishes and schools in the archdiocese, here are a few of the responses of different groups to their possible actions. It is good to see the dedication of a large percentage to our Catholic schools and PSR programs both by family and staff. I was glad to see only a fairly small percentage (8% or less) would no longer send their children to a Catholic school or PSR, or desire to continue working or being a Catechist there. Many considered it depended on the specifics. The other survey questions were able to identify some of the values and concerns from different groups to be aware of as we plan for the future.

Some of the strengths that were identified across all groups surveyed were that Catholic schools: ...form children to be disciples of Jesus (over 80% agreed with this statement); ...foster a sense of community and belonging (over 80% agreed); ...enhance children's moral development and self-discipline (over 80% agreed); ...challenge students academically (over 90% agreed); and ...are safe and secure (over 90% agreed). One of the opportunities for us to grow was in the ability to support students with different learning styles and needs. The response on this question varied greatly depending on the group that was responding. 82% of School Faculty/Staff considered that our Catholic schools do support such students, 58% of school parents considered so, but only 37% of alumni agreed and 34% of them disagreeing. This is a challenging area. I would interpret the responses as those currently involved in our schools (the parents and faculty/staff) have a much more favorable impression. We recognized this need and have been improving and also desire to meet the needs of as many as we possibly can. At Assumption, we currently have learning consultants for children from Pre-K through 8<sup>th</sup> grade. 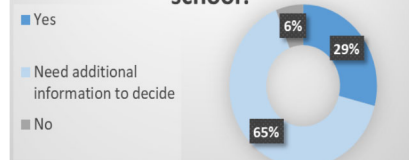

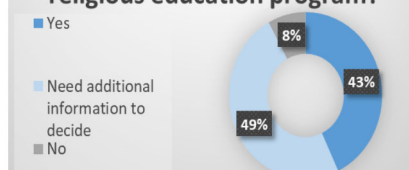

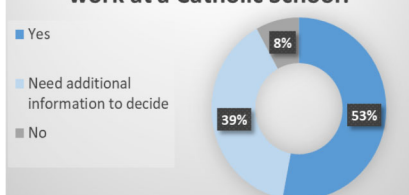
**School Parents: Would you continue to enroll your children in a Catholic school?**



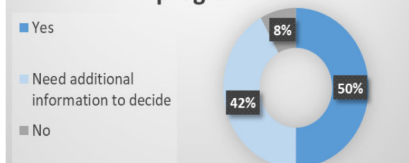
**PSR Parents: Would you continue to enroll your children in a parish religious education program?**

As we begin a new year's journey, we are blessed  
with full classes and a great year for learning!

1. **Make** sure you visit on Open House and get your child's free Ice Cream coupon.

6. **Grades** '6-8 LOT' (parking lot across from school on W. Third), you can only park there if your YOUNGEST child is in 6, 7, or 8<sup>th</sup>.
7. **Please listen** to the Patrol Students. They are trying to direct traffic as safely as possible.
8. **Please know** that Grades 1-8 have Parent Orientation (Meet the Teachers) Night on August 25<sup>th</sup> starting at 6:30pm. (More info to come).
9. **You should** have already received the first Parent Weekly, which is sent to all parents each Thursday.
10. **Hope** your summer was great! Looking forward to seeing you again.

**August 16<sup>th</sup>: Safety Day for K-8 – dismissal at Noon**

This year, we will have our second day of school devoted to training our students about safety for Fire, Earthquake, Tornado and Intruders. We will show our students the Archdiocesan Safety Videos (age appropriate) for each safety drill, then provide a lesson plan for that particular drill. Lastly, we will complete the drill. We have asked that the Fire Department be present for our Fire Drill, which is common for the first Fire Drill of the year, and also ask the Police to help with our Intruder Drill.

During the year, we will have a Fire Drill each month and two of the following during the year: Tornado, Earthquake and Intruder Drills (generally Fall and Spring).

I will be providing videos to all parents, so that you may watch them in advance.

We will continue to pray for a wonderful year with your children and look forward to seeing you at the Grade 1-8 Parent Orientation (Meet the Teachers) September 25<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm.

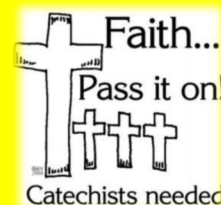
