Hello,

Last week we had the Democratic National Convention and this week we have the Republican National Convention. Since they can't gather as thousands of people in some huge convention center they are focused on having these opportunities to have a variety of people speak for their parties on television. I don't usually care that much for watching the conventions and with the format this year it is even worse. There might be a couple of speeches at each convention that were inspiring and gave you a deeper feeling for a candidate or a cause, but watching these staged events makes you appreciate how much more the excitement of the crowds of delegates made things. Similar to the different professional sports that are now playing, there just isn't an energy, a connection that you can feel when there is an audience that you see and hear reacting to the event. And it also makes me realize all the more that even more important than reaching millions of people by TV with the conventions was the fact that they could truly inspire and energize the delegates and those who were there to go out and campaign for the candidate. Similarly in sports, the greater connection and motivation you could have to be loyal to a team or player when you were actually there with them is hard to do virtually.

I think this is a good comparison to consider with our faith. At the core of our faith we have Jesus Christ, God and man so that he could be with us in a truly personal, intimate way that God hadn't before. The apostles who would be entrusted to spread his word and their faith were there personally with Christ. Hearing His teachings, seeing His miracles, even being there when He would suffer and die for us, and then again encountering Him when he rose from the dead and would ascend to heaven. I think most of us at some time have thought how much stronger our faith would be if we were living with Jesus like the apostles did.

While we weren't there, we can be here with Him in the sacraments. As Christ is present to us in the sacraments in a way more fully than any other way, as the Holy Spirit unites us to Him and one another. Our faith is not meant to be one of simply participating remotely, watching on a screen. At times that is the best we can do, like when we need to maintain separation or quarantine due to a virus. But even then we need to do what we can to have a personal experience with God.

Celebrating Mass when we did not have a congregation was definitely lacking. It was obvious that it was not all that it was supposed to be. And even now, with some restrictions of space, numbers, contact, and interaction with people that we have to practice at Masses it still is not what we know it can be. I'm not suggesting we should stop practicing safe precautions we need to lower the risk of catching or spreading the virus, but I think it should be seen as another reminder of how important it is to keep God as a part of our lives. Taking advantage of the opportunities we do have to share in the sacraments and to include God as consciously as possible in all parts of our lives.

Like the delegates at the conventions with the candidates, like the apostles with Jesus, God wishes to make that intimate connection with each of us so He may be united with us, but also so we may bring Him to others.

August 30, 2020 – Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

JER 20:7-9; PS 63:2-6, 8-9; ROM 12:1-2; MT 16:21-27

Let's be honest. If we are striving to live the stewardship way of life, it's not going to be easy. Dying to self and living for Christ and others is tough. It's the work of a lifetime. But in the end, it's the only work that really matters and the only life that truly satisfies.

Our Gospel passage, from Matthew, reflects this challenging reality. Jesus tells His disciples, "*Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me.*" This sounds harsh. Why would anyone want to do this? Our Lord has the answer, of course. "*Whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.*"

It's all about love. Jesus loved (and loves) us totally, giving us all of Himself on the Cross, in His Word, and in the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist. And so we must choose: love of self, or love of God and others — which is tough, but fulfilling and leads to the eternal reward of heaven. Jesus promises that He "*will come with his angels in his Father's glory and then he will repay all according to his conduct.*"

Let us make the tough choice to lose our life for Christ's sake in grateful response to His love. Honestly, what better life could there be?

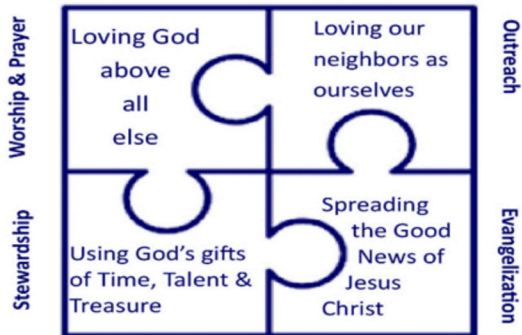

DISCIPLESHIP



There is a “relationship” between *Discipleship*, *Stewardship*, and *Evangelization*. There is overlap between these three phases of our Catholic life – they are connected.

⇒ *Discipleship* is being a follower of Jesus.

⇒ *Stewardship* is being grateful for all that we have been given by God and generously sharing what we have been given.

In 1992, the U.S. Catholic Bishops wrote a pastoral letter called *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*.” So, Stewardship can truly only makes sense to people if they are true disciples of Jesus. If not disciples, Stewardship

will look like a recruitment drive to boost Mass attendance or it will look like begging for more parish volunteers or it will look like endless fund-raising requests. If there is no relationship with Jesus, there's no discipleship and no stewardship.

Fr. Jarrod Lies, a diocesan priest from the Diocese of Wichita, says *this* about the relationship between Discipleship and Stewardship:

“Discipleship precedes stewardship.” The ‘cost’ is central to the life of the disciple; one must deny himself and take up his cross and follow Jesus. The soul of Stewardship is imitating Jesus in his own self-emptying. Stewardship and Discipleship are two sides of the same reality but are exercised with two distinct loves. Discipleship determines one’s identity in Christ while Stewardship describes one’s mission to fellow disciples.”

The third phase – *Evangelization*.

Evangelization is going out and proclaiming the Good News by our words and actions.

Here's how Stewardship and Evangelization are connected. When I have encountered Jesus and experiencing ongoing conversion, I am grateful and generous with my gifts.

My love for the Holy Trinity is something I want to share with others because I want them to have the same Love, Joy, and Peace that I have. So, when I am a good steward of my gifts, my life is filled with many opportunities to not only share my faith with others but more importantly, to live my faith on a daily basis.

Fr. Jarrod says this about the relationship between *Stewardship and Evangelization*:

“The practice of Stewardship inevitably leads to Evangelization. Stewardship depends immediately on its fidelity to Discipleship and commitment to Evangelization. They are, so to speak, the front and back end of Stewardship. Just as a long train can have engines pulling from the front and pushing from the back, so Stewardship will lose momentum if it is not situated between the two engines of Discipleship and Evangelization.”

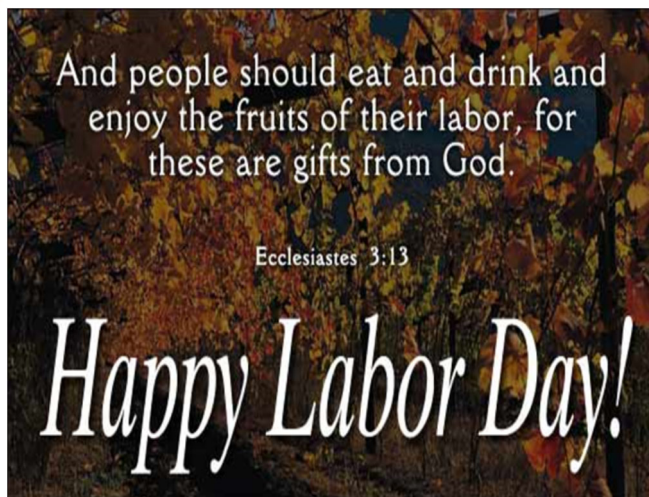

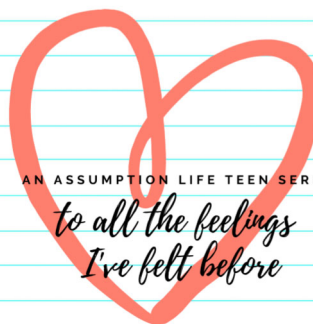

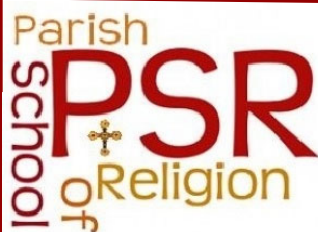
Sunday, August 30th:**To All the Feelings I've Felt Before - Guy / Girl Night!**

First All-School Mass Celebrated!!

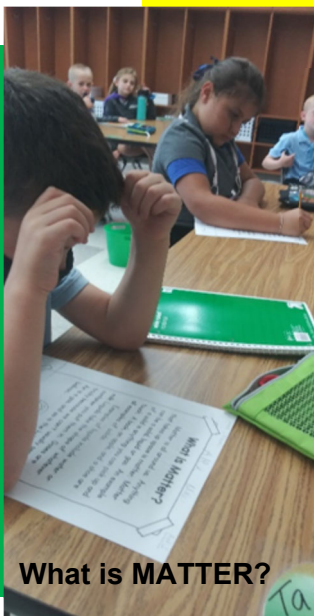

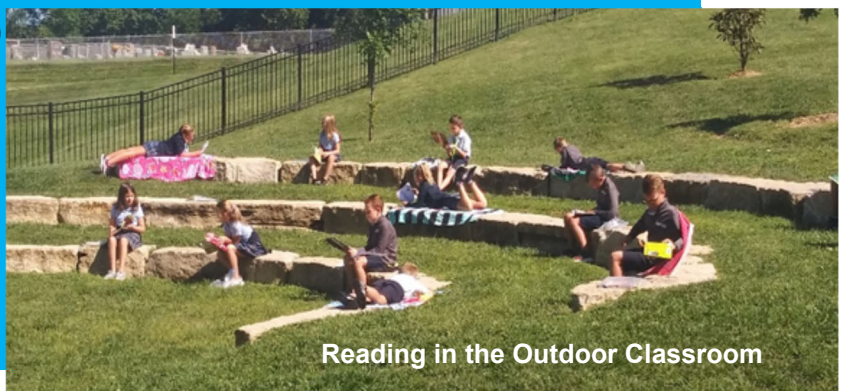

After you have completed your registration into the P&P site, and have not already taken a PGC workshop, it will take you to the schedule, *there are no live sessions...* scroll down to Zoom Sessions where you can pick a session ~ click to register.

Then, 24 hours before the class the facilitator will send them an email with the passcode and id meeting info. The day of the session, log in with that code about 10 minutes before the session is to start. The facilitator will take attendance and then they will give them credit the next day.
