Hello,

A week ago I gained another title, Vicar Forane (Dean) of the St. Charles Deanery. My appointment became effective on August 15 (the feast day of our parish) and it is a three-year term. I'm using this space to tell you a little about it as it helps to see that sometimes it is best to function as a diocese. Other things can be done at the parish level, but sometimes there are things that are best done at some level in between, like a deanery.

The word 'vicar' is probably most commonly known as it is used in the word 'vicarious', meaning you do something through someone else. The word 'forane' has to do with a foreign or distant land. So the vicar forane does things for the bishop at a level or place where he can't always get to himself. Canon 555 spells out specific duties of a dean, such as coordinating common pastoral activities in the deanery, supporting the clergy in the deanery, and helping the bishop and the pastors to be sure that liturgical practices, temporal goods and sacramental records are all being done in accordance with the Church. The archbishop defines the specifics of how that is to be done locally and the dean is acting in the archbishop's name in primarily pastoral duties. Currently the archbishop has all the deans, along with numerous lay representatives, as members of the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council.

One of the primary duties as dean is holding monthly deanery meetings. This is an opportunity to communicate things from the archbishop or the archdiocese to the clergy in the deanery, or to take input from the clergy and bring it to the archbishop or diocesan meetings, or to discuss things that we might coordinate between parishes at a more local level in the deanery. Especially for parishes with only a single priest, it is useful to support them and help coordinate their activities with other local parishes in this regional manner.

Over the last few years, in addressing COVID concerns, we have had different laws and guidelines in St. Charles than they did in St. Louis County or City, so it has been useful to communicate locally how different practices were working. With the All Things New initiative our deanery contains three of the fifteen different parish groupings called planning areas for the whole archdiocese. We need to communicate and work together at numerous levels to help determine the best way to structure our parishes, schools, and agencies for the future.

Fr. Brian Fischer, pastor of St. Patrick Parish in Wentzville, has been our dean for the last six years. He has managed to keep us informed and inform the archbishop and diocese of our concerns. He has also managed to help us work as a community to help and support one another. As a dean, this responsibility is primarily for the clergy in the area, but especially in this time of change I hope the clergy will be able to encourage that support among all of our parishioners.

Confessions will also be held in the church at 7:30am before the weekday 8:00am Mass and will end 10 minutes before Mass begins.

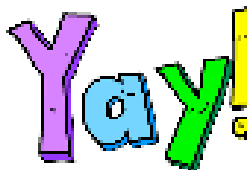

Becoming Catholic RCIA Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

We had a great turn out for Fr. Nick's talk on Overview of the Catholic Church. Beginning Aug. 29th, we begin what is known as our Inquiry period. "The Initiation of catechumens is a gradual process that takes place within the community of the faithful..

The rite of initiation is suited to the spiritual journey of adults that varies according to the many forms of God's grace, the free cooperation of the individuals, the action of the church, and the circumstances of time and place" (RCIA 4,5). The term catechumens will be referenced throughout the year as an individual who has not been baptized.

What will our year look like? For the next few weeks, individuals will inquire about our faith. It begins with a desire, a search, a quest for something more within the individual. The church responds with a time of inquiry and evangelization, a time of questioning, reflecting, examining teachings and practices. This will be a journey which marks the continuous process of developing Life in Christ.

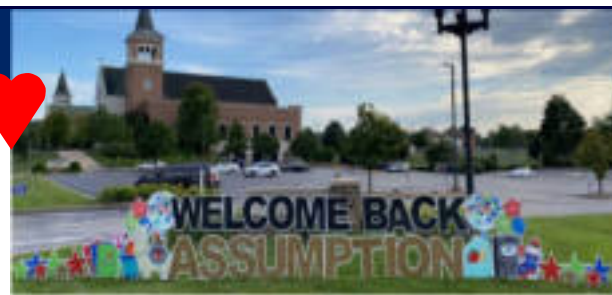

Our Open House on Sunday the 14th was a great time to build community, visit with friends and families, see the school, and have some good food and fun. We had two large "Welcome" signs on the property along Main Street, and on the upper parking lot were Bandana's, Moo-licious Ice Cream, the Bubble Bus, and the Bouncy Slide. That day all Assumption students received a free ice-cream from Moo-licious, were loving the bubbles sprayed from the Bubble Bus, and sliding down the soft and bouncy slide. This was the beginning of another great year!

Added Safety Measures - Over the past 4 years, we have been improving our safety in and around our buildings. We have AEDs (one in gym and one at church), created a private entrance for guests, check all exterior doors at 8AM to make sure they are locked, have curtains on each classroom door to limit seeing in during a crisis, practice ten (10) Fire Drills per year, and practice two (2) of each: Earthquake, Tornado and Intruder Drills, request the Fire and Police Dept. to be present one (1) time per year for Fire and Intruder Drills, and have Safety Captains (adults) for each corridor of school.

Thanks to the Auction donors, we are continuing to implement safety improvements. We plan to add keyless entry systems to our exterior doors and security cameras for our entrances and parking lots. These electronic devices will improve our ability to control who comes into our buildings. We are also adding privacy film to windows in hallways and certain ground level classrooms, to impede outsiders from looking into our buildings. Lastly, upon recommendation from the Archdiocese, the entrance doors from the hallways to the restrooms will be removed, while still preserving visual privacy with barriers inside the restrooms. These measures will allow our staff to hear what is going on inside the restrooms and intervene if necessary.



First All School Mass and Theme Kick-off - This year, we have chosen our theme for the year to be: "Build His Kingdom Here", to remember our role, whether faculty, staff, student, parent or parishioner, as evangelizers to all people. Evangelization is what Jesus asked of His disciples: "*Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.*" As our kick-off for the 22-23 school year, we began school on August 15th, the Feast of the Assumption. With Mary as our patron saint and to celebrate the

Assumption, the entire school gathered in church at 11am, with Fr. Nick as celebrant. What a wonderful way to begin the year, coming together as a school family to "Build His Kingdom Here".

Patrol Students Help Each Day! - The life of a Patrol Person is not easy. They have to be at school earlier than other students, they go outside in rain or snow, and help to direct cars each morning and evening, to make sure our students are safe. 8th graders serve as Patrol guards and are grouped to work daily for 8 weeks, then the next group begins. Kudos to our 8th graders! Lord, help us to be safe throughout the year!

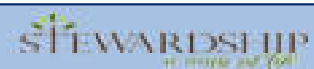
