# Hello,

This week I thought I would share some numbers with you about our parish over the last year, specifically regarding the sacraments celebrated here. Every year each parish needs to send a report to the archdiocese stating how many people received different sacraments and the following are the sacraments we celebrated from July 2018 through July 2019:

While the number of baptisms seems to be particularly low last year from previous years, I also put in the information about the number of those baptized who were over 8 years old. This demonstrates that while we may have significantly less baptisms last year than in the recent past, the number of infants baptized was not that different. The fact that we have more First Communions (around age 7-8) than Baptisms, and more Confirmations (around age 13-14) than First Communions might show a slight decrease in the numbers of families having children, but it could also be from families moving into the parish with children already baptized (as our First Communions have been significantly higher than our Baptisms over the last 5 years).

The number of weddings and funerals have remained quite constant, but both (even considering two people for each wedding) being significantly below our number of baptisms. This shows that we have a good mix of ages but also indicates that we are remaining a fairly young parish.

Looking at all of these sacraments also reminds me that RCIA has just started again last week, but it is not too late for people to still join. Consider if you or someone you know might be interested. You can see that they would not be alone. We realize that while the numbers might be interesting, it is the people that matter.

# **September 8 - Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time**

WIŜ 9: 13-18B; PS 90: 3-6,12-14, 17; PHMN 9-10, 12-17; LK 14:25-33

Today's readings make very clear the demands that will be made of those wanting to be called disciples of Christ. We must be prepared to give our all to Him. But in the end, the life of discipleship — the stewardship way of life — is the only life that can truly satisfy.

In the Gospel passage from Luke, Christ says, "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." Our Lord is speaking here not of emotions but rather of priorities. He

must come first in all aspects of our lives. Period.

He goes on. "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." In other words, it's all or nothing. Compromise is simply not possible. Christ wants us to give all of ourselves, all aspects of our individual lives, our family life, our parish over to Him and to the pursuit of His kingdom.

And just when we think our Lord might soften His message to make it a little more palatable, He goes further! "Anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple." Why is our Lord being so demanding? Only because He knows us so well and loves us so much.

He knows that if we do not live by putting Him first before all else, we will easily be swallowed up by the earthly cares that weigh us down — our material things, our status, and our egos. He knows these things cannot satisfy us. He knows this because He is our Maker, and He made us for more.

We are made to be His disciples, to seek after Him and His Kingdom. Embracing stewardship as a way life allows us to count the cost, and then run after Him with all our might.




# Catechetical Sunday, September 15th




