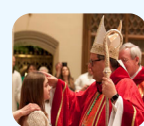

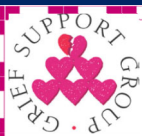

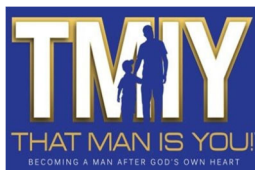
Fall Bible Study to begin September 12, 2022! Proverbs: Wisdom for Living

The RCIA inquiry stage is the starting place for adults who are thinking about entering the Catholic Church.

In the inquiry stage, you're **just finding out** about Jesus, Christianity, and the Catholic Church. Talk to people, walk around in our shoes for a bit and get a feel for the place. As an inquirer, you're not yet sure exactly what you think about the Catholic Church, so you're still keeping it at arm's length.

Your **main task** here is to develop your faith a little bit. Get to know Christ, prayer, the Catholic Church, and how Christians live. That's the only way you can make an informed decision about entering the Catholic Church.

Your task as an inquirer is simple:

- Ask the fundamental questions (What is life? Who is God? Who am I?).
- Hear the Catholic faith's answers.
- Ponder them in your heart.

Ask the questions. Pursue the truth, relentlessly. Don't settle for less than 100% satisfaction; don't settle for half-hearted answers or simple formulas. Don't stop until you find overwhelming, mind-blowing love that knocks you to the ground. Then you'll know that you've fallen in love with Christ.

Some typical questions you'll consider in this period include:

- Does God exist?
- If God is real, how will I respond?
- Why do I exist? Does life have meaning? If so, what is it?
- Who is Jesus? What do I think of him?
- Can I really have a personal relationship with Jesus? Come join us on our journey. You will be excited too! (beginning Catholic)

Kiln for Art Classes

Recently Assumption purchased an electric Kiln for our Art classes taught by Mr. Jon Gonzalez. It was delivered in late August. A **kiln** is a thermally insulated chamber, a type of oven that produces temperatures sufficient to complete some process, such as hardening, drying, or chemical changes. Kilns have been used for millennia to turn objects made from clay into pottery, tiles and bricks. All grade levels will experience using the kiln, with the middle school expected to have the most frequent use.

What do students do to create clay figures using the kiln?

The firing is the process of bringing clay and glazes up to a high temperature. This process is usually accomplished in two steps: bisque firing and glaze firing. To start the process, you design your clay figure and let it air dry for several days. Then, it must be loaded into the kiln with a great deal of care. The kiln is closed and heating slowly begins. This is called bisque firing, which refers to the first time newly shaped clay objects go through high-temperature heating. It is done to vitrify, which means, "to turn it glasslike," to a point that the pottery can have a glaze adhere to the surface. Slow temperature rise is critical. During the beginning of the bisque firing, the last of the atmospheric water is driven out of the clay. If it is heated too quickly, the water turns into steam while inside the clay object, which can cause the clay to burst. After the desired temperature has been reached, the kiln is turned off with the clay objects inside. The cooling is slow to avoid breaking the objects due to stress from the temperature change. After the kiln is completely cool, it is opened and the newly created "bisque ware" is removed. Once the clay object is out, the glaze or coating is applied to bisque ware to color, decorate, or waterproof an item. Finally, the objects are again placed in the kiln for a second firing causing a remarkable change in the clay and glaze. It completes the transformation of objects from a soft, fragile substance to one that is rock-hard and impervious to water and time.



8th graders will create **ANIMAL FIGURES** similar to these.



7th Grade Science: Microscopes.

Why is it important to learn about microscopes? When it comes to biology, microscopes are important because **biology mainly deals with the study of cells (and their contents), genes and all organisms**. Two years ago, Assumption invested in purchasing new light AMS-scope microscopes for our students.

Assumption 7th graders started with identification of the parts of the microscope. How to turn on the light, how to place the specimen on the stage. Teams centered their specimen on the stage until it was directly under the low power objective lens with the light on. They then adjust the objective lenses until they can clearly see the specimen. Students were surprised at how sharp the image would become and how interesting the image became with the close-ups.

5th Grade and the Periodic Table:

As a kick off to the 5th graders' unit about Matter, students explored the content and structure of the periodic table by organizing playing cards. They were instructed to organize the deck of cards into columns (up and down) and rows (side to side). They were asked how and why they organized their playing cards and compared it to the periodic table. Students learned that the periodic table **arranges the elements in rows and columns**. In the rows, the elements are placed in order of their atomic number. The columns form groups of elements that have similar chemical properties. For example, certain gases are in one column and metals are in another. Being able to describe how each group arranged their cards provided insight into the simplicity of the periodic table for grouping in columns and rows.

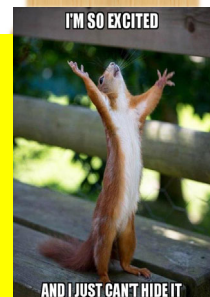

On September 24-25, we ask that each parish family is to make commitments of **time, talent and treasure**. (Commitment Cards will arrive at your homes very soon!)

How Do I fill my Stewardship Commitment Card?

After walking through our Ministry Festival and reading through our new Ministry & Membership Directory... please pray through these areas and consider making commitments:

In the category of Time, you can make commitments to spend more time with God in prayer. Prayer is the most important part of being a good steward, because when our relationship with God is strong, we are much better able to use our gifts and resources to help our parish and The Church.

In the category of Talent, you can either re-commit yourself to your current ministry/s, or sign up for new ones. Our goal is for each of us will use our gifts and skills in service for others.

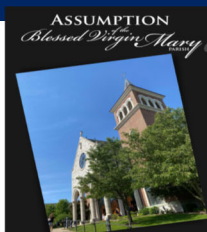
