Hello,

This week (August 28th) we have the feast day of a bishop and doctor of the Church who is considered one of the great figures in Western civilization, St. Augustine. The day before (August 27th) we also have the feast day of another renowned saint, his mother, St. Monica, and I think I would like to focus on her instead.

As I said, St. Monica was Augustine's mother, and this undoubtedly brought her more notoriety than she would have had if he wasn't her son. But I think it would be fair to say that she would have more likely been a saint without his help than he would have been a saint without her help. So even if she may owe Augustine's writings with most of what we know about Monica, without Monica we might not have read anything Augustine wrote.

Probably the most common and best way to think about Monica is as a faithful wife and mother, faithful to her spouse, her children, and to God. Her husband, Patricius, is identified as a pagan with an uncontrolled temper and who could be violent, and his mother who lived with them is described in a similar manner. They had at least three kids we know of, Augustine, Navigius, and Perpetua, but she is said to have favored Augustine, her eldest (of course we are hearing this through Augustine's writings though.) While none of her children were baptized as children, all of the family would eventually become Christians.

We know most about Augustine of course, and how difficult he was up to his mid 30's, but Monica was still working on him and praying for him until he did finally convert and become Christian. Navigius and Perpetua were also baptized (without all of the difficulties we know about with Augustine) and entered religious life. Probably the most impressive would be the conversion of both her husband and her mother-in-law before they would die. We realize that it is ultimately up to one's own free will to choose to follow Christ or not, but the efforts, example, and the prayers of those around us can be critical in helping us come to that choice.

Hopefully as we remember St. Monica we are encouraged by her faithfulness, her perseverance, and her influence on the lives of those around her to be open to God's call. Hopefully she may also inspire us to consider how we can do that for others in our lives? RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is starting soon, maybe there is someone we know who just needs that invitation today.

CRHP – WHAT IS IT: “*Christ Renews His Parish*” is an effective spiritual renewal process which call together the members of the parish priests and parishioners in order to experience personal conversion and Christian community in the environment of their own parish.

The secret of the “what” is its simplicity. In the context of the personal rebirth and parish revitalization it is:

- A simple gospel method of renewal and/or conversion: **Evangelization**
- A conducive environment and favorable teaching moment for repentance: **New Rite of Penance**
- A proven experiential way of enlivening and strengthening faith: **Catechesis**
- A communal opportunity for adult commitment: **Rite of Adult Initiation**
- A Specific and proven period for person growth in prayer, scripture, and sharing: **Spiritual Formation**
- A non-threatening and practical instrument for introducing ministry formation: **Lay Ministry**
- A powerful catalyst for on-going communal and parish renewal: **Christian Community Building**

WHO DOES IT: A team of parishioners properly formed in prayer and love and instructed in the techniques, dynamics and content of the total process. The team formation period in itself becomes an effective “follow-up” for each weekend experience and brings the participants immediately into a group committed to spiritual growth and ministerial formation. The secret of the “who” is that you can’t rent a priest or a team of experts. You have to do it yourself. Shared responsibility flows most effectively out of shared ministry. These men & women who will facilitate this retreat for you this weekend were sitting here, just like you, not so long ago. They are not trained facilitators or expert speakers. They simply followed the nudging of God to attend a retreat...

IT’S METHODOLOGY: Expertise in group dynamics, knowledge of motivational techniques, experience in public speaking, and training in psychology and theology are not requirements. Prayerfulness, loving concern and simple service *are*. If the medium is the message, **Jesus Christ is the medium**. As the Way and the Truth, attention is called to Him through: Small group participation; witnessing and sharing rather than teaching and discussion; exercising in group process and community building; and dialogue and sharing stimulated in very liturgical, scriptural, prayerful atmosphere.
