Jesus' desire to heal is passionately expressed in Mark's Gospel today. He encounters a deaf man with a speech impediment and Jesus' heart goes out to the man. He takes him off to the side so the two of them can be alone, away from the crowd. He holds the man in his arms, touching his ears and tongue and groaning, praying from the very depths of his own divine soul that God's healing mercy, God's saving power might be known in this suffering companion. Jesus says, "Be opened..." Jesus is speaking to the man's ears, to his tongue, and to his heart. Be open to relationship with me and I will bring healing and peace to your soul; I will enjoy your friendship with me and my joy will be in you.

We are invited to this very same intimacy with Jesus. The Son of God became human in order to love us even more faithfully. Jesus seeks a friendship with you. Let him reach you, let him touch you, let him em-

brace you in love. We may not be deaf; we may not have a speech impediment. Yet we need Jesus' healing love in our lives. We need to see more clearly, to listen more deeply, to run with abandon, and to sing from the depths of our soul in praise of God's goodness to us. All the prophesying of Isaiah is fulfilled in us. We join Mary in her Magnificat, proclaiming God's greatness and rejoicing in God our savior.

More than 1,000 police and firemen, dressed in their blue uniforms, attended that first Blue Mass, which was celebrated on September 29, 1934. The tradition of showing gratitude to emergency responders and their families in this way has continued throughout the United States. This Mass honors those currently serving as emergency responders as well as those who have died in the line of duty and brings a greater awareness of those who serve us so faithfully, often placing others' lives and safety above their own. Our lives are a gift from God, given to us that we might in turn give our lives in service to Him and to others.

Those who have dedicated their lives in service as emergency responders are living out this truth, and we gather together today to celebrate them. THANK YOU for your service! In a special way, we remember all those responders on September 11, 2001... may the Lord give each one of us the courage, grace, and strength to truly be effective instruments of his love and mercy.

The Ministry of Sponsor

In reaching out to those who have expressed a desire to become Catholic, the Church wishes to share its tradition, its life, its values, its prayers, its apostolic work. The Christian Initiation process calls for each inquirer to have a sponsor. Sponsors are active members of the parish community who serve as companions to the inquirers. The attributes we look for include:

- Someone who has an obvious prayer life (e.g., attends Sunday Mass)
- Someone who is available for weekly sessions
- Someone who displays the virtue of friendship (a good listener, open to a new friendship)
- Someone who would see sharing their faith and the faith journey of another as a great thing



What is involved in being a sponsor for someone who is being initiated into the Catholic Church? You are paired up with an inquirer and attend Sunday sessions with that person. You extend, in a personal way, the parish community's welcome and support. The joy and faith, the personal stories, struggles, and insights of new members will renew your own faith and sense of belonging to the Church. 

September 9 - Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

IS 35:4-7A; PS 146:6-10; JAS 2:1-5; MK 7:31-37



Our second reading, from the letter of St. James, teaches that all are equally worthy of our hospitality. We must welcome and serve everyone who walks through our church's doors, extending warmth and a dignified greeting to all. The person who wanders in late to Mass, who is not dressed to our personal standards, may be just the person who is most in need of Christ's love. Sometimes we can offer that love simply with a smile and offer to come and sit next to us in "our"

The Gospel reading from Mark demonstrates the connection between hospitality and service. In this passage we find Jesus on the go, and "people brought to Him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged Him to lay His hand on him." These people had already heard the Good News that Jesus was preaching.

In response, they reached out to a man who literally could not hear and brought him close to Jesus so that he could receive the Good News, too. This is true service and hospitality at its finest.

Jesus responds immediately with a miraculous healing. He blessed those whose service and hospitality had made this encounter possible, confirming their faith to such an extent that they could not stop themselves from proclaiming the wonder they had witnessed.

This week, let's challenge ourselves to step out of our comfort zone to reach out to someone who needs to hear the Good News of Jesus. We may just find ourselves astonished at what miracles He accomplishes!


